only contested race was for Mayor. Bob McCain received 112 votes and Keith Rose 60.

Unopposed, Stacy McCasland received 112 votes and Don Rose received 125 votes.

The Parkview Hospital had two new members elected. Roger Brown was elected with 103 votes. His opponent, Ron Rives, received 84 votes. Tommy Puryear was elected with 136 votes; Ray Hudson received 49.

There was one contested race in the Wheeler I.S.D. School Board Election. Larry Ashurst was elected with 102 votes. Incumbent James Masters received 75 votes.

Commissioners' Court Meets Mon.; Commissioners Buying Equipment

Wheeler County Commissioners' Court met in regular session on Monday, May 14, 2012, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse at 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern.

At 10:00 a.m. action was taken on the 28 items on the agenda.

The minutes of the previous meetings were approved as presented.

The monthly reports of Justices of the Peace, 1 & 2; County Tax Assessor, County Clerk and District Clerk.

The hourly payroll time sheets were approved for payment.

The court voted to pay the county's bills as approved.

Judge Hefley requested and was granted permission to transfer \$400,000 from General Fund, Road and Bridge Operation to the precincts Lateral Road Fund; each precinct to receive \$100,000.

No action was taken on the burn ban.

No action was taken on item #7.

Lynn Switzer, District Attorney, had requested to meet with the court, but was not present.

The court voted to change the date of the next regular meeting from Monday, May 28, 2012, to Friday, May 25, 2012; due to May 28 being a holiday.

Nancy Emmert, County Treasurer was not ready for the court to act on her bid for new computer software.

The commissioners signed an Order Granting Discretionary Exemption from Section 262.023 of the Texas Local Government Code for Professional Services. This is paperwork necessary for the new county jail project.

The commissioners also entered into contract with Southwest Architects, Inc. This is to obtain a study on the county's needs in the construction of a new jail.

The Texas Department of Transportation submitted a Maintained Road Mileage Certificate, showing the county had 598 miles of roads to maintain. The county

receives money twice a year from TxDOT for road maintenance.

The commissioners agreed to divide money received from TxDOT equally.

Commissioner Snelgroves, Pct 1, asked permission to consider the purchase of a 2012 or 2013 truck over \$5,000 from Buy Board or NJPA co-op. The request was approved.

Pct. 2 Commissioner, Hink, asked permission to advertise for bids for 2012 4-wheel drive pickup with a 2005 Ford F350 4-wheel drive pickup as a trade-in. Permission was granted.

Hubert Moore, Commissioner Pct. 3, was given permission to take bids for 2012 fifth-wheel truck tractor through the Buy Board of NJPA Co-op. The court voted to allow the taking of bids.

Moore also requested permission to consider the purchase of a belly dump trailer over \$5,000. The court agreed.

The commissioners agreed to let Moore consider the purchase of a loader bucket for 943 Cat over \$5,000.

John Walker, Comm., Pct 4, was given permission to add Brandon Gaither as an employee of Pct. 4. His salary will be \$2,733.92 per month.

Enbridge Pipelines (Texas Gathering) LP was given permission to bore under CR 29 for installation of an oil and gas pipeline.

