

On the 18 of August at 2:15 PM 32 year old Keegan McCain of Miami was killed in a two vehicle crash at US 83 and the state road 33 intersection. The driver of the

McCain was driving a 2007 Ford pickup west on state road 33 approaching the stop intersection at US 83. The gate caught Bradley in the head and knocked him to

the ground, unconscious. He suffered a severe head injury.

Aid was rendered immediately and Wheeler Volunteer Ambulance Service, a paramedic unit, was called to the scene. Bradley was taken to Parkview Hospital and immediately air lifted by LifeStar to Northwest Texas Hospital in Amarillo.

The victim was treated in Amarillo and placed on life support until Sunday, Bradley was an organ donor and his heart, eyes, lungs and kidneys were donated.

Bradley was a rodeo fan and enjoyed helping with the chores involved in putting on a rodeo. He was a volunteer.- Several members of his family were at the rodeo.

Bradley and his wife, Brittany, are expecting their first child, a boy.

Services for the young man will be in Tulia at the First Baptist Church on Thursday morning, August 25, 2011.

It has been reported that Bradley was unconscious the instant he was struck. The injury was so severe, nothing could have been done differently for the victim.

Chamber of Commerce President, Chad Helton, in behalf of the chamber, expressed sympathy to the family and praise to the Wheeler Ambulance Service for their actions.

Proceeds from the event were to have been divided with part going to the American Cancer Society to help fight breast cancer. The Sabbe family asked for their part of the gate to go to the Bradley family. The chamber's portion of the gate will also go to the victim's family.

The accident was investigated by Justin Lee, Wheeler County Sheriff's Deputy. The official press release reads:

"On 08/20/2011, during the Carolyn Sabbe Memorial Ranch Rodeo, Justin Bradley, 24, of Tulia. Texas was attempting to pen some bucking horses when he was hit by one of the horses and suffered a severe head injury. Bradley was attended by Wheeler County EMS and later transferred by LifeStar to Northwest Texas Hospital in Amarillo. The accident occurred at approximately 10:50



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

My cousin, Leon, liked firecrackers about as well as anyone l ever knew, and managed to have some on hand just about all the time. Sometimes, on a "Fourth of July" holiday when there'd be eight or ten of us together, we'd all get some firecrackers. Usually, one of those "sparklers" would be lit and we would all gang up around it to light up the firecrackers. The only problem with that, was we couldn't tell for sure whose fuse was lit. Pretty often, by the time you realized that it was yours, it'd go off before you could throw it down. This would usually make your fingers numb and your ears ring, for a while.

We weren't the only kids that ever goofed-up with firecrackers, though. One Saturday evening, a car load of high school boys were driving around town, throwing them out the window. The smaller fire crackers came in a pack of about twenty or more, with the fuses kind-of woven together. All you had to do, was light the fuse



at one end and they would all start popping in rapid succession. Sounded sort of like a machine gun. Anyway, one of the boys in the back seat lit up a package to throw out the window. Unfortunately, it hit the edge of the window, fell onto the back seat and caught it on fire. The rear doors flew open and the boys abandoned ship. By the time the driver could get to a service station to use their water hose, the seat had a big hole burned in it. I don't remember whose car it was and that's probably just as well ....



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



## Parkview Artery Triage and coming to the ER

Triage is the process of determining the priority of patients' treatments based on the severity of their condition. The term comes from the French verb trier, meaning to separate, sift or select. Triage may result in determining the order and priority of emergency treatment, the order and priority of emergency transport, or the transport destination for the patient.

They are different levels of assessment or triage if you will. Hospital emergency departments (EDs) treat people with injuries and unexpected illness as well as those with chronic conditions. They provide care for patients that ranges from advice for self-care to complex medical and surgical interventions. As EDs tend to be very busy, health professionals must determine, through a process known as triage, which patients require immediate care and how long others can safely wait for care.

With the advent of government-subsidized medical entitlement programs, emergency departments were rapidly overwhelmed with non-emergent and non-urgent cases that slowed the entire emergency care process down. The need for, and value of, an effective triage system became immediately evident. As a result, fourtier and 5-tier triage systems were developed. With either system, patients are classified by level of acuity (how sick they appear based on objective data such as vital signs, obvious trauma, or body system affected).

Level of acuity is generally classified as follows:

Level I: LIFE-THREATEN-ING condition requiring immediate care. Not stable.

Level II: EMERGENT but stable. Seen ASAP (within 30 minutes

Level III: URGENT. Stable, no distress. Seen ASAP if no Level I or II patients ahead of them. Can wait up to one hour before being seen.

Level IV: NON-URGENT. Stable, no distress, can wait at least one hour before being seen.

Level V: DELAYED. Can wait up to four or more hours before being seen.

It is absolutely essential that the reader understand this system because it governs the entire flow of the emergency medical process. The patient is not merely classified randomly and arbitrarily by the triage nurse. It also provides the inarguable reason why one person may arrive first but be seen later than another person who comes in after them. While one person may have a migraine and be completely and undeniably mis-

erable, if another person arrives with signs and symptoms of a higher-acuity condition, that person is going in first.

If we work together as a team, we both will be the more satisfied and enriched for it. medcat




