Commissioners Conduct Business for September; Raises Are Awarded County Full-Time, Part Time Employees

The Commissioners’ Court of Wheeler County met in regular session on Monday, September 10, 2012, at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners’ Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse at 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern.

The court reconvened at 10:00 a.m. to address the sixteen items on the agenda.

The minutes of the previous meetings were approved.

The monthly reports of the Justices of the Peace, County Clerk and District Clerk were accepted as presented.

The hourly payroll time sheets were approved for payment.

The court voted to pay the bills as approved.

John Walker, Commissioner, Pct. 4, received the court’s ap-

proval to move some money around in his account.

No action was taken on the burn ban.

Harrison Hall, representing a group of local land owners requested the commissioners to intervene with the Public Utility Commission in the matter of Xcel Energy, Bowers to Howard transmission line. The court voted to join Gray County in requesting Xcel Energy use existing transmission lines instead of adding a new line.

The county received three proposals for construction manager at Risk for Wheeler County Law Enforcement center. Bids were accepted from Plains Builders and Southwest General Contractors of Amarillo and W. E. Kibler of Dallas.

A 15 minute recess was called

for the commissioners to go over the bids. When the court reconvened, the court voted to accept the bid of Southwest General Contractors.

The court authorized architect to submit a waiver to Texas Commission of Jail Standards for sprinkler system in cell area of the Wheeler County Law Enforcement Center. This will mean the county does not have to install sprinklers inside the jail cells of the new facility.

The court then reviewed the

preliminary schematic designs for Wheeler County Law Enforcement Center and gave the architect permission to go to Austin to approve the schematic designs. These design of the office space is subject to change; it is necessary for the state to approve the part of the facility having to do with the cells. (Continued Page 7)

Driver Killed In Accident Sunday Near Allison, TX

One person was killed when a truck and towed unit overturned September 9, 2012 at the west edge of Allison on FM1046. The vehicle was traveling east when the driver lost control on a curve.

The units overturned one and half times.

The driver and lone occupant, Jesse Joe Garcia, 30, of Mem-

phis, TX was not wearing a seatbelt and was partially ejected from his vehicle. He was pronounced dead by Wheeler County Justice of the Peace, Mark Brown.

The accident occurred at 4:40 a.m. The speed limit for the area of the accident was 40 mph.

A 2007 Dragon tank trailer was being towed.

Ms. Fagan Cook presented the new budget for discussion and revision if necessary. She also presented an additional Certification of the Tax Appraisal of 2012. This will change the proposed budget that had been reviewed at the last meeting. Revised copies of the budget were given to all members for their edification.

James Batton presented the effective tax rate for discussion. Consensus was that the Board should consider an increase in the tax rate for the coming year since we will be using up our reserves this fall. No one was interested in

BOWERS CEMETERY RECEIVES HISTORIC TEXAS CEMETERY DESIGNATION

Shamrock, Texas - The Texas Historical Commission (THC) recently designated Bowers Cemetery as a Historic Texas Cemetery. The distinction means the

cemetery has been legally recorded through the THC’s Historic Texas Cemetery Program, an important step in ensuring its preservation.

This designation is reserved for cemeteries that are at least 50 years old and documented through the Historic Texas Cemeteries process to record their historic association and significance.

“This designation is a tool that will increase public awareness of these important cultural resources,” said Mark Wolfe, executive director of the THC. “Knowledge and education are among the best ways to guarantee the preservation of a historic cemetery.”

Ada Lester, Chairperson for the Wheeler County Historical Commission, stated, “The CHC Board is very pleased to have the Bowers Cemetery designated as a Historical Site. Bowers Cemetery is very special and its preservation is of up-most importance.”

Cemeteries hold valuable historic information and they are often the last reminders of early settlement’ historical events, religious beliefs, lifestyles and genealogy. While the Historic Texas Cemetery designation encourages cemetery preservation, it cannot guarantee that a historic

