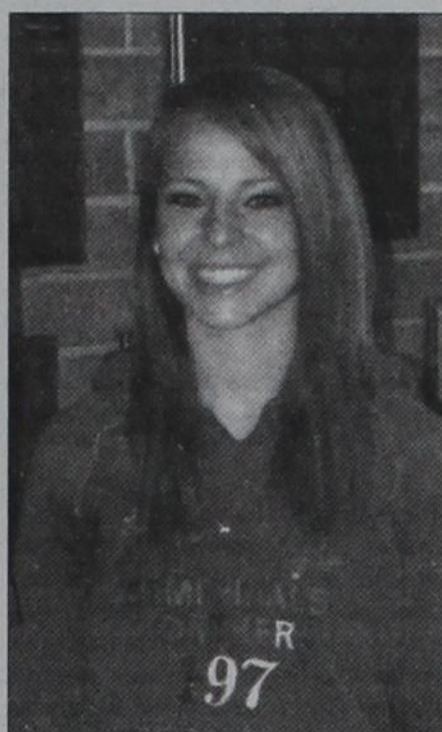
STORM REPORT

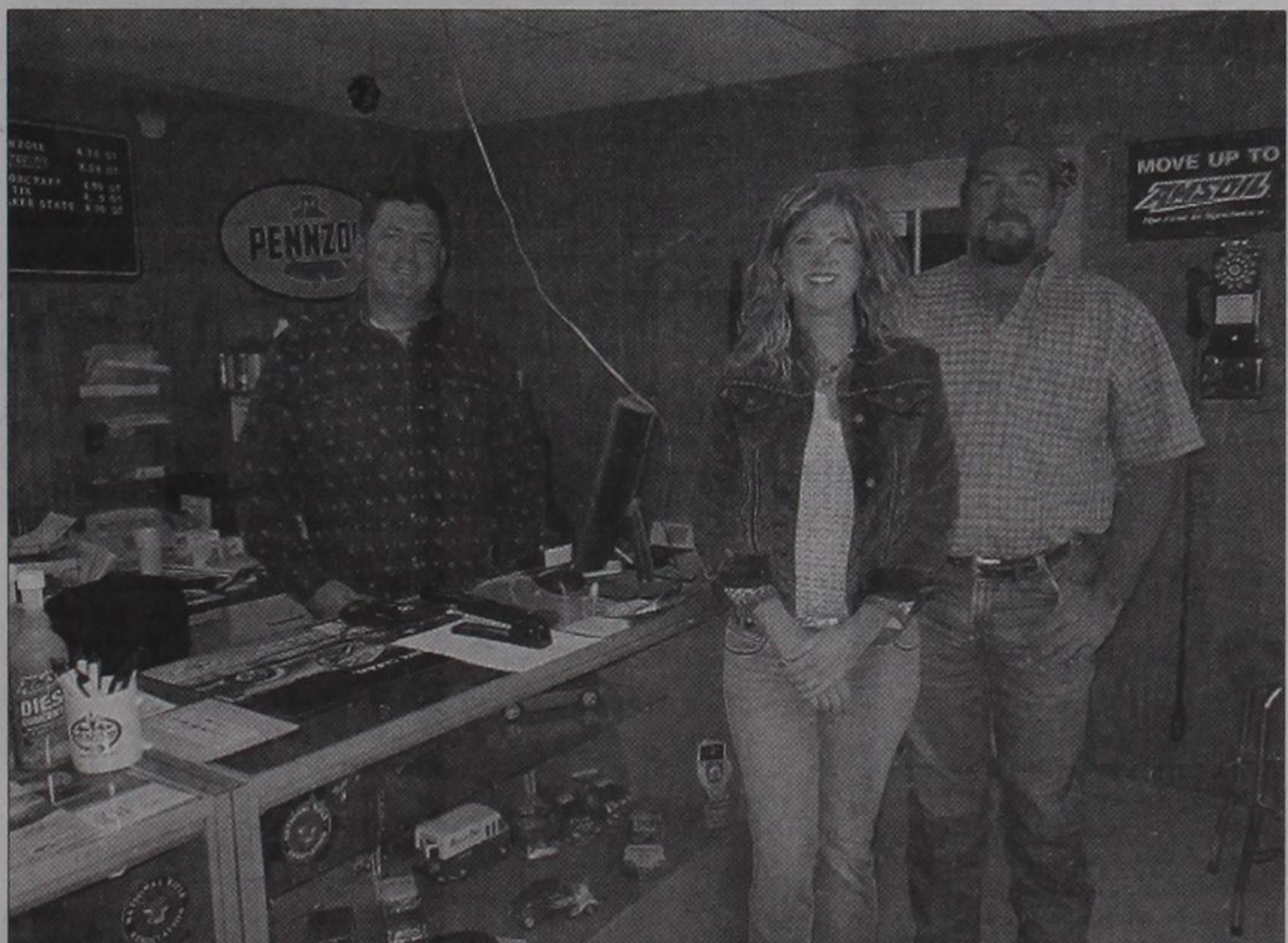

Mayor Bob McCain called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Don Rose motioned, seconded by Barbra Koelzer, to approve the September minutes as written. Motion carried with 3 for and 0 against.

Don Rose motioned, seconded by Kendall Hefley, to approve payment of monthly bills. Motion carried with 3 for and 0 against. Harrison Hall addressed the

Council concerning the alley behind the Methodist Church and wanting to discourage cars from driving through it. Council will discuss and get back to him.

Donald Bland, with West Texas Gas, presented information and a resolution on the rate increase. Resolution is to settle a rate increase of no more than 50% of asking rate increase.

Public Comments: Lavon Williams stated he was against proposed rate increase.

Barbra Koelzer motioned to pass the Resolution, and accept the settlement offer, seconded by Kendall Hefley. Motion passed with Barbra Koelzer and Kendall Hefley voting for, and Don Rose voting against.

Marco Lopez, of Parkhill, Smith, and Cooper presented the Council with Opinion of Probable Costs on Reverse Osmosis System to

improve the Nitrate count in the City water. Kendall Hefley made a motion to begin the pilot study required by T.C.E.Q. Seconded by Don Rose. Motion carried with 3 in favor and 0 against.

Barbra Koelzer made a motion for Engineers to proceed with exploring two options to dispose of wasted water during osmosis process: Injection well or irrigation. Seconded by Don Rose. Motion passed with 3 in favor and 0 against.

Barbra Koelzer motioned to reimburse the Chamber of Commerce for advertising costs of the Ranch Rodeo in the amount of \$1475.00 out of Hotel Occupancy Tax funds. Seconded by Don Rose. Motion carried with 3 in favor and 0 against.

