C.W. "Blacky" Tillman, 73, died

Friday, Nov. 17, 1989. Services were held at 11 a.m. Tuesday, Nov. 20, 1989 in Lemons Memorial Chapel. Zeb Sailors, minister of the Church of Christ, officiated. Burial was in Parklawn Memorial Gardens, Plainview.

Mr. Tillman, born in Texas, grew up in Wheeler and graduated from Wheeler High School. He moved to San Diego in 1941 and worked at an aircraft factory. He returned to Wheeler in 1946. He worked as a blacksmith and in the oil fields.

He moved to Plainview in 1964, where he operated a laundry. He married Christine Stapleton in 1962 at Amarillo. She died in 1985. He moved to Borger in 1988. He was a member of Stinnett Curch of Christ.


### Shamrock Pastor to **Lead European Tour**
