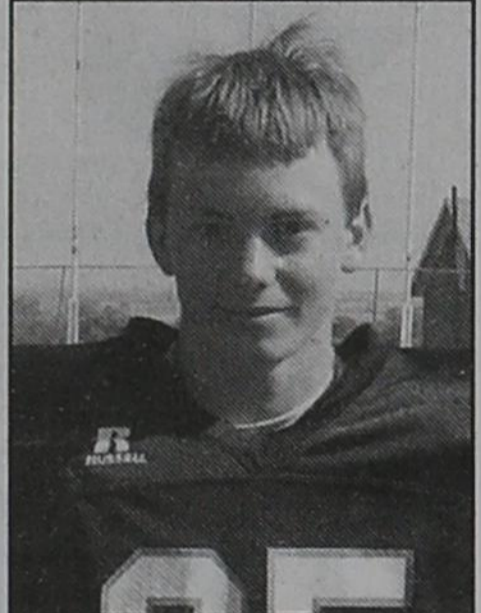

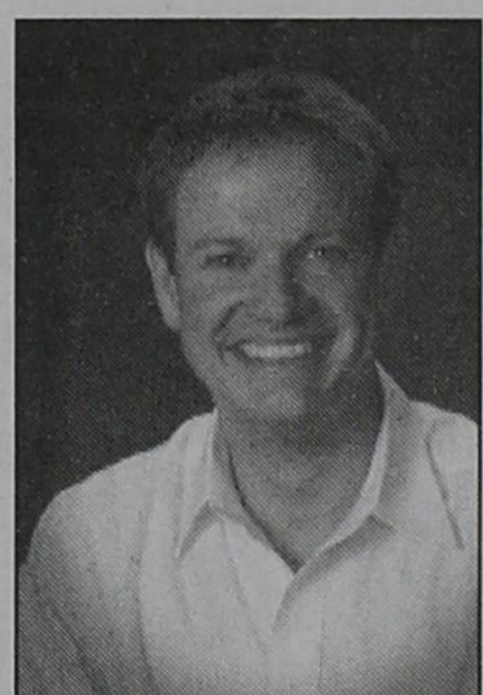

### Breast Cancer in Men

Male breast cancer is real and can be just as dangerous as breast cancer in women. It is expected that over 1,000 men will be diagnosed with male breast cancer each year. Because men often wait to report the symptoms of male breast cancer, the disease is more likely to have spread, leaving many men with less hope that treatment will lead to recovery.

Men should be aware of the symptoms of male breast cancer. If you have any symptoms of male breast cancer, it is important that you see a qualified medical professional immediately for a diagnosis. Symptoms of male breast cancer may include inversion of the nipple, bleeding from the nipple, a lump in the breast, and more.

Male Breast Cancer Symptoms and Signs

Other findings at presentation include nipple retraction, ulceration of the nipple or skin, fixation to skin or underlying muscle, tumor tenderness, and palpable axillary nodes. The reported rate of nipple involvement is 40 to 50 percent, possibly because of the scarcity of breast tissue, and the central location of most tumors. Serousanguinous or bloody nipple discharge is unusual.

This means that breast cancer in men usually causes a lump or mass in the left breast. It can also occur in the right breast, but usually not in both. While nipple discharge is not a common symptom, inverted nipples, changes of the skin on the nipple and around the breast can occur. Lymph nodes found in the armpit (axillary nodes) may be enlarged and able to be felt, depending on how far the cancer has spread.

Male breast cancer is just as serious as the breast cancers that women develop, so do not delay in seeing your doctor. Men typically wait for symptoms to go away or become worse before seeking medical attention, and this is definitely not a scenario when this is recommended. Certainly other conditions can cause breast lumps and nipple changes, but these issues absolutely must be evaluated by a physician.

Benign (non-cancerous) lumps can occur in the breast, but are rare in men.

Medcat

Survival rates for male breast cancer are increasing. This is due to finding the disease at early stage and giving treatment to prevent recurrence and metastasis. Male breast cancer is detected with a clinical exam, or a breast self-exam. Do you have a family history of breast cancer? Ask your doctor if you should have a mammogram, to screen your breast tissue. If you are concerned about anything unusual in your breast, please visit your health professional.