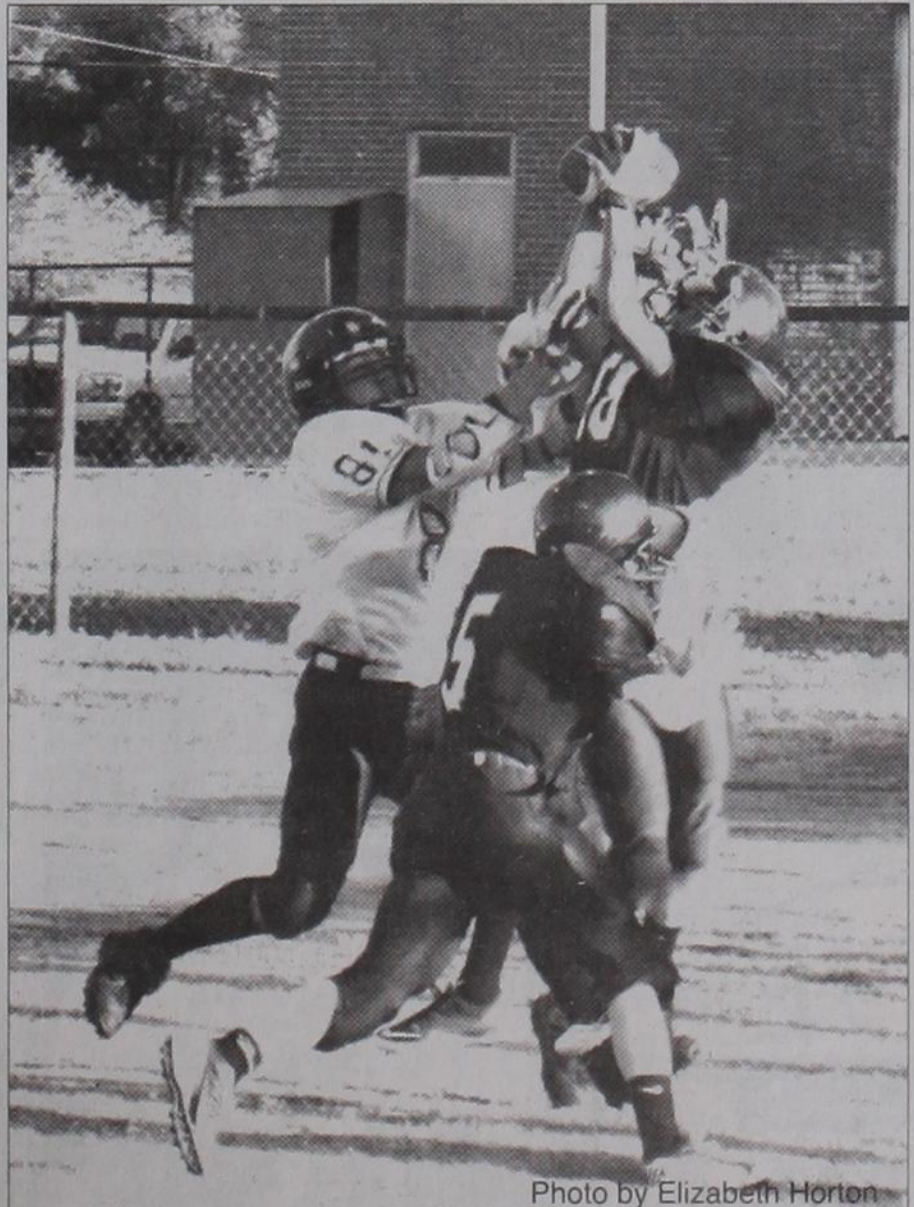

Suicide

A subject that most people do not want to hear or talk about. But in this day and time we live in, it is a fact we have to deal with. Statistics show that one in 6 people will have thoughts of suicide at least once in their lives.

The last thing that most people expect is that they will run out of reasons to live. But if you are experiencing suicidal thoughts, you need to know that you're not alone.

Suicidal thinking is usually associated with problems that can be treated.

Clinical depression, anxiety disorders, chemical dependency, and other disorders produce profound emotional distress. They also interfere with effective problem-solving. But you need to know that studies show that the vast majority of people who receive appropriate treatment improve or recover completely. Even if you have received treatment before, you should know that different treatments work better for different people in different situations. Several tries are sometimes necessary before the right combination is found.

If you are unable to think of solutions other than suicide, it is not that solutions don't exist, only that you are currently unable to see them.

Therapists and counselors (and sometimes friends) can help you to see solutions that otherwise are not apparent to you.

Suicidal crises are almost always temporary.

Although it might seem as if your unhappiness will never end, it is important to realize that crises are usually time-limited. Solutions are found, feelings change, unexpected positive events occur. Suicide is sometimes referred to as "a permanent solution to a temporary problem." Don't let suicide rob you of better times that will come your way when you allow more time to pass.

Problems are seldom as great as they appear at first glance.

Job loss, financial problems, loss of important people in our lives — all such stressful events can seem catastrophic at the time they are happening. Then, month or years later, they usually look smaller and more manageable. Sometimes, imagining ourselves "five years down the road" can help us to see that a problem that currently seems catastrophic will pass and that we will survive.

Reasons for living can help sustain a person in pain.

