The Wheeler County Commissioners' Court met in regular session on Monday, August 8, 2011, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse at 402 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern.

At 10 a.m., action was taken on seven items on the agenda. The minutes of the previous meetings were approved as presented.

The monthly reports of the Justices of the Peace, 1 and

2, Treasurer, Clerk and District Clerk were accepted.

The hourly payroll time sheets were approved for payment.

The court voted to pay the bills as presented.

Commissioner John Walker, Pct. 4, asked the approval of the court to transfer \$5,000 from his Materials account to Parts and Supplies. He also received approval for the transfer of \$5,000 from his Gas and Oil account to Repairs and Supplies.

No action was taken on the

Lonnie and Sandra Trout took their grandson home Sunday and then visited with her mother in Oklahoma. We miss her teaching

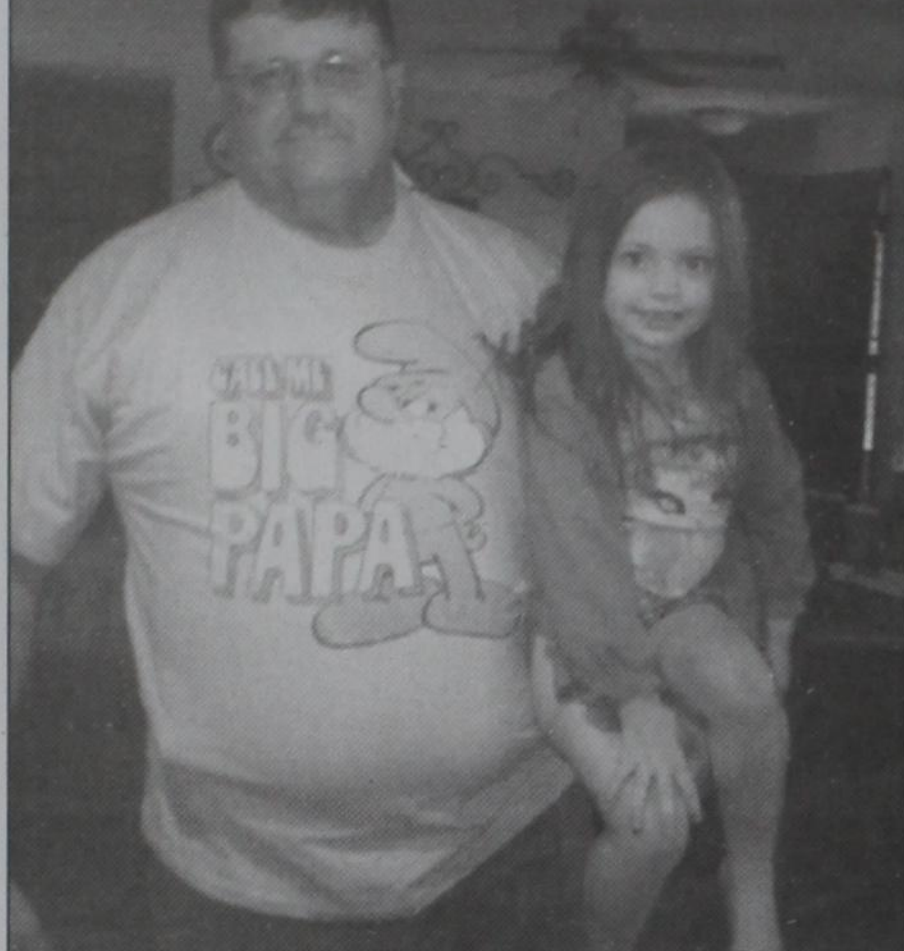
our Sunday school class. Lots were missing from Church on Sunday. Lots on vacation.

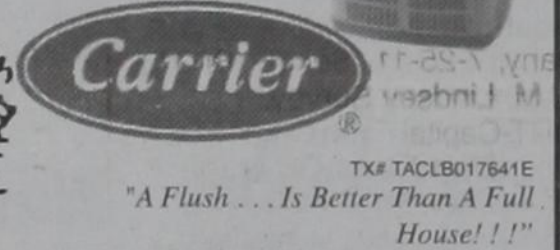

Free & Reduced Student Meals

Fort Elliott CISD and Wheeler I.S.D. today announced the policy for providing free and reduced-price meals for students served under the National School Lunch Program and/or School Breakfast Program.

