



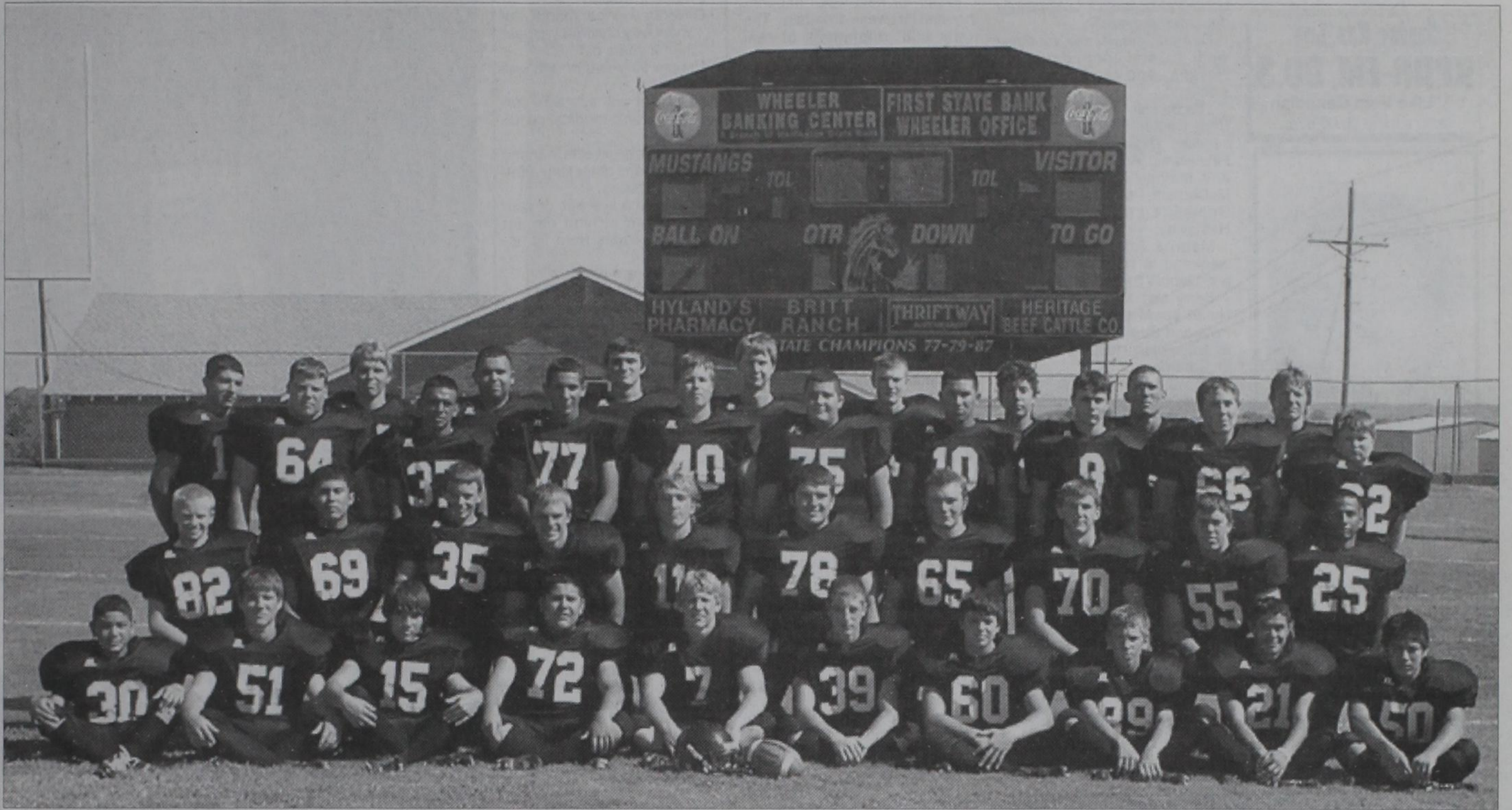

Justin Bradley Of Tulia Was Killed At Wheeler Rodeo Saturday, Aug. 20

As a very successful Chamber of Commerce sponsored, 1st Annual Carolyn Sabbe Ranch Rodeo at Wheeler, was drawing to a close, an accident in the pens behind the chutes claimed the life of a 24-year-old Tulia man.