A famous psychologist once conducted a study of Nazi concentration camp survivors, and found that those who survived almost always reported strong beliefs about what was important in life. You, too, might be able to strengthen your connection with life if you consider what has sustained you through hard times in the past. Family ties, religion, love of art or nature, and dreams for the future are just a few of the many aspects of life that provide meaning and gratification, but which we can lose sight of due to emotional distress.

Do not keep suicidal thoughts to yourself!

Help is available for you, whether through a friend, therapist, or member of the clergy. Find someone you trust and let them know how bad things are. This can be your first step on the road to healing.

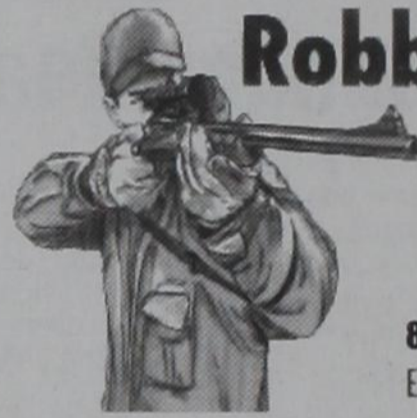

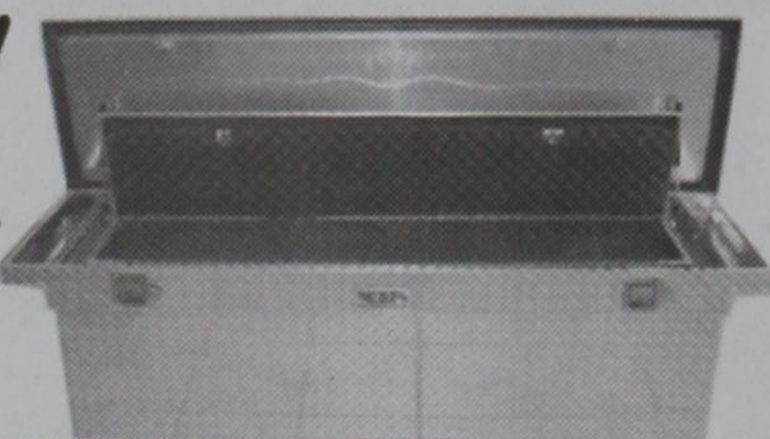

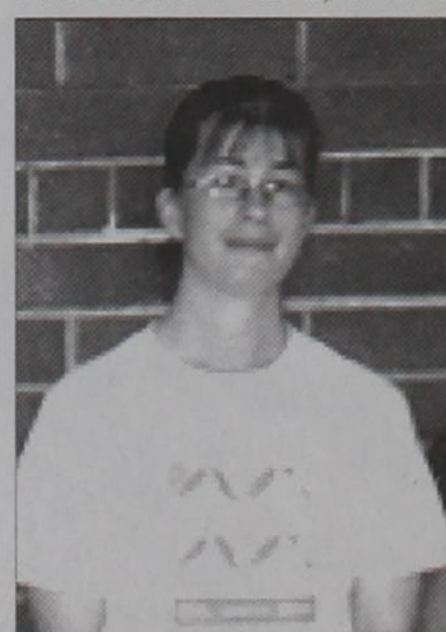

July ended and August began on a wet note and few, if any, residents of the Wheeler area are unhappy about it.

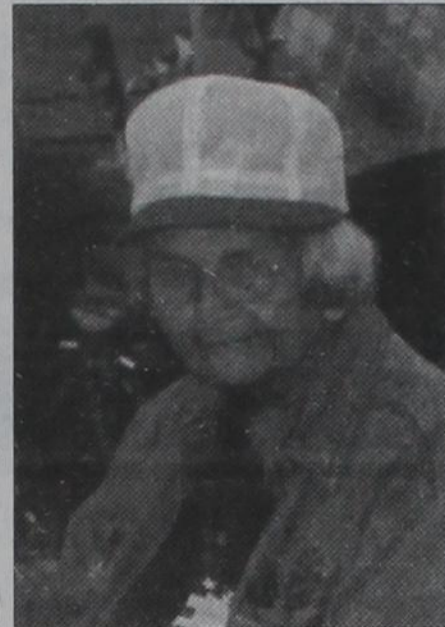
Officially—and surprisingly—the city of Wheeler received a grand total of 6.04 inches during the month just completed, compared to 2.91 inches in July, 1961.

The THC developed the Historic Texas Cemetery designation to address the destruction of historic cemeteries and the illegal removal of cemetery fixtures. Any individual or organization is eligible to submit an application for this designation.