Each school or the central office has a copy of the policy, which may be reviewed by any interested party.

The household size and income criteria identified below will be used to determine eligibility for free and reduced-price benefits. Students from households whose income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free or reduced-price meals. Foster children who are the legal responsibility of the state agency or court are eligible for free meal benefits regardless of the income of the household with whom they reside.

Application forms are being distributed to all households with a letter informing households of the availability of free and reduced-price meals for their children. Applications also are available at the administration office in each school. To apply for free and reduced-price meals, households must fill out the application and return it to the school. Applications may be

submitted anytime during the school year. The information households provide on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and verification of data. Applications may be verified by the school officials at any time during the school year.

For school officials to determine eligibility for free and reduced-price benefits, households receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits (formerly Food Stamps)/Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) only have to list their child's name and SNAP or TANF case number. An adult household member must sign the application.

Households that do not list a SNAP/TANF case number must list the names of all household members, the amount and source of the income received by each household member, and the last four digits of the Social Security number of the adult household member who signs the application. If the adult who signs the application does not have a Social Security number, the household member must indicate that a Social Security number is not available by writing the

word "None," "No Number," or some indication that the person does not have a Social Security number. The application must be signed by an adult household member.

Under the provisions of the free and reduced-price meal policy, the Principal's Secretary will review applications and determine eligibility. Parents or guardians dissatisfied with the ruling of the official may wish to discuss the decision with the reviewing official on an informal basis. Parents wishing to make a formal appeal for a hearing on the decision may make a request either orally or in writing to the Principal.

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size increases, the household should contact the school. Such changes may make the students of the household eligible for benefits if the household's income falls at or below the levels shown above.

Every once in a while, I get the urge to look through two of my favorite books. One is an illustrated history of the "Titanic," and the other is "Hidetown," a history of the settling of Wheeler, county. Both, have a lot of pictures that

are similar.

In that time frame, it seems that most women wore blouses that came way up on their neck and dress lengths reached down around their ankles. Most of the little girls wore dresses similar to their moms, often with long stockings. Quite a contrast to the "fashion" of today's general public. However, on this subject you will find everything in between, depending on what part of our country you are in.

The young boys usually wore loose-fitting pants, or overalls. Old time farmers and cattlemen, I noticed, had hats that didn't have brims as large as the cowboy hats of today, but had taller tops. Seems like

men's hats have evolved quite a lot over the past hundred years, or more.

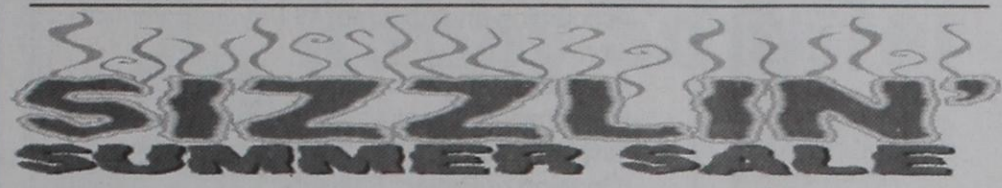

Another thing that got my attention was that quite a lot of the women and girls wore home made "bonnets." These did a good job of keeping out the sun, but all you could see was their face and eyes and that's if you were in front of them. Seems like bonnets would block any breeze that might come along and help cool a sweaty head.

Anyway, our ancestors dealt with the hardships of their time in some pretty inventive ways. The older I get, the more questions I would really like to ask.....

It's enough to make a man sick. We mean this business about Uncle Sam wanting to change his name to Dr. Sam.

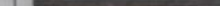

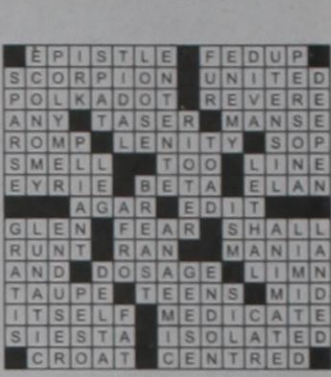

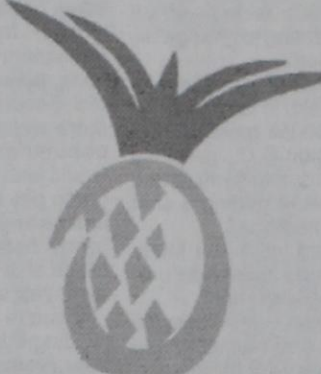