Hockey Player Has Local Ties

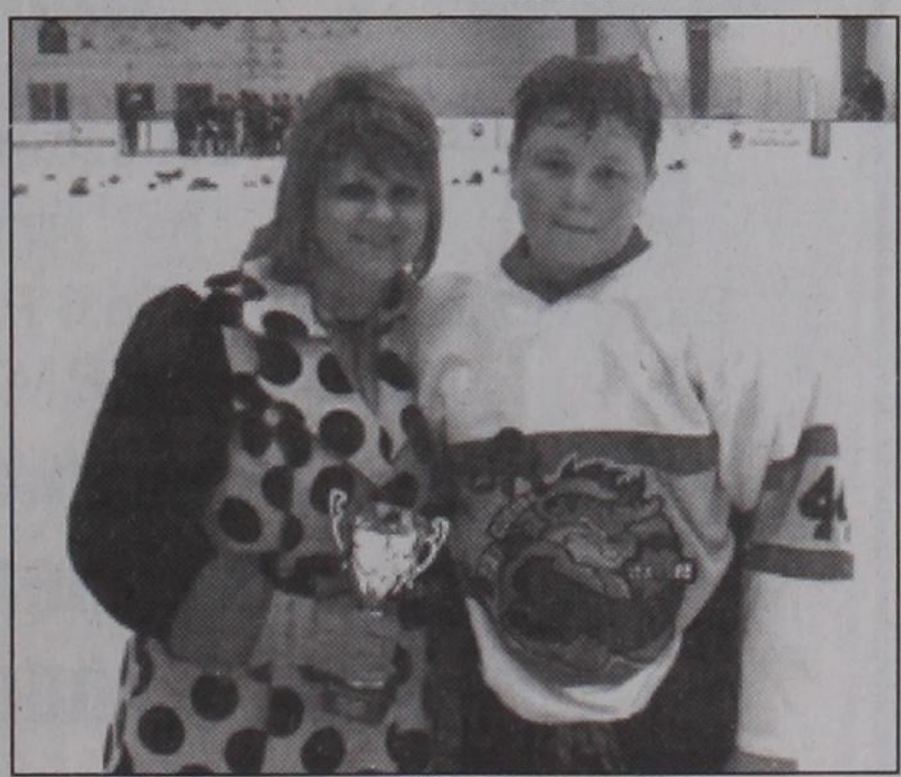

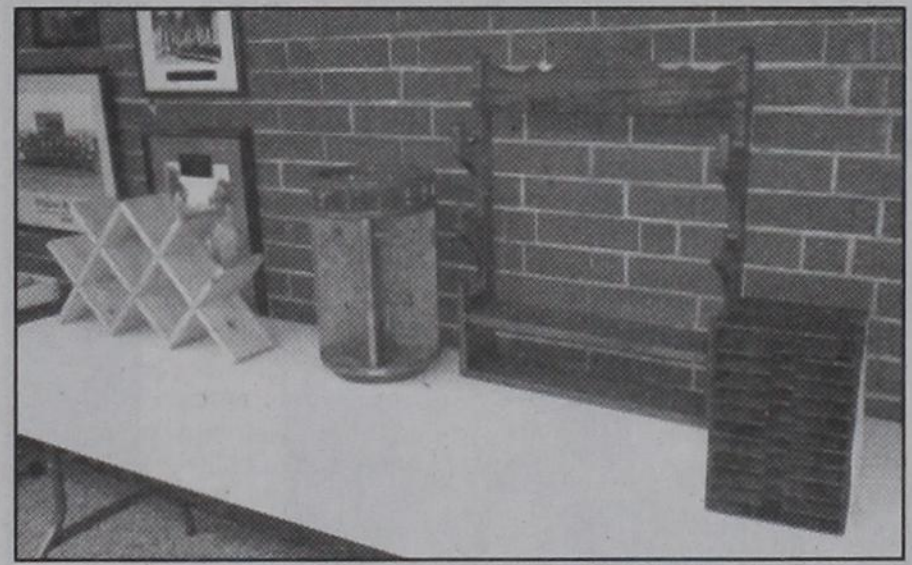

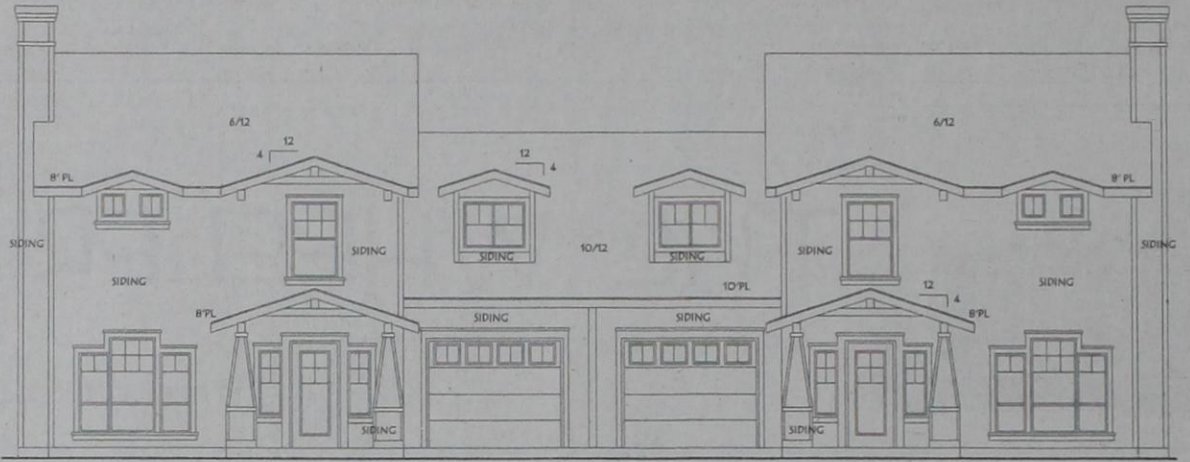

SCORPIONS AND CENTIPEDES

That didn't stop me from eating them though, but from then on, I'd take them to the windmill and give them a good

rinsing off, first.

Scorpions were something that I didn't want any dealings with, and with good reason. When I was six years old, I was sitting on our rickety front porch one