At approximately 10:50, Justin Bradley was helping in an attempt to pen some bucking horses for the Ranch Bronc Riding event. The process requires opening gates and moving the horses from a holding pen into the pens opening into the shoots. Two of the horses began to buck and fight, bumping the gate being held by Bradley. The gate caught Bradley in the head and knocked him to

the ground, unconscious. He suffered a severe head injury.

Aid was rendered immediately and Wheeler Volunteer Ambulance Service, a paramedic unit, was called to the scene. Bradley was taken to Parkview Hospital and immediately air lifted by LifeStar to Northwest Texas Hospital in Amarillo.

The victim was treated in Amarillo and placed on life support until Sunday. Bradley was an organ donor and his heart, eyes, lungs and kidneys were donated.

Bradley was a rodeo fan and enjoyed helping with the chores involved in putting on a rodeo. He was a volunteer. Several members of his family were at the rodeo.

Bradley and his wife, Brittany, are expecting their first child, a boy.

Services for the young man will be in Tulia at the First Baptist Church on Thursday morning, August 25, 2011.

It has been reported that Bradley was unconscious the instant he was struck. The injury was so severe, nothing could have been done differently for the victim.

Chamber of Commerce President, Chad Helton, in behalf of the chamber, expressed sympathy to the family and praise to the Wheeler Ambulance Service for their actions.

Proceeds from the event were to have been divided with part going to the American Cancer Society to help fight breast cancer. The Sabbe family asked for their part of the gate to go to the Bradley family. The chamber's portion of the gate will also go to the victim's family.

The accident was investigated by Justin Lee, Wheeler County Sheriff's Deputy. The official press release reads:

“On 08/20/2011, during the Carolyn Sabbe Memorial Ranch Rodeo, Justin Bradley, 24, of Tulia, Texas was attempting to pen some bucking horses when he was hit by one of the horses and suffered a severe head injury. Bradley was attended by Wheeler County EMS and later transferred by LifeStar to Northwest Texas Hospital in Amarillo. The accident occurred at approximately 10:50 PM.”

The news release concluded, “The accident was investigated by the Wheeler County Sheriff's Office.”

A special meeting of the Wheeler Chamber of Commerce was held Monday evening, September 22, at the rodeo arena to discuss what further needed to be done for the safety of everyone in attendance at a rodeo.

The area is well posted with signs, but the group decided to “over” post. Warning signs will be placed on every gate. No horses, with or without riders, will be allowed in the spectator parking area. And, the arena area will be

The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County, Texas, met in regular session on Monday, August 22, 2011, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse, 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern.

At 10:00 a.m. the commissioners addressed the eight items on the agenda.

The hourly payroll time sheets were approved for payment as presented.

The court voted to pay the bills as approved.

Several items were voted upon, having to do with budget.

Daryl Snelgrooves, Commissioner, Pct. 1 transferred \$29,298.30 from Pct. 1 Road & Bridge, Insurance to Pct. 1 Road & Bridge Equipment Purchase.

Daryl Snelgrooves, Commissioner, Pct. 1, transferred \$29,723.48 from Other Receipts to Materials.

Bob Hink, Commissioner, Pct. 2, transferred \$309,000.00 from Roads and Bridges, Equipment, Pct. 2 to Lateral Roads, Pct. 2: Equipment' — \$186,000; Materials — \$50,000; Rev. and Supplies — \$40,000 and Gas & Oil — \$33,000.

Bob Hink, Commissioner, Pct. 2, transferred \$9,000 from Roads & Bridges, Parts and Supply to Roads & Bridges: Travel — \$1,500 and Gas & Oil — \$7,500. Nancy Emmert, County Treas-

urer, transferred \$2,100 from Computer Maintenance to Travel & Meals.

