

The Mobeetie community was hit early Sunday by two acts of vandalism. A cross was burned and the school was flooded.


One individual is to be charged in the burning of a cross in the yard of Earl and Mabel Tabor. The incident was not religiously nor racially motivated.

### **FRUIT JUICE MAY BE CULPRIT**

When their toddlers suffer a bout of diarrhea, many parents encourage them to drink extra juice to replace lost fluids and calories. Yet, certain fruit juice, notably apple and pear, apparently make diarrhea more severe in some children.

When pediatricians at Conneticut's Hartford Hospital eliminated apple juice from the diets of five younsters suffering from chronic diarrhea, the problem ceased in all cases. The same results were achieved more recently in another group of toddlers treated at the same facility. Diarrhea symptoms stopped completely in half of the group after fruit juice was withdrawn from their eating regimens. According to pediatrician Dr. Jeffrey S. Hyams, Connecticut's Hartford Hospital, parents should not be misled into thinking fruit juice is not suitable for healthy children. It is. Still, when an otherwise healthy child has diarrhea, it's not unreasonable to try limiting juice in the child's diet for a few days. **Continued** Page 6
