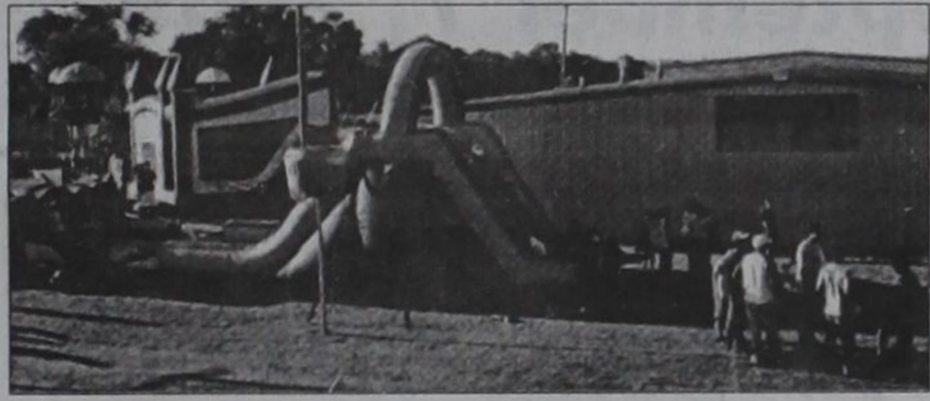
First grade is really fun! You have to do lots of numbers and words and things. I do my work at school and I still have homework. Now we do our number facts. We practice for 100 times.

Motion by James Masters; Second by Billy Richardson; To pay bills as presented. Motion carried unanimously

Motion by Billy Richardson; Second by Ravonda Hardcastle; To offer the appointment of Mark Marshall. Motion carried unanimously

Graveside Rites For Olen Maxwell

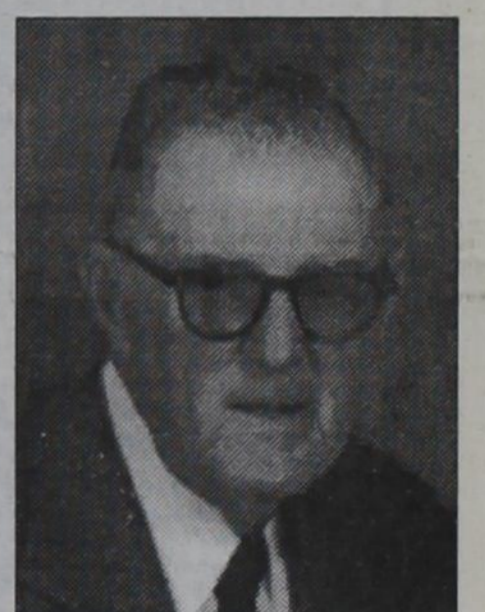
Olen L. Maxwell, 90 died Friday, August 21, 2009, at Amarillo, TX.