Judge Hefley transferred \$15,000 from the General Fund to Contingency and another \$15,000 from the General Fund to Ambulance Purchase. The county purchased an ambulance for South Wheeler County with the intention of trading in the older ambulance, which was 4-wheel drive. The trade-in value was so small that the commissioners de-

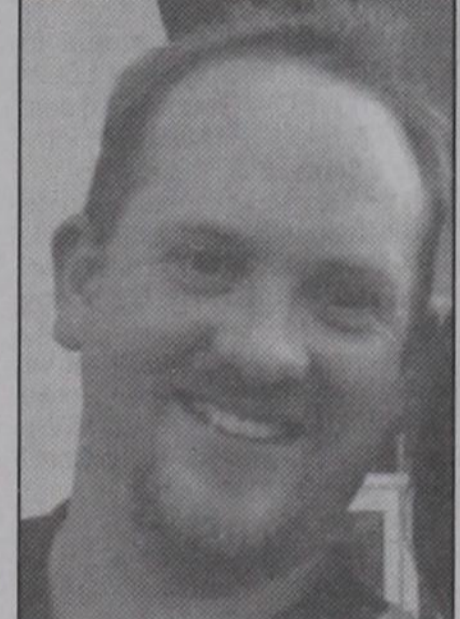

Keegan McCain, 32 Killed In Accident

On the 18 of August at 2:15 PM 32 year old Keegan McCain of Miami was killed in a two vehicle crash at US 83 and the state road 33 intersection. The driver of the other vehicle was not injured.

McCain was driving a 2007 Ford pickup west on state road 33 approaching the stop intersection at US 83. Morgan was in a 2001 Mack Truck tractor semi-trailer traveling south on US 83 approaching the state road 33 intersection. McCain failed to yield to the Mack truck and his Ford pickup was struck on the right passenger side.

McCain did not have his safety belt on and was pronounced dead at the scene by Justice of the Peace Mark Brown.

 - Household contacts and of home caregivers of children less than 6 months of age (these children are too young to be vaccinated)

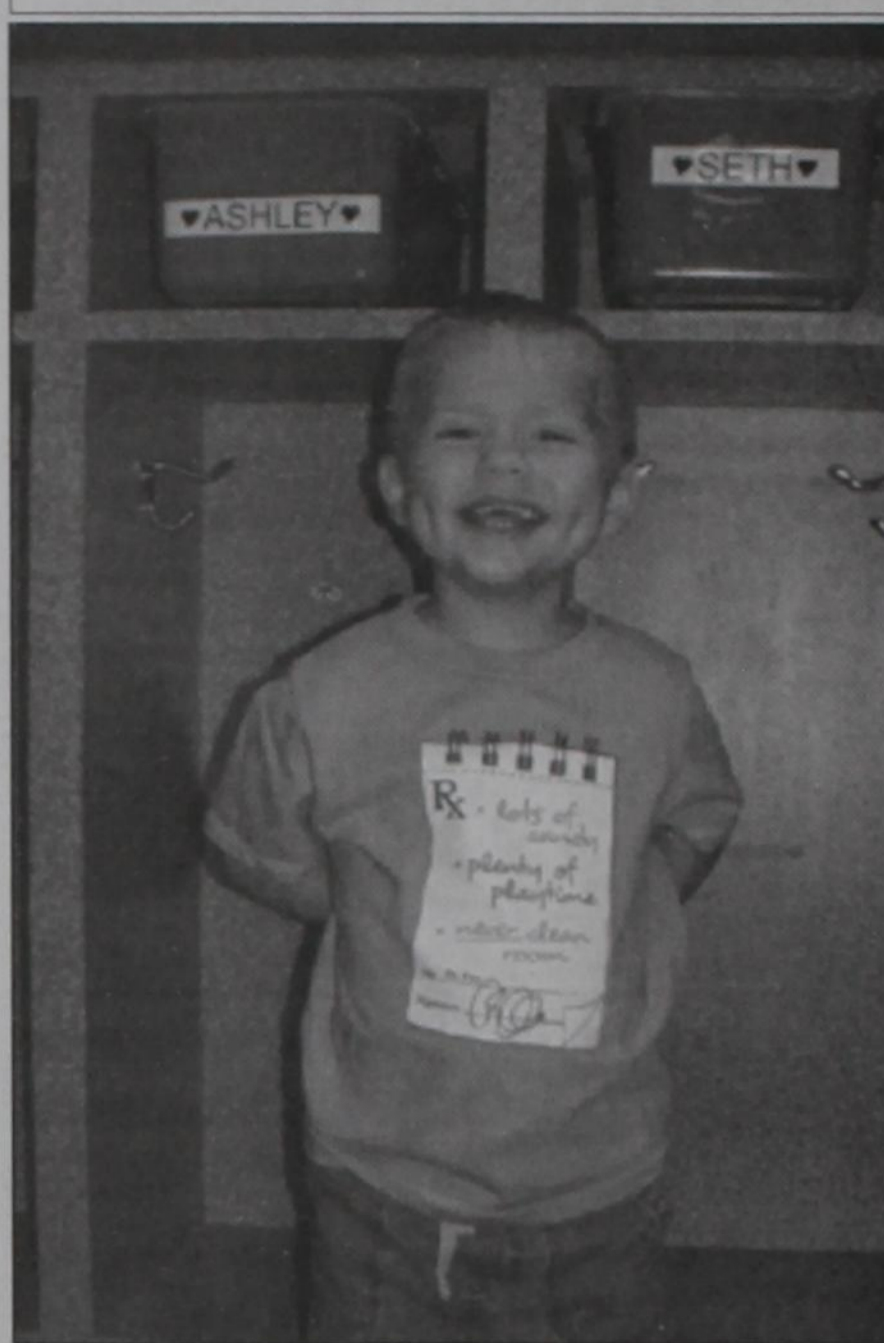
What viruses do flu vaccines protect against?

OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

FIRECRACKERS

I don't know if you can even buy firecrackers anymore, except near the fourth of July. I'll have to admit, I don't spend much effort nowadays, looking for them. When I was growing up, you could buy them just about any time of the year, and you didn't have to be an adult to do so. Come to think about it, we didn't have to be an adult to buy cigarettes, cigars, chewing tobacco, snuff, or rifle ammo, either! I'm not saying it should still be that way, but it does

leave you with something to ponder over.

My cousin, Leon, liked firecrackers about as well as anyone I ever knew, and managed to have some on hand just about all the time. Sometimes, on a "Fourth of July" holiday when there'd be eight or ten of us together, we'd all get some firecrackers. Usually, one of those "sparklers" would be lit and we would all gang up around it to light up the firecrackers. The only problem with that, was we couldn't tell for sure whose fuse was lit. Pretty often, by the time you realized that it was yours, it'd go off before you could throw it down. This would usually make your fingers numb and your ears ring, for a while.

We weren't the only kids that ever goofed-up with firecrackers, though. One Saturday evening, a car load of high school boys were driving around town, throwing them out the window. The smaller fire crackers came in a pack of about twenty or more, with the fuses kind-of woven together. All you had to do, was light the fuse

at one end and they would all start popping in rapid succession. Sounded sort of like a machine gun. Anyway, one of the boys in the back seat lit up a package to throw out the window. Unfortunately, it hit the edge of the window, fell onto the back seat and caught it on fire. The rear doors flew open and the boys abandoned ship. By the time the driver could get to a service station to use their water hose, the seat had a big hole burned in it. I don't remember whose car it was and that's probably just as well....



\$10,000 College Natural Resource Scholarships: Deadline Sept. 14th

The Texas Wildlife Association Foundation (TWAF) and the San Antonio Livestock Exposition, Inc. (SALE) have joined forces to offer five \$10,000 Natural Resource-Excellence in Education Scholarships in the fall of 2011. The scholarships will be awarded to five freshmen at Texas universities who are majoring in natural resource related field such as agricultural science, wildlife science, forestry, range science, or similar majors.