day, minding my own business, when a scorpion came up through the crack between the boards and stung me on the leg. That hurt like fire for quite a while. Fortunately, I've never had it to happen since. Centipedes, are critters that I don't even like to be close to. I've never been stung or bitten by one, and never have talked to anyone who has. Don't know if it's true, or not, but I've been told that they have a stinger on each leg. 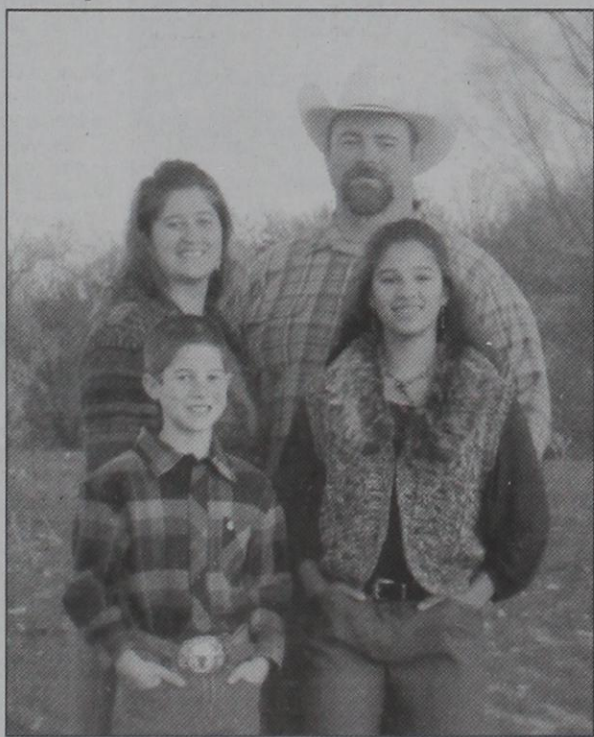