Barbra Koelzer made a motion to advertise for a new maintenance

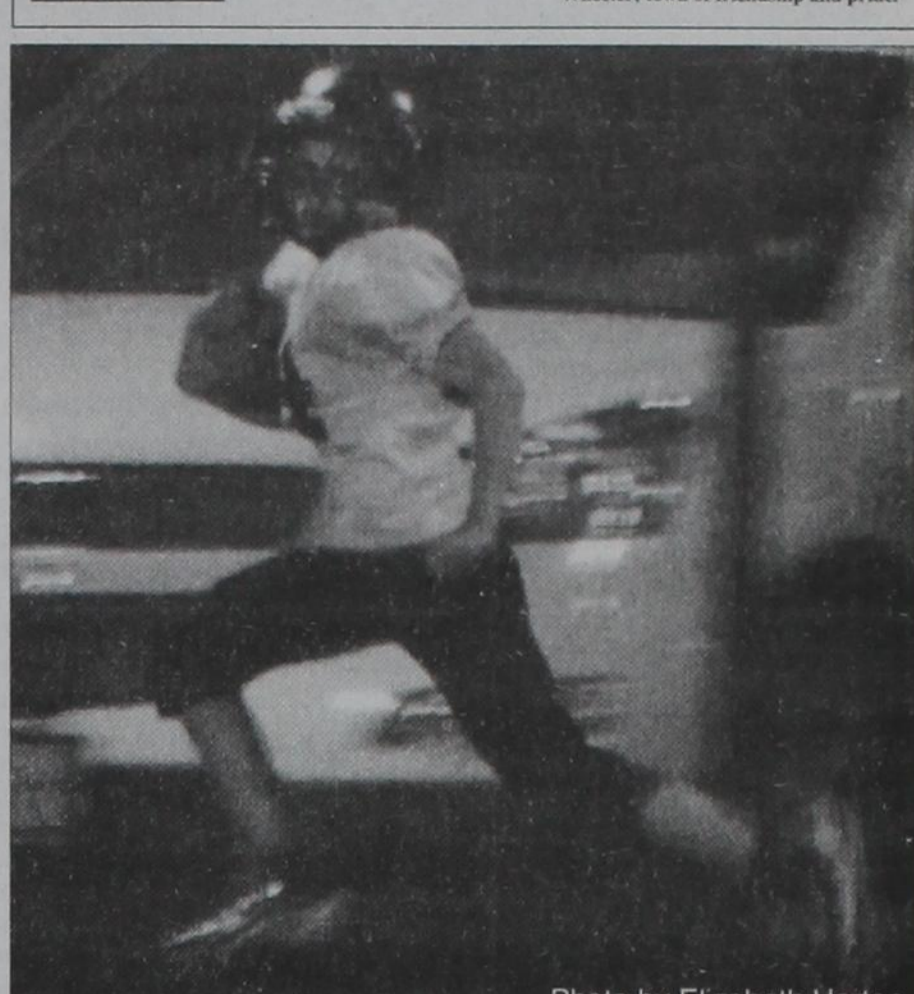

Parkview Artery Your Lungs

Average adult takes 15 to 20 breaths a minute - over 20,000 breaths a day. Your respiratory system, which includes the nose, throat, windpipe (trachea) and lungs, brings air into the body when you breathe. In the lungs, the oxygen from each breath is transferred to the bloodstream and sent to all the body's cells as life-sustaining fuel. Keeping your lungs healthy is an important part of an overall healthy lifestyle.

Protecting Your Lungs

The lungs are different from most of the other organs in your body because their delicate tissues are directly connected to the outside environment. Anything you breathe in can affect your lungs: Germs, tobacco smoke and other harmful substances can cause damage to your airways and threaten the lungs ability to work properly.

Your body has a natural defense system designed to protect the lungs. This works very well most of the time to keep out dirt and fight off germs. But there are some important things you can do to reduce your risk of lung disease.

Don't Smoke

Cigarette smoking is the major cause of COPD and lung cancer. Cigarette smoke can narrow the air passages and make breathing more difficult. It causes chronic inflammation or swelling in the lung. This can lead to chronic bronchitis. Over time cigarette smoke destroys lung tissue, and may trigger changes that grow into cancer.

WARNING SIGNS

If you have any of these warning signs or symptoms, tell your healthcare provider as soon as possible.

Chronic Cough - A cough that you have had for a month is chronic. This is an important early symptom. It tells you something is wrong with your respiratory system.

Shortness of Breath - Shortness of breath that doesn't go away after exercising, or that you have after little or no exertion, is not normal. Labored or difficult breathing - the feeling that it is hard to breathe in or breathe out - is also a warning sign.

Chronic Mucus Production - Mucus, also called sputum or phlegm, is produced by the airways. It is a defense response to infections or irritants. If your mucus production has lasted a month, this could indicate lung disease.

Wheezing - Noisy breathing or wheezing is a sign that something unusual is blocking your lungs' airways or making them too narrow.

Coughing up Blood - If you are coughing up blood, the blood may be coming from your lungs or upper respiratory tract. Whatever the source of the blood, it is a sign of a health problem.

Chronic Chest Pain - Unexplained chest pain that lasts for a month or more - especially if it gets worse when you breathe in or cough - can also be a warning sign.

Regular check-ups are an important part of disease prevention, even when you are feeling well. This is especially true for lung disease, which sometimes goes undetected until it is serious. During a check-up, your healthcare provider will listen to your breathing and talk to you about any concerns you may have.

NOTICE OF DRINKING WATER NITRATE VIOLATION

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has notified the **WHEELER MUNICIPAL WATER SYSTEM** that the drinking water being supplied to customers had exceeded the Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) for nitrate. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) has established the MCL for nitrate at 10 milligrams per liter (mg/L) based on a single sample, and has determined that it is a health concern at levels above the MCL. Analysis of the drinking water in your community for nitrate indicates a compliance value in **quarter three 2012 of 21 mg/L for EP001.** Infants below the age of six months who drink water containing nitrate in excess of the MCL could become seriously ill and, if untreated, may die. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blue baby syndrome. If your child is under the age of six months, the child must be given an alternative water supply for any consumption. Boiling the affected water is **not** an effective treatment for nitrate removal. Most consumers do not need to use an alternative water supply. However, if you have health concerns, you may want to talk to your doctor to get more information about how this may affect you. At this time, the health effects to fetuses of pregnant women is unclear. If you are pregnant, you may choose to use an alternative source of water for drinking and cooking purposes. We are working to correct the problem.

