**BOARD, COUNCIL FILINGS CLOSE; VOTE MAY 6** 





This parable reads: Two men went up into the temple to pray, better than anyone. He merely one a Pharisee, and the other a tax-gatherer. The Pharisee stood and was praying thus to himself, 'God, I thank Thee, that I am not like other people: swindlers, unjust, adulters, or even like the tax-gather, I fast twice a week; I pay tithes of all that I get.' But the tax-gatherer, standing some distance away, was even unwilling to lift up his eyes to heaven, but was beating his breast, saying, 'God be merciful to me, the sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself shall be humbled, but he who humbles himslef shall be exalted." (verses 10-14)

> But consider the tax-gatherer. He does not boast of a sinless life. He does not thank God that he is confesses his sinfulness and asks for mercy. And Jesus says: "--This man went down to his house justified rather than the other for everyone who exalts himself shall be humbled, but he who humbles himself shall be exalted." (Luke 18:14)
