Wheeler County 4-H Food Show Competition Is Held October 20

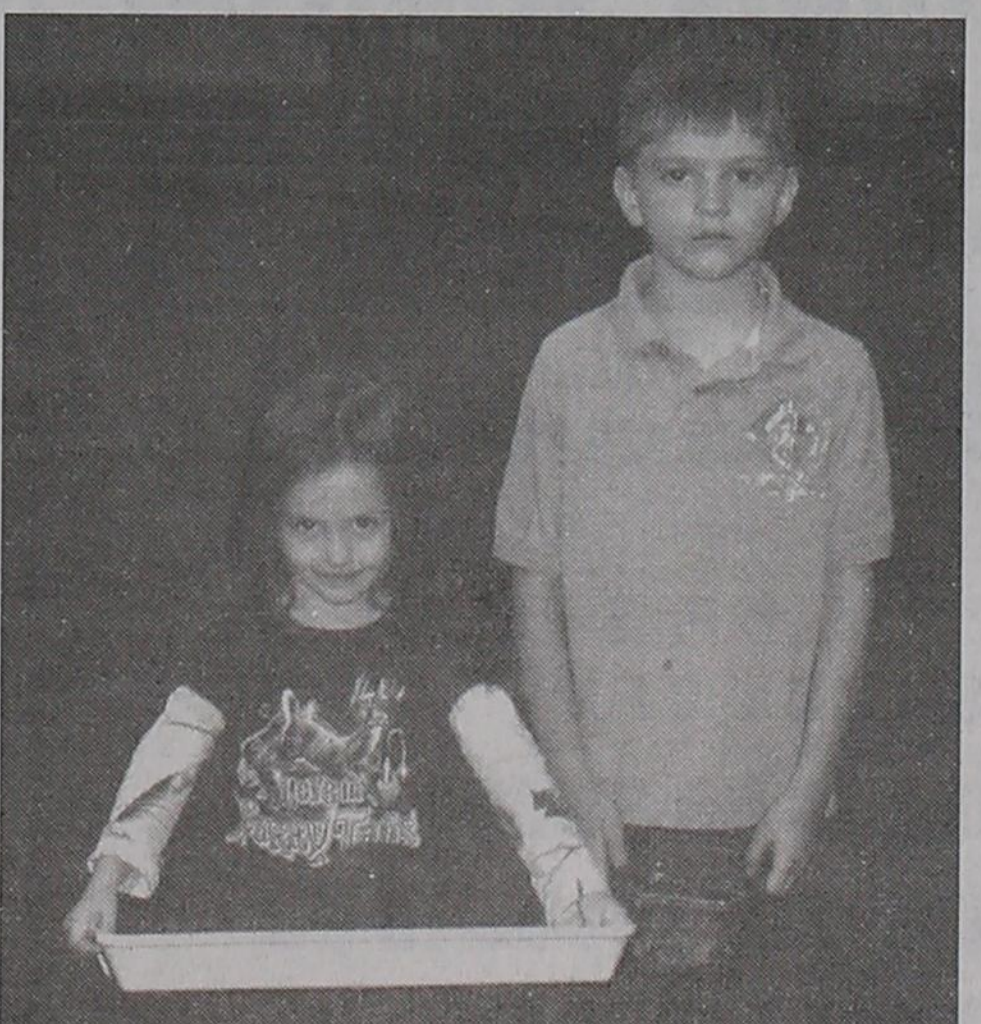

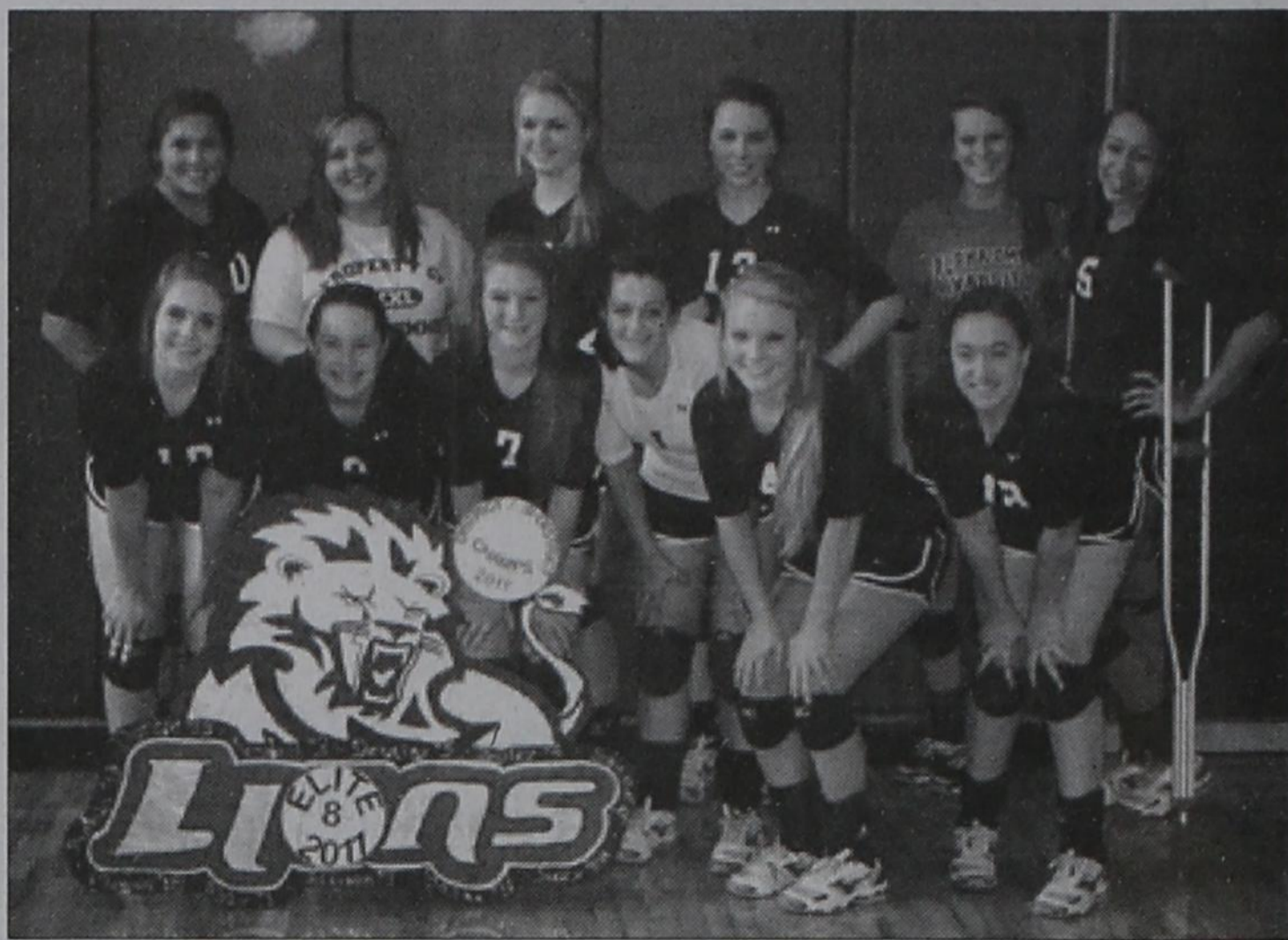

To clean your cell phone, only remove items that are easily removed. The case, back, any part that is supposed to be removed and can. Take a q-tip with a small amount of alcohol and go around the phone, between the buttons if you have them (an old toothbrush works well in small areas). If your phone has a glass or plastic face DO NOT use alcohol. Just a simple damp cloth should do it. Or glass cleaner with no alcohol. Taking care of your cell phone is an investment, and it's healthy!

Medcat Treat your password like your toothbrush. Don't let anybody else use it, and get a new one every six months.