Completed applications must be postmarked by September 14th, 2011, and are available at www.texas-wildlife.org

"As our population has grown, the strain on our natural resources has grown proportionately," said TWAF Trustee Charles Davidson. "Our future depends on our ability to manage our natural resources wisely, balancing the needs of man and nature. It just makes sense to identify our future leaders and support them while they are getting their educations. We all will benefit from their expertise in the years to come."

This is the fifth time that TWAF and SALE have teamed up to offer scholarships to future natural

resource professionals. In past years the organizations provided four \$10,000 statewide awards, but are now offering five statewide awards. The program was expanded because of the overwhelming response.

To be eligible for the scholarship, a student must be:

- A Texas resident;
- A graduate of a Texas high school;
- Enrolled in a Texas accredited college or university with a natural resource/agricultural degree program;

• Classified as a "Freshman" or in first year after high school in the accredited program;

• Majoring in a natural resource related field such as agricultural science, wildlife science, forestry, range science, etc.;

• A citizen of the United States and provide a valid social security number if chosen

Students must also maintain 12 hours per semester and a minimum 2.0 GPA per semester and 2.5 cumulative GPA.

The scholarships are awarded based on overall quality and on essay responses to a series of natural resource questions.

In 1991 leaders of the Texas Wildlife Association created the Texas Wildlife Association Foundation (TWAF) to help fund the organization's education and conservation initiatives. Currently, TWAF invests in projects that educate Texans on the positive effects of land stewardship, foster habitat and wildlife conservation, and preserve our hunting heritage. TWAF supports programs that promote natural resource literacy in schools, through its Learning Across New Dimensions in Science (LANDS) initiative. TWAF also supports youth hunting and youth wildlife leadership programs. In addition, TWAF trains land stewards and conservation leaders through workshops, field days, and effective conservation collaborations.

Triage and coming
to the ER**

Triage is the process of determining the priority of patients' treatments based on the severity of their condition. The term comes from the French verb trier, meaning to separate, sift or select. Triage may result in determining the order and priority of emergency treatment, the order and priority of emergency transport, or the transport destination for the patient.

They are different levels of assessment or triage if you will. Hospital emergency departments (EDs) treat people with injuries and unexpected illness as well as those with chronic conditions. They provide care for patients that ranges from advice for self-care to complex medical and surgical interventions. As EDs tend to be very busy, health professionals must determine, through a process known as triage, which patients require immediate care and how long others can safely wait for care.

With the advent of government-subsidized medical entitlement programs, emergency departments were rapidly overwhelmed with non-emergent and non-urgent cases that

slowed the entire emergency care process down. The need for, and value of, an effective triage system became immediately evident. As a result, four-tier and 5-tier triage systems were developed. With either system, patients are classified by level of acuity (how sick they appear based on objective data such as vital signs, obvious trauma, or body system affected).

Level of acuity is generally classified as follows:

Level I: LIFE-THREATENING condition requiring immediate care. Not stable.

Level II: EMERGENT but stable. Seen ASAP (within 30 minutes)

Level III: URGENT. Stable, no distress. Seen ASAP if no Level I or II patients ahead of them. Can wait up to one hour before being seen.

Level IV: NON-URGENT. Stable, no distress, can wait at least one hour before being seen.

Level V: DELAYED. Can wait up to four or more hours before being seen.

It is absolutely essential that the reader understand this system because it governs the entire flow of the emergency medical process. The patient is not merely classified randomly and

arbitrarily by the triage nurse. It also provides the inarguable reason why one person may arrive first but be seen later than another person who comes in after them. While one person may have a migraine and be completely and undeniably mis-

erable, if another person arrives with signs and symptoms of a higher-acuity condition, that person is going in first.

If we work together as a team, we both will be the more satisfied and enriched for it.

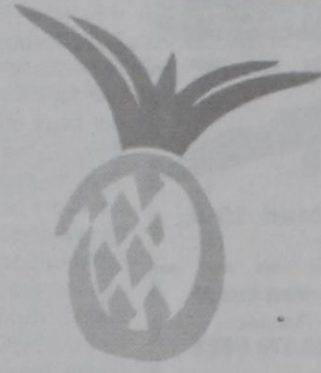