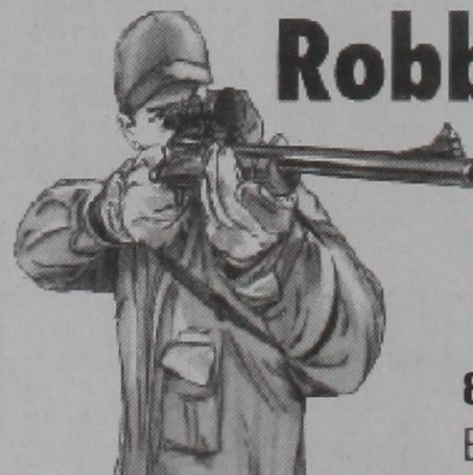

Snakebites

To the casual observer, snakes are so well hidden and camouflaged that you rarely see them. The threat of snakebite is minimal if you leave them alone. The knee-jerk reaction of many people when encountering a snake is to try and kill it. The majority of snakes are non-venomous (not poisonous) and are harmless to humans. Death from snakebite is rare. More people die each year as a result of a bee or wasp sting than a snakebite. The Texas Panhandle is home to three types of poisonous snakes: Western Diamond Back & Prairie rattlesnakes, and the Massasauga. The snake's defense when provoked, startled, or threatened is to escape. If given no alternative they will fight. The majority of bites are "dry bites" no venom was injected.

- What to do if you are bitten
 - Stay calm
 - Call 911
 - DO NOT attempt to capture or kill the snake
 - Keep the limb below the level of the heart
 - Create a loose splint to immobilize the limb and reduce the pain
 - Remove any constricting items: rings, watches, tight clothing
 - DO NOT apply a tourniquet. You could lose a limb if applied improperly
 - DO NOT make cuts near the site. This only increases the injury
 - DO NOT attempt to suck the venom out. Germs from your mouth can cause an infection
 - DO NOT apply ice. This can freeze the skin causing further damage
 - DO NOT apply any type of electric current
 - Prevention
 - Avoid areas where snakes may be hiding, such as under rocks and logs
 - Avoid picking up or playing with snakes
 - DO NOT provoke a snake. Don't hit the snake, throw rocks at it, try to catch it, harass it, or kill it.
 - Tap ahead of you with a walking stick before entering an area where you cannot see your feet
 - When hiking or working in area known to have snakes, wear long pants and boots if possible.

Teacher's Hands Burned
Gandy's hands were burned when he tore the shirt off of Davidson and Miss Barnes and Miss Walker received minor burns on their faces and arms as Davidson waved his hands in an attempt to shake off the acid.

The three were treated at the high school by Dr. H. E. Nicholson, Sr.

Gandy said the accident occurred while an experiment testing for proteins and sugar in food was in progress. He said the acid bottle was apparently slick and slipped from Davidson's hands and hit the edge of the table.