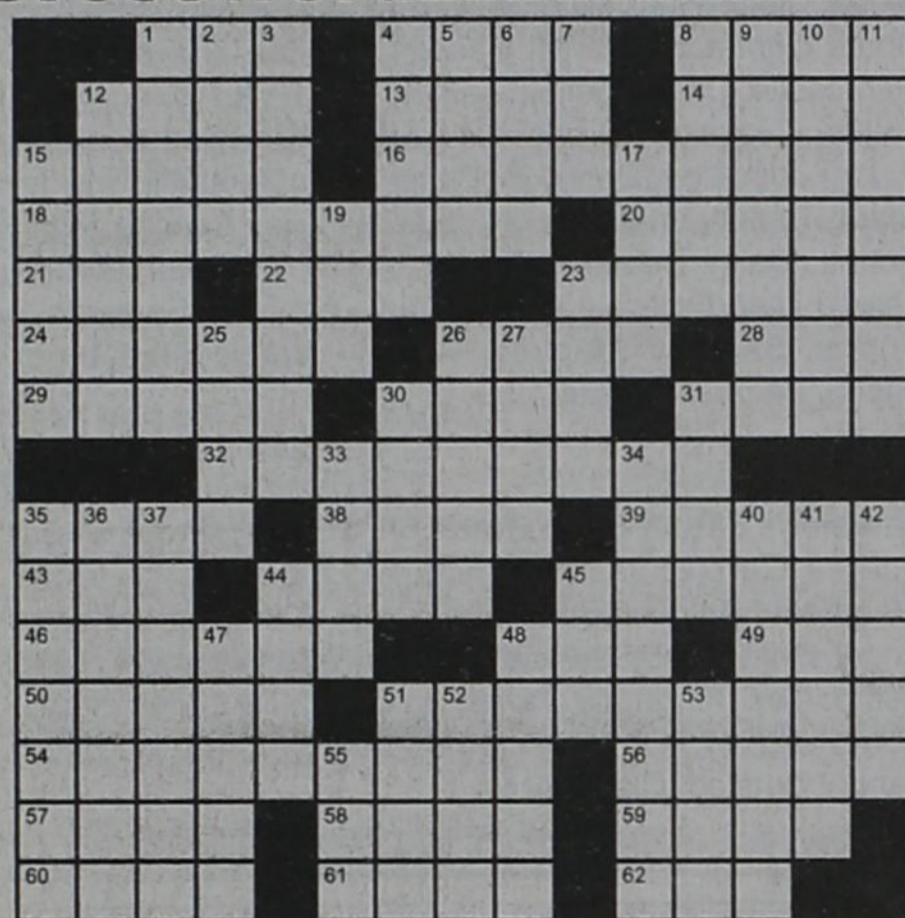

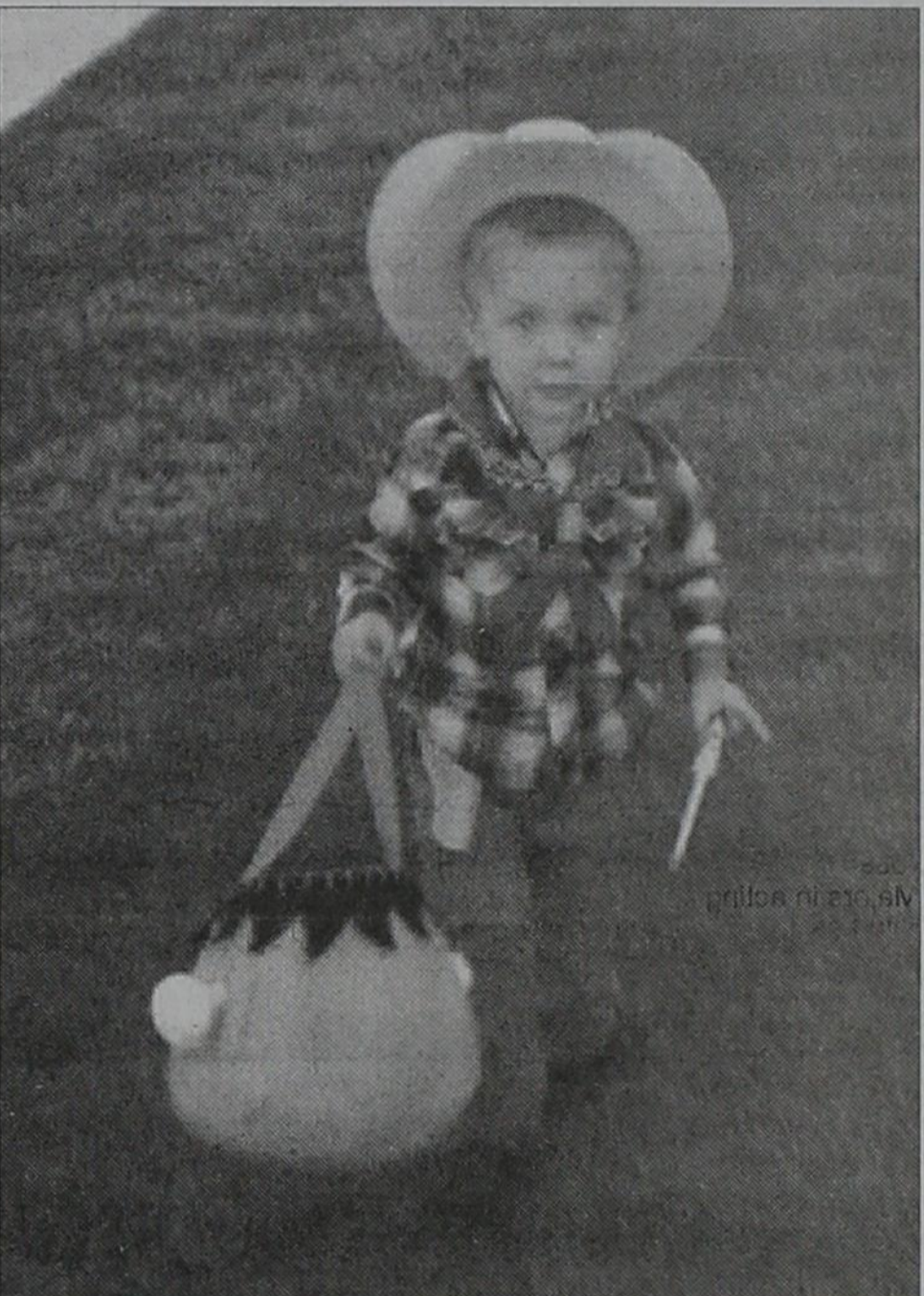
