



Wheeler can have a museum that will tell the story of the people who built the community and the county. Like many other small towns, Wheeler has a group of individuals dedicated to telling the story of these real people and real places. These are the real stories of the founders of the city, the pioneers of the community, the veterans of WWI and WWII and later wars and conflicts, Law En-

forcement and Firemen.

The group interested in preserving the history of Wheeler is the Wheeler Centennial Historical Association, Inc. "WCHA" WCHA was formed in July of 2005 during the Centennial Celebration of Wheeler. An application was filed with the Internal Revenue Service for 501(c)(3) or non-profit status. Non-profit status was granted on March 3, 2009 and was back dated to July 6, 2005. In order to move forward to fulfill the WCHA vision of opening a museum, the WCHA needs motivated volunteers. All of this is possible because there is a benefit to the people of Wheeler. Families can see that there grandparents, parents, fathers, mothers, aunts, uncles, brothers and sisters are remembered and honored. If we do not see that this project is accomplished now, the history will be lost. Most people in Wheeler have a family member that was or is a veteran, civic worker, Wheeler High School graduate, law enforcement worker, ambulance worker or fire fighter. These are the people who make a community go and grow. We are all invested in the success of our community and want to share that story with the country. 

"Landowners impacted by recent wildfires are encouraged to contact their local USDA-Natural **Resources Conservation Service** (NRCS) district conservationist.' The NRCS provides technical, and in some cases, financial assistance, to install measures that reduce post-fire damage and aid in the rehabilitation process.

Landowners can apply for possible financial assistance through the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) for range deferment of all livestock grazing throughout the growing season,

Black said, "We want to provide owners and livestock producers to accelerate the recovery of the health and vigor of affected grazing land.'

Wildlife habitat can also be impacted by the wildfire and NRCS can provide technical and financial assistance in re-establishing the habitats for desired species.


In order to apply, landowners must visit the NRCS office in Wheeler County to fill out an application. Applications will be ranked and those approved for funding will be offered an EQIP contract.