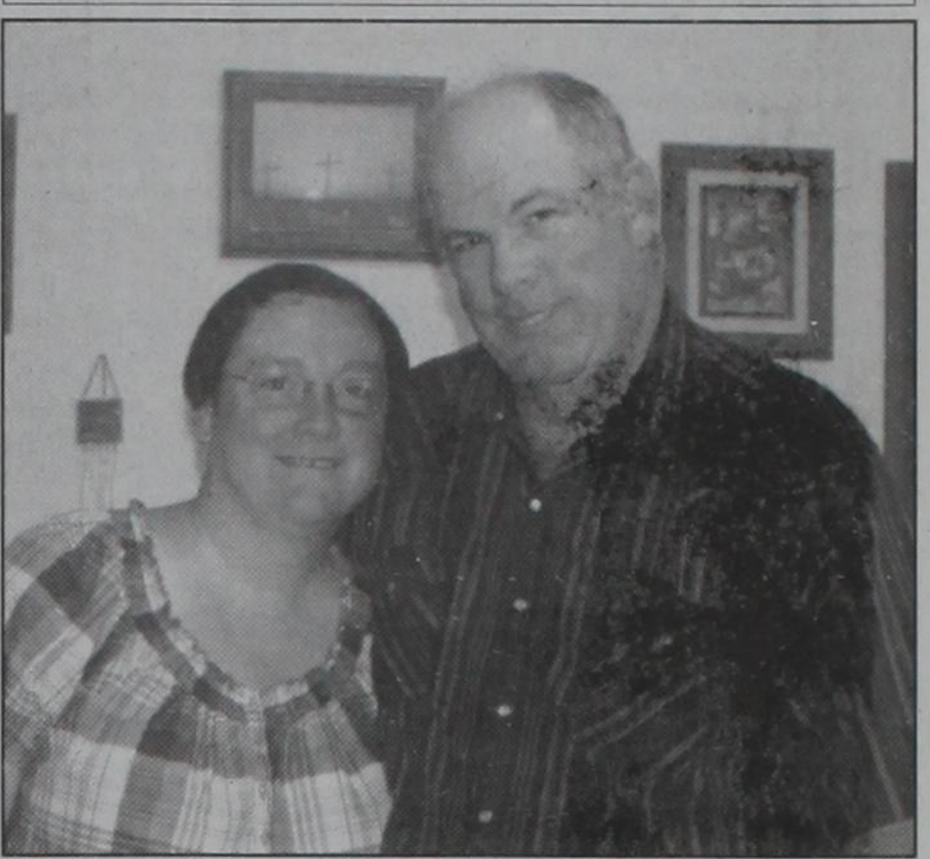

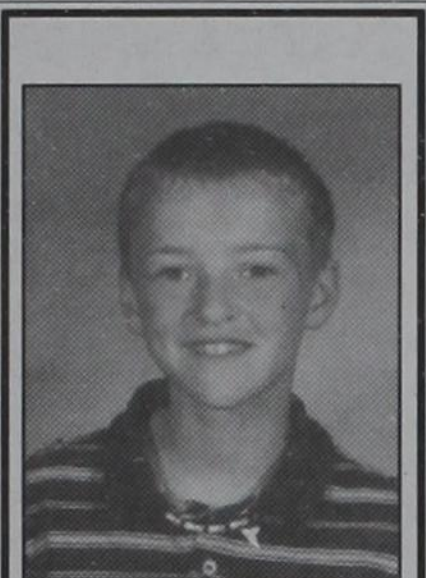

nate on stages and in sport venues around the world. Imagine being able to see a theatrical production, live music concert or sporting event in 3D on the big silver screen in downtown Shamrock—all will soon be possible.

The installation of a new digital projector, digital audio equipment and satellite delivery system is scheduled to begin May 29 and is expected to take only a few days to complete. A new screen that is specifically designed and required to display the new 3D images will also be installed.

The necessity to make these changes became apparent in April when Texas Theater operator, David Rion, attempted to get the

new movie Deep in the Heart for local exhibition. The distributor of the movie told Mr. Rion no copies of the motion picture were put on film, which meant it could not be shown at the theater because it currently has only a 35mm film projector.

The inability to show a movie that has an important message for local residents, especially those with an interest in agriculture, was the glaring signal—it was time to make the move to a digital format for movie exhibition at Texas Theater or close the doors forever. Of the 41 movie houses named Texas Theater that once operated in this great state, the one in downtown Shamrock is the last remaining Texas Theater that still shows a new movie every weekend.

Movie makers prefer digital movie distribution for many reasons—no expensive film to purchase or wait to be developed, no heavy boxes of film to be shipped to theaters around the world, no film to be melted and permanently damaged when hot 35mm projectors fail to operate properly. Moving pictures of the 21st century come as a file, as a simple digital file that can be transported on a portable hard drive or downloaded via satellite or the Internet, much the same as the photo attachments to email you may receive from family and friends.

Moviemakers have steadily been decreasing the number of

copies of movies put on film for the past two years. Earlier this year, a film developing company dedicated to processing film of Hollywood filmmakers closed, leaving only one motion picture film developing company in America. Movie theaters across America and around the globe that want to continue to show new motion pictures are forced to make this shift to digital exhibition. Those that have not or do not make this change soon are doomed to show only old movies that are on film or simply lock their doors.


