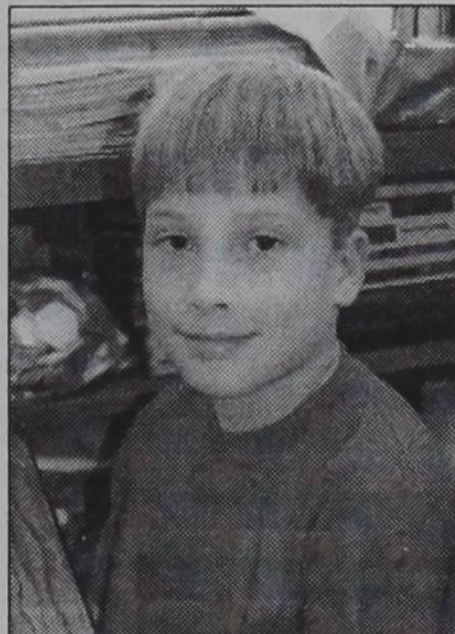

Burial was in the Zybach Cemetery in Allison, Texas, under the direction of Wright funeral home.

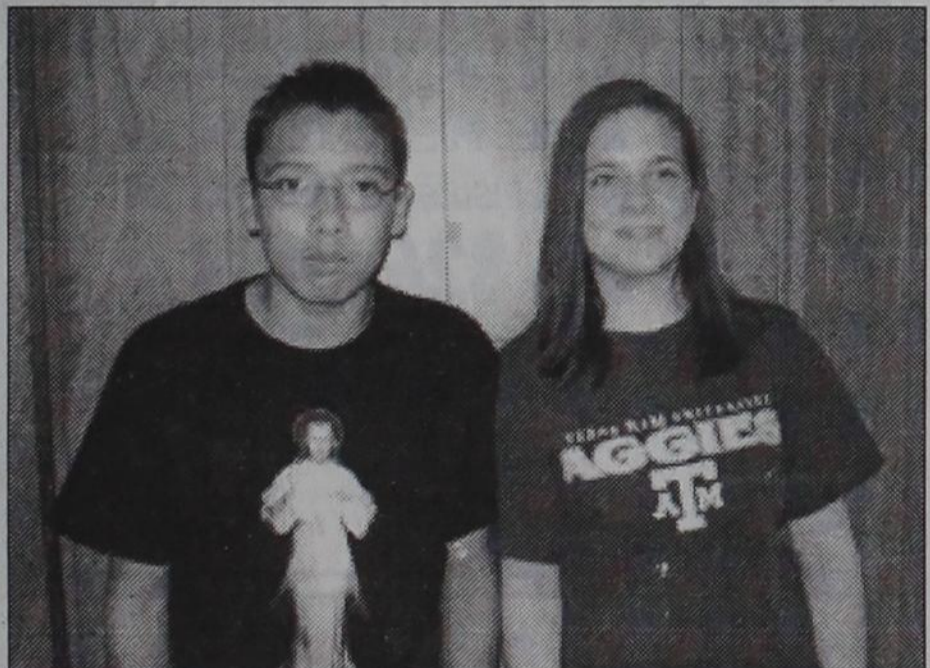

Mrs. Bryant worked as an accountant for several years for several firms. She accepted Christ in

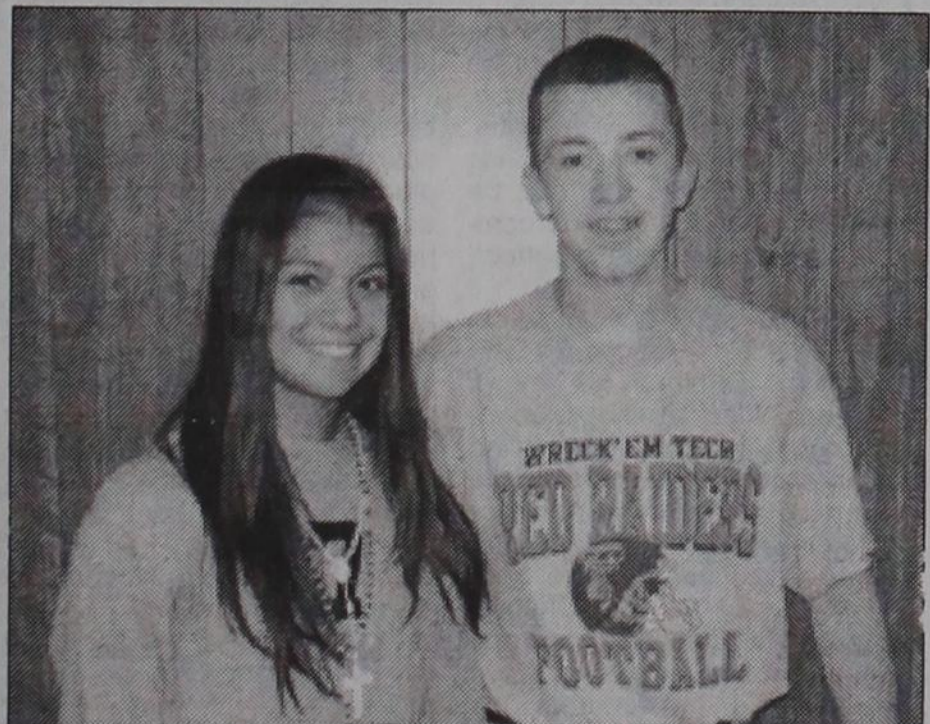
1962 and loved the Lord. Mrs. Bryant was a member of the First Baptist church in Allison.

The book of Job tells a strange story that some scholars debate whether it is an actual historical story or a metaphor of human life that is intertwined with a benevolent God and a wicked Satan (I say it can be both). There are plenty of lessons that can be learned from this book: patience, remaining faithful while suffering, trusting God, etc. There are also plenty of lessons that can be learned on what NOT to do: complaining, thinking one is perfect, pride, etc.

It is easy in the book of Job to pick on Job's three friends who come to visit him in his time of anguish. After all, they eventually try to convince Job that he is a terrible sinner who is receiving what he deserves. And that is an unfortunate truth, but I want to point out one positive from these three friends. In Chapter 1 everything that could go wrong does go wrong for Job. He loses his animals, his servants, his crops...even his children. In the

beginning of Chapter 2, Job loses his health. He is a pitiful mess with nowhere to turn, but he has three friends with hard-to-pronounce names (Eliphaz, Bildad and Zophar) who then turn to him. They go to sympathize and comfort him (2:11). When they saw him from a distance, they could hardly recognize him; they began to weep aloud, and they tore their robes and sprinkled dust on their heads. Then, they sat on the ground with him for seven days and seven nights. No one said a word to him, because they saw how great his suffering was (2:12-13).

Here is the point to emphasize today: When they see a friend who is sick and in trouble, they go to be with him. They share his grief and pain. And because there are no good words to even utter at that time, they just sit with him in silence. A good friend is willing to just be there for his friends.