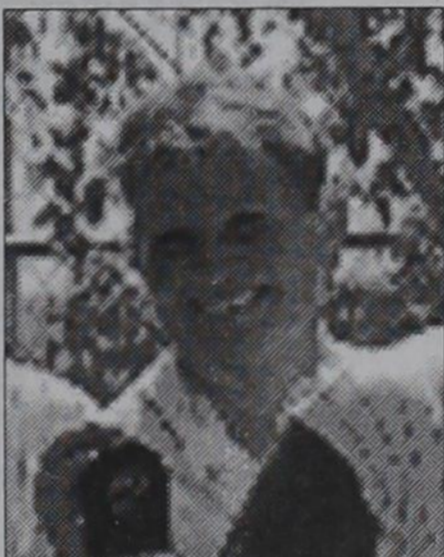

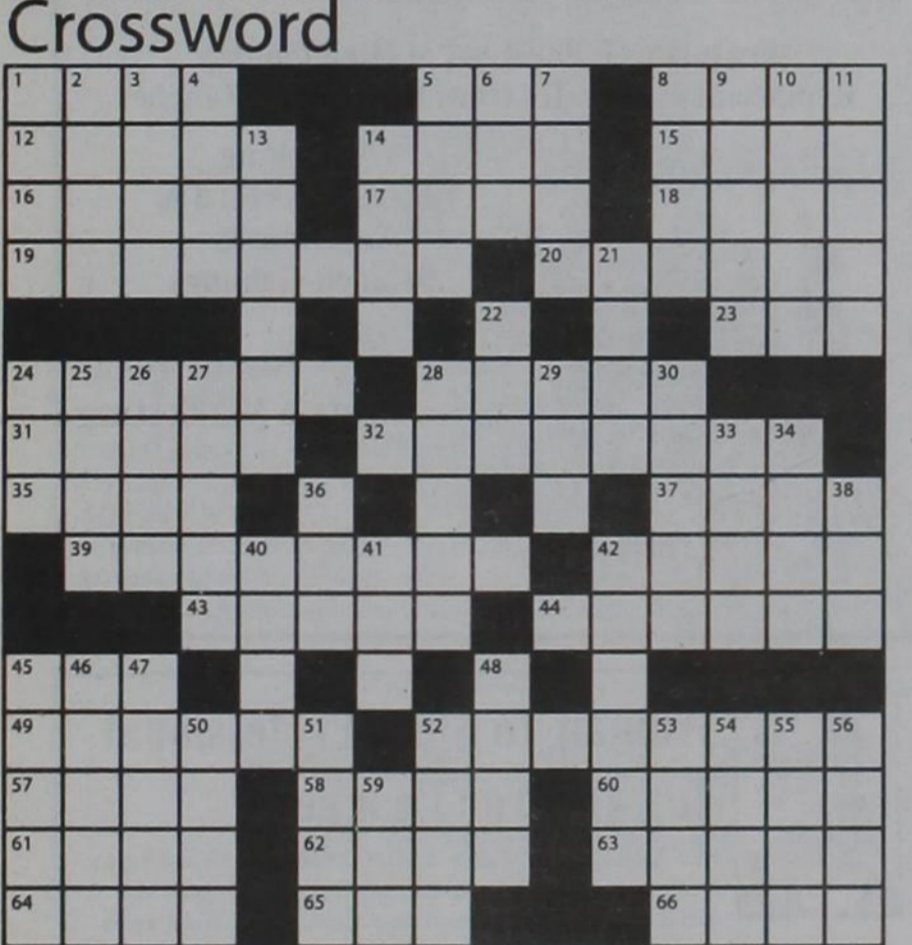

OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

MISSING LUNCH FIRST DAY And RUMBLE SEAT RIDE

When I started to school at Wheeler, they didn't have a kindergarten class, but when my Dad was stationed in Iowa, I went to kindergarten there. That made me a year older than the kids I was starting first grade with. I thought, since I was 'experienced' in this school stuff, things would go really smooth. I had already forgotten that in Iowa, the first time my mom let me walk home from school, I got lost and had to have

help finding my way home. Well, I sure wasn't going to get lost at Wheeler, because I was going to ride the bus with my older cousins and they knew just what you had to do.

The first half of the day went real well, but when it came time to eat at noon things took a downward turn. I had to make a dash to the bathroom and when I got back, my class had disappeared into thin air. I looked in all four

classrooms, but couldn't find 'em. So, I just went back to my room and felt sorry for myself. I didn't get to eat lunch that day and I was really hungry. When Mrs. Farmer got back, she seemed to feel sorry for me too; a little sympathy helped me feel better, right away. She told me that the cafeteria was upstairs, so I'd know where to go the next day. Gosh, I never thought about looking upstairs...

Boy, did I like Mrs. Farmer! She told me that a long time ago, she had been my mom's teacher at "Corn Valley School," an old two-room school about four or five miles west of Wheeler. Because of that, I thought I had a leg up on everybody else, but she treated everyone equally well.

We were sure happy that she moved up to "second grade teacher" the next year, so we had

her two years. We all figured she must really like us, too. I decided my luck must be changing for the better!

The first week hadn't even ended when I was told that I needed another shot. Bad luck had returned! I either didn't have all of my immunization shots yet, or my folks didn't have a record of it. Anyway, the school told them I needed some particular shot and as it turned out, Jimmy needed one more, too. His folks told me that they could pick up both of us after school and take us by the hospital to get our shots updated.

That evening, they drove up to the school in their "Model-A" Ford car, put us in the "rumble seat" and headed for the hospital. I had considered jumping out and running, but knew that sooner or later, I'd get caught and wind up getting the

shot anyway. Besides, it was great fun riding in the rumble seat!

When we got there, his folks ushered us on inside. Neither one of us were looking forward to a shot of any kind and unlike today, they didn't hand out suckers afterwards. I'd already faced the needle several times before I went to Kindergarten in Iowa. The smallpox vaccination was one of the worst, it made a big, itchy scab, then a scar on your arm that lasted forever! They told us we wouldn't ever have to get that one again. As it turned out, we didn't get the shot from Dr. Harold (well

known for giving almost painless shots) or his father. A nurse gave them to us out in the hallway. She got it over with pretty fast and that suited us just fine. Now, we could relax and get back to normal...whatever that might be.

We never had to get any more shots because of school, but I must have been a bit accident prone. Seems like I wound up there often to get stitched up and once for a tetanus shot. Most of my trips to the hospital were in the summer when I would step on stuff bare footed; usually rusty nails or broken glass. I spent a lot of time soaking a foot in coal oil (kerosene) after stepping on a nail. I don't think that's doctor recommended, so don't try it. It's one of those years ago, homemade remedies that's better forgotten, than done. I found out later on that wearing shoes really cut down on my trips to the hospital....