Bottled water is available at no cost for the affected populations at City Hall. The City is in the process of getting a cost evaluation of different treatment facilities and drilling a water well for water quantity. Please share this information with all people who drink this water, especially those who may not received this notice directly

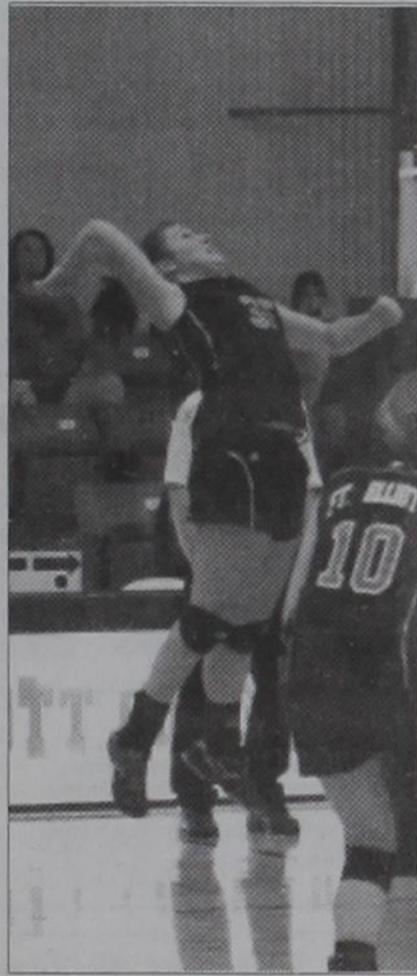

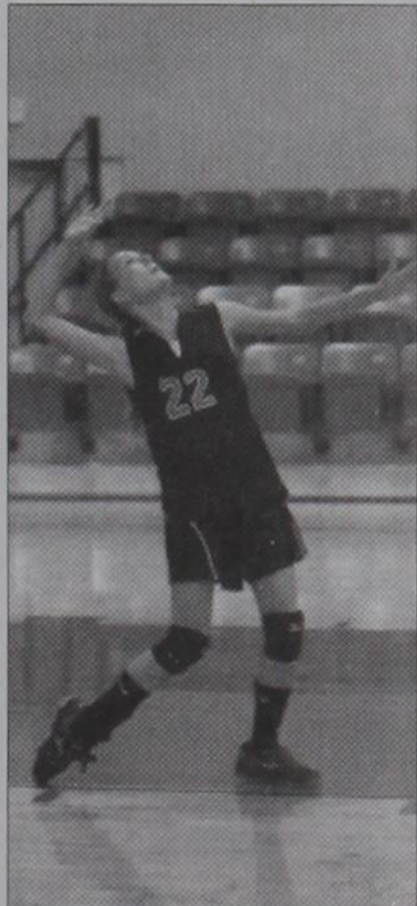

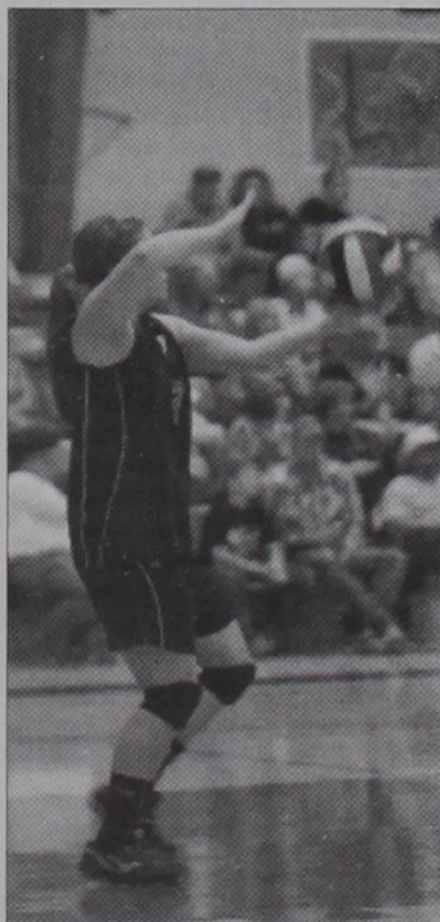
