





years old and we were living at Estelline, my folks, along with aunt Vera and uncle Fat, planned us up a really fine road trip; sort of a mini-vacation.

We were all going together to see Grandma and Grandpa Holt (Mom and Vera's parents) who were living down in the Grapevine area. This was several years before they moved to Wheeler.

Uncle Fat, fixed up one of the best traveling vehicles you could ever want. He had a fairly late model, one-ton, GMC or Chevrolet truck (early 40's) with cattle sideboards that were pretty tall. After he washed out the bed of the truck, he put a tarp around the sideboards, to stop some of the wind and it also, covered part of the top. He'd even got an old mattress or two, for us to sleep on if we wanted to.

They drove down to Estelline and picked us up at our house, then we all-set sail. Needless to say, we kids rode in the back and the adults rode in the cab. I think part of the time, my dad rode in the back with us. There were my cousins, Leon, Shirley, Darrell, Charles, and myself. Come to think of it; Charles was a baby at the time, so I'm sure he rode in the cab with the adults.

When I was about four or five there! We could stand up and run around anytime we wanted, but were told not to be climbing on the sideboards. Uncle Fat, would stop about every hundred miles or so, to see if he'd lost any kids, or if anybody needed a pit stop. All I remember about the time we spent down there, was that Grandpa had some fish traps set out in a creek (not far from their house), that he checked on every day. Another thing that stuck in my memory, was about Leon. He "shinnied" up a tree to look in a squirrel nest. About the time he got close to the nest, the "momma" squirrel ran out of it. When that happened, Leon panicked and slid down the tree, hugging it all the way down. He had rubbed a lot of hide off of his nose and chin, by the time his feet touched ground. After healing up, it took several more weeks for the scabs to finally come off. As kids, we've all been there.


