

This group is dedicated to the history of Fort Elliott and the recreation of the troops serving here between 1875 and 1890. One of the last forts established on the frontier, the troops of Fort Elliott were in charge of patrolling the Texas Panhandle and the western part of Indian Territory to prevent Indian hunting parties from entering the Panhandle. Members of the Frontier Regiment of the High Plains portray a variety of roles, including U.S. Cavalry troopers, Infantry soldiers, Artillery, Southern Plains Indians, buffalo hunters, civilian scouts and wagon teamsters.
