Panhandle Community Transit Service

For the fifth year Panhandle Community Service's Panhandle Transit system has received funds through the Urban Mass Transportation. This service for Collingsworth and Wheeler counties started during a blizzard in February of 1985. Jean Ferguson, driver was stranded for 2 days in Amarillo after the initial training before she could get the 1985 Chevrolet Station Wagon back to Wellington.

During the past four years, the station wagon has been driven between 60,000 and 80,000 miles a year transporting people to various destinations. For two years the station wagon made three trips a week to Amarillo to take clients from Wellington, Shamrock and McLean to the Dialysis Center in Amarillo for Kidney Dialysis. During one of those trips, there was a sudden snow storm and they were stranded in Amarillo for 24

Mrs. Ferguson has one client that is 95 years old and the only reason she can still remain in her own home is the fact that Panhandle Transit provides transportation from her home in Mobeetie to her doctor in Pampa.

Panhandle Community Service's Panhandle Transit Service is designed to provide door to door transportation for senior citizens, handicapped persons and the general public who have no other means of transportation. This service is primarily on a first come basis, however since citizens of Collingsworth and Wheeler counties are so far from the medical specialists in Amarillo, we often consider medical transportation as a priority.

And now while I'm extolling friends I shall not leave out Louis and his wife Barbara. They moved here 29 years ago. Their first home here was my cottage just back of my house, facing Canadian St. I remember one time I was taken ill quite suddenly. I left a basket of wet clothes under the clothesline in the back yard. Barbara found them and she and her mother, who was visiting, hung them on the line for me. As the years went by the friendship grew. As I became more dependent the Stas' became more helpful and attentive. I don't know how it started but each Thursday at 8:30 Louis has breakfast with me unless he has ambulance call or urgent business. He does a lot of favors for me. Not long ago I went to Tulia to visit my sister. Before the set time for my return home I developed an infectious tooth ache and needed to get home. So Louis let Steve, my grandson, use his car to come get me. What kind of a friend do you call that?

I have so many friends all over the U.S.A. I wish I could tell you about all of them. And Friends, I hope you have had a Happy Valentine's Day.

To go on a little more about the Editor—the Times staff observed his birthday on Tuesday. About 8:30 there was cinnamon rolls and coffee.

AT&T ANNOUNCES PRICE CHANGES FOR LONG DISTANCE CALLS WITHIN TEXAS

AT&T announces April 1, 1989, price changes for Long Distance Service (MTS) within Texas. AT&T's prices for long distance calling within Texas will be increased by two cents per minute for calls under 82 miles in distance and one cent per minute for calls that are 82 miles or greater in distance. AT&T's current discounts of 25% for evening calls and 40% for night and weekend calls will remain in effect. The price increases are expected to produce approximately \$22.8 million, which is nearly 2.9% of AT&T's annual revenues for Texas Long Distance Service.

This represents the first AT&T price increase for long distance calls within Texas. AT&T's long distance prices for calls within Texas have been reduced overall by about 12% since 1986.

The Long Distance Service price changes will also impact AT&T's PROsm WATS Texas offering, which offers subscribers a 10% discount on all long distance calls within Texas. These price changes are expected to produce approximately \$661,000, or about 3.5% of the annual revenues for AT&T's PROsm WATS Texas offering.

Prices for AT&T's REACH OUT® Texas offering will also change. The price for initial hour usage will increase from \$12.55 to \$12.95; the additional hour price will increase from \$11.40 to \$12.00. These price increases are expected to produce approximately \$364,000, or about 2.1% of the annual revenues for AT&T's REACH OUT® Texas offering.

AT&T's tariffs implementing these changes will be filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas on March 1, 1989, with an effective date of April 1, 1989. The combined price increases are expected to produce approximately \$23.9 million, which is approximately 2.4% of AT&T's annual revenues for all Texas intrastate
