

# Standifer, Crites Win Primary For Co. Attorney, Sheriff

Fourteen hundred eighty-six Wheeler county voters had their voter registration cards stamped Republican to cast their ballots in the 2012 primary election. The two contested races for county office were Republican candidates. Wheeler County Pct. 3 had a choice of two

Republican candidates and two republican candidates sought election as Wheeler County Constable, Pct. 2

Incumbent Misty L. Walker was defeated in her bid for re-election as County Attorney by Leslie Standifer. Standifer received 961 votes and Walker had 433 votes in her favor.

Deputy Sheriff Rowdy Clark lost his bid for Wheeler County Sheriff to Wes Crites. Forty percent of the votes counted were for Crites with 1050. The number voting for Clark was 419.

Seven hundred eighty-four was the number of ballots counted in the Wheeler County Commission, Pct. 3 election. In the precinct 3 race, Richard Kincannon came out on top with 204 of the 335 ballots cast.

Wheeler County Precinct 2 also had a choice to two Republican candidates. In this close race, Kenneth Martindale received 480 or 61% of the votes cast. His opponent, Johnny Carter received 304 votes.

Of the 1529 votes cast in the Primary Election in Wheeler county, only 43 individuals voted in the democratic primary.

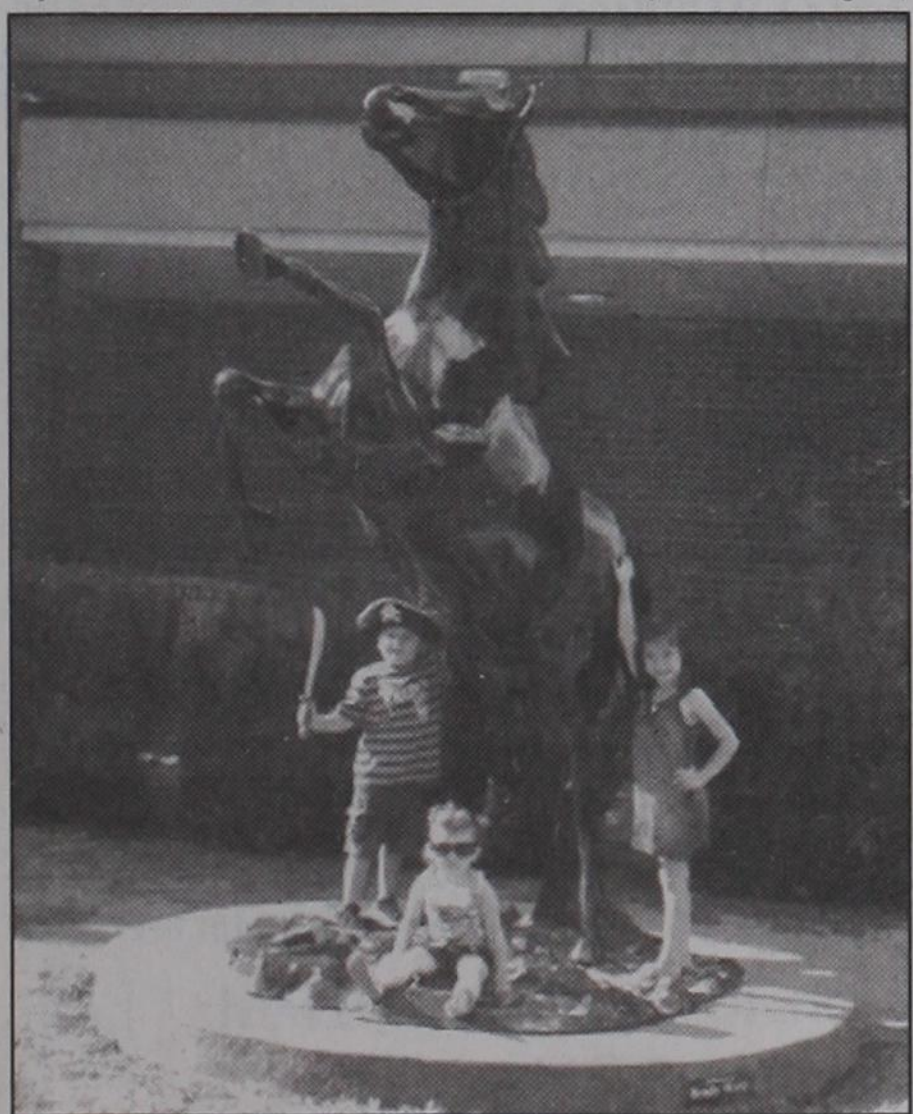

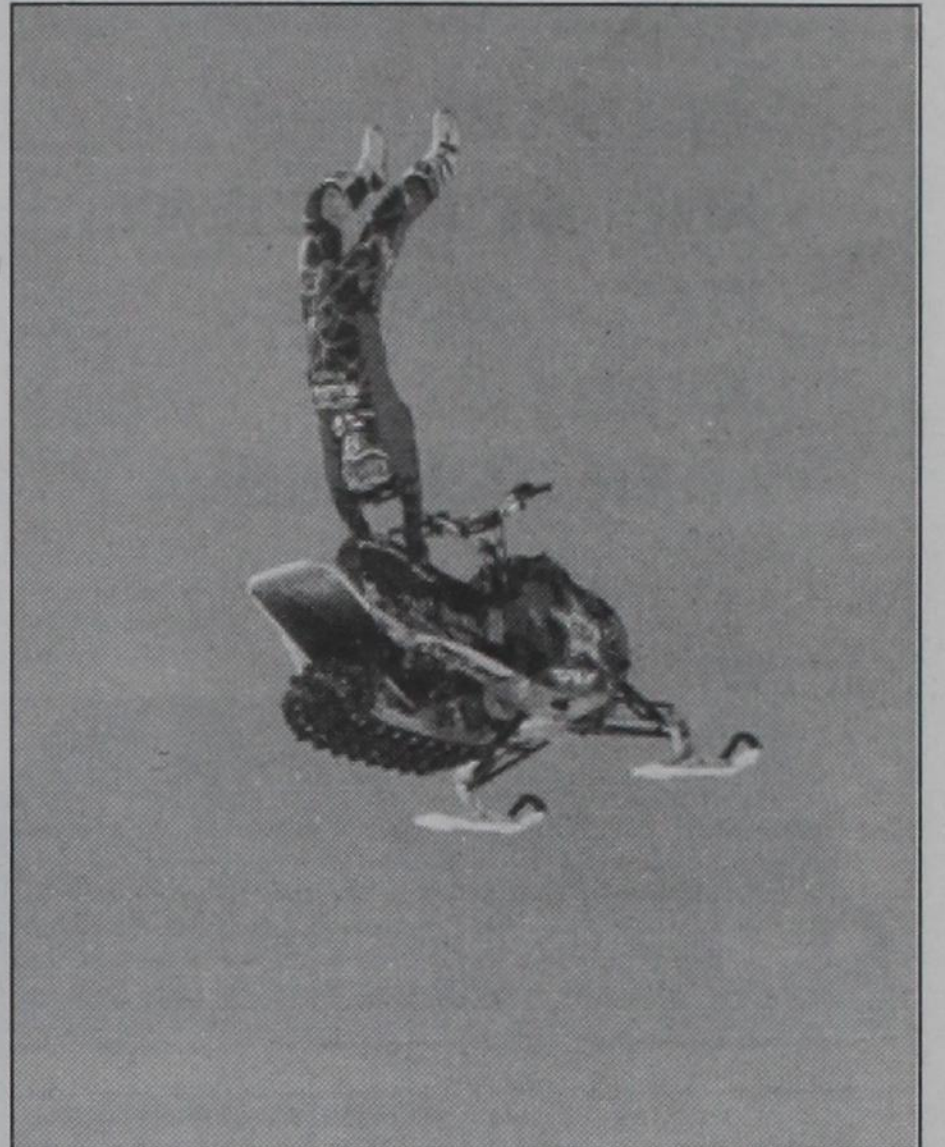

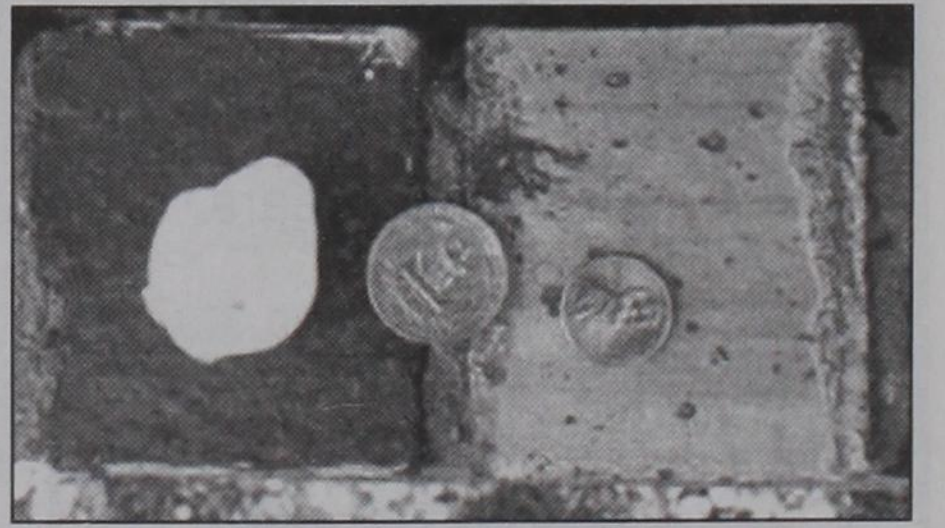
Summer time is finally here and that can only mean one thing: Wheeler's 4th of July celebration is right around the corner!

