According to the American Heart Association, more than $\mathbf{5 0 0 , 0 0 0}$
Americans will experience a stroke this year. In many cases, quick action
can prevent more serious can prevent more serious problems
from occuring as the result of a stroke. A stroke happens when oxygen-rich blood is cut off on its way to the brain. This can be caused by a clot in an artery that supplies blood to the brain, or by an aneurysm, the bursting of a
blood vessel in the brain. How a blood vessel in the brain. How a
person is affected by a stroke depends largely on what part of the brain is robbed of the needed oxygen. There are several ways your body
may warn you of a major stroke: may warn you of a major stroke:

* a sudden, temporary weakness * a sudden, temporary
