



She stated, "Not only have I lost 30 pounds but my cholesterol has dropped from 232 to 143. I have two closets full of clothes which have not fit me in two years that I can now wear." 





Funny how an ole feeble mind will wonder and where it will wind up. Well this ole mind wondered back in the 40s and sort of drifted down on a B17 er The Flying Fortress. These monsters had come to Alaska from Outside as we called the US of A cause it was way south and east of us. Anyhow seeing these planes come to Elmdorf airfield made you wonder if there wuz room for all of them to land there. A buddy of mine that I had grown up with in Wheeler, Texas had told me they were going to go back and fly these ladies in and I would get to see them land. I believe Grady, the buddy, and all the flyboys had been crewing B 24s, the Liberators and had had them shot full of holes down in the Chain as we called the Alutian Islands. Everyone had hoped the 17s would do the job and would come home without the

I was with an Artillery outfit that protected Elmdorf field and we would get to see the planes when they came back from the raids and the first time the boys came back I saw the plane Grady was on and as I went toward it you could see they had some perferations in the hull. Matter of fact I counted 11 holes you could crawl through but the boys had made the raid and had come home safely as they called it.

Grady and I got to go into Anchorage for a couple of hours fer some R and R as liberties were called and we visited and we had talked about when we were kids there in Wheeler and how he wanted to be a radio announcer and how he did get a job before the war at a radio station in Amarillo with Cal Farley (founder of Boys Ranch) and how he aspired to become a Walter Cranckcase er better and as we left Anchorage and headed back to camp we had planned on having a good meal and visit again when they got back from the Chain in a few days.

Those few days have turned into many years, nearly fifty of them. Grady was one of the boys that never made it. His plane was shot down but some of the crew bailed out but Grady just stayed with the plane. I visited with some of his crew many months later in Fresno, Calif. and we sang Grady's very favorite song "Danny Boy" and shed a few tears.

I had a first cousin that was a Fortress pilot over in Europe and he got shot down and was a prisoner many months but when he returned to civilian life he flew these monsters in the Rio Grande Valley as spray planes and even now I guess he tries to visit the Confederate Air Force when a 17 is around.

I came back to the States with a Belly Gunner off a 17 and he and I went to Cadet School together. This friend was a Montana cowboy and had two wounds the Japs had given him down on the Chain but Martin Olsen was determined he was goin to be a pilot, probably one of them Flying Fortress type. We were assigned to different schools and Inever saw Marty again, hope he is cowboying now.

How did I get started on this wanderin? I'll tell you why, Junior Johnson, my neighbor, who lives about a half mile west of us brought me a copy of the Bloomington Hearald Times of August 25, 91 and it had a story of Sentimental Journey in it. That ole grey headed coot ought to know better than to get me started on stuff like that. Next thing you know he will bring me the Playboy magazine and see what I find in it. That ole feller is battery operated. Got him a pace maker. Must have them newfangled batteries in it, he just keeps going, going and going





From The Minister's Desk:

On April 5, 1991, the television program, 20/20, had its highest rating in ten years. The reason for this high rating was the broadcast of an exorcism performed in October by a Roman Catholic priest on a sixteen year old girl.

Since this exorcism consisted of a six hour ritual, the 20/20 program could only show twenty-six minutes of the actual exorcism. It showed a priest, who was assisted by several other people, press a silver cross against the young girl's head, saying: "In the name of Jesus Christ, I command the spirit of evil to leave

This televised exorcism sparked a renewed interest in demon possession which has caused many people to ask: "Can people really be possessed by a demon? "To answer this question, some New Testament facts must be considered. These facts are: -

1. The New Testament reports that people were often possessed by demons during the life of Jesus. For example, the last half of the eighth chapter of Matthew reports about the visit of Jesus to "-the country of Gadarenes-", reporting that Jesus was met by two men who were demon possessed. When these men met Jesus, they said: "What do we have to do with You, Son of God? Have You come here to torment us before the time? "Jesus then cast the demonthat possessed them into a herd of swine who rushed into the sea and drown. (verses 28-

Throughout the New Testament, there are other tests that clearly reveal that demon possession was a common phenomenon during the life of Jesus.

2. The New Testament makes a distinction between people who were demon possessed and people who were mentally or physically ill. This distinction can be clearly seen in some instructions that Jesus gave to His apostles. He said: "Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons --. " (Mat-

thew 10:8) If demon possession was merely a physical or a mental illness, why did Jesus tell His apostles that they would "-heal the sick-" and "cast out demons-"? During the ministry of Jesus, demon possession did cause physical and mental illness in people. But Jesus plainly taught there was a distinction between illness and demon posses-

3. The New Testament states that

Jesus and His apostles practiced authentic exorcism. But these were not accomplished by lengthy and elaborate rituals, consisting of repeated invocations for divine intervention. Rather these exorcisms were accomplished by a simple command.

For example, when Jesus exorcised the two demon possessed men in "-the country of Gadarenes-" He did not perform a six hour ritual. Jesus simply said: "Begone" and the demons immediately left the men. (Matthew 8:28) As clearly illustrated by this text, Jesus and His apostles practiced authertic exorcisms not sensational ritualism.

4. The New Testament teaches that the exorcism of demons by Jesus and His apostles showed the power of Jesus over Satan. Jesus emphasized this power when the Pharisees accused Him of casting out demons by Beelzebul which was another name for Satan. (Matthew 12:24) After He exposed the foolishness of this accusation, Jesus said: "-If cast out demons by the Spirit of God, then the Kingdom of God has come upon you." (Matthew 12:24-28)

Jesus exorcised demons from people "-by the Spirit of God-" which proved that He was the promised Messiah of the Kingdom of God. And as the promised Messiah, He had power and authority over Satan and his kingdom. Jesus then enforced this truth by saying: "Or how can anyone enter the strong man's house and carry off his property, unless he first binds the strong man? And then he will plunder his house." (verse 29)

When Jesus and His apostles exorcised demons from people, they "bound" Satan. His power was overcome by the power of God. Satan then was a conquered enemy who would be thoroughly defeated by the sacrificial death and glorious resurrection of Jesus Christ.

From these four New Testament facts, the most obvious conclusion is that demon possession was strictly a first century phenomenon. But this conclusion must not be allowed to obscure another New Testament truth. This truth is that Satan is not dead! While he can no longer possess people, he can and does tempt people, seeking their destruction. (I Peter 5:8) For this reason, people must have an obedient faith in Jesus Christ who overcome the power of Satan and who gives His disciples the power to resist him.