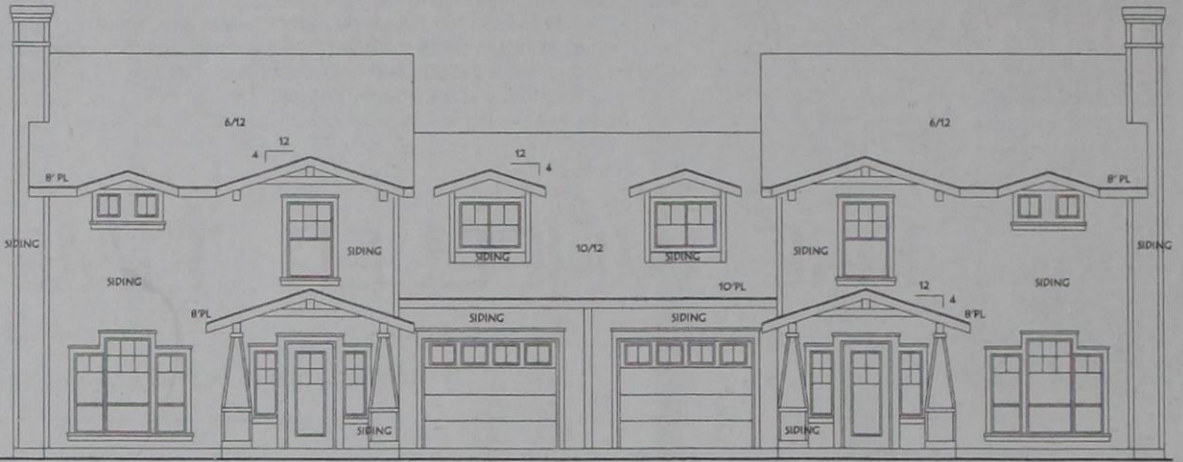

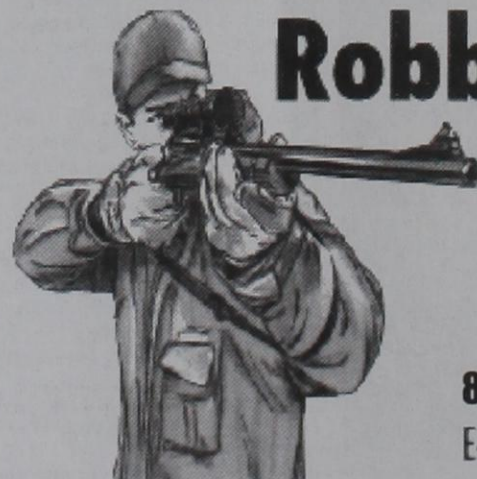

### Lightning Bugs & Dry Flies

We live down in a really low area with a part-time creek and lots of Bermuda grass. About this time of year, the "lightning bugs" start to show up. I've never seen a kid, that wouldn't try to catch them. More than likely, most of us have tried to catch enough of them to make ourselves a "lightning bug lantern." Sure enough, if you get a lot of 'em in a "fruit jar," it'll make a pretty decent light, especially if you're as easy pleased as my cousins and I were. There was one more thing we used them for, that our moms weren't too crazy about. We'd smear bug juice on our faces, so it would look like "Indian war paint." Beginning in 2013, you'll see several changes to sunscreen labels. These changes, which are required by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA), will provide you with more information about what a sunscreen can do.

FDA now requires sunscreen labels to provide better information

Here are some key changes you'll see:

Skin cancer prevention versus sunburn protection

On the label, you'll see whether a sunscreen can:

- Help prevent skin cancer and sunburn.
- Only help prevent sunburn.

That's thanks to new FDA testing requirements. For a label to claim that a sunscreen can help prevent skin cancer and sunburn, it will have to pass two tests.

The first test is the broad-spectrum test. This test shows whether a sunscreen can protect your skin from the sun's UVA and UVB rays. Both rays can cause skin cancer.

The second test is the sun protection factor (SPF) test. This test shows how well a sunscreen protects you from sunburn. Like today, you'll see the SPF as a number, such as SPF 30. All sunscreen must offer some SPF. The minimum is SPF 2.

**New warning:** For a sunscreen to carry the claim that it can prevent skin cancer and sunburn, it must offer both: 1) broad-spectrum coverage and 2) an SPF of 15 or higher. If the sunscreen does not offer both, the label will have to carry this warning:

"This product has been shown only to help prevent sunburn, not skin cancer or early skin aging."

**Water resistance**  
The FDA will ban companies from claiming that a sunscreen is "waterproof" or "sweat proof." This is simply not possible.

You'll now see the term "water resistant." To make this claim, the product must pass another test. This test shows how long a sunscreen keeps its SPF when a person goes in the water or sweats. The label also must state how long the water resistance lasts, either 40 or 80 minutes.

**New warning:** If a sunscreen is not water resistant, the label must carry a warning. This warning will tell you to use a water-resistant sunscreen if you are likely to sweat or be in water.

**Makeup and moisturizers**  
You'll see the new claims on makeup and moisturizers, too — provided the product undergoes and passes the FDA tests.

To figure out how long you can stay in the sun with a given SPF, use this equation:  
**Minutes to burn without sunscreen x SPF number = maximum sun exposure time**

**And sunscreen must be reapplied within 2 hours in order to remain effective**

Always put on more than you think you should, when it comes to sunscreens. Be very liberal with it.
