Kelton Inducts 2 Students Into Nat'l Honor Society

Two students from Kelton High School were inducted into membership of the National Honor Society in an evening ceremony at the high school yesterday.

Members were selected by a faculty council for meeting high standards of scholarship, service, leadership, and character.

Students inducted were: Brandon Lewis and J. W. Ray.

"National Honor Society members are expected to continue their exemplary contrubutions to the school and community." said Sylvia Reames, chapter adviser.

The National Honor Society ranks as one of the oldest and most prestigious national organizations for high school students. Chapters exist in three-fourths of the nation's high schools, Thousands of dollars in scholarships have been awarded to senior members since 1945 by the sponsoring organization, the National Association of Secondary School Principals.

Students Should Apply Now For Scholarships

March 1, 1993, is the deadline for applying for scholarships from the Sybil B. Harrington Merit Scholarship fund. Applications for the funds must reach the Amarillo College foundation office no later than the March 1 deadline. Students applying will be eligible for up to \$3,500 in tuition, fees and book costs. the fund was established in late 1989 through the Amarillo College foundation by Sybil Harrington.

Those eligible for the scholarship funds include graduating seniors from any high school in the 26 northern counties of the Panhandle of Texas; students graduating from Amarillo College; U.S. citizens and the applicant must enroll in 12 semester hours at the college of their choice. Scholarships are awarded for one year only, but can be renewed if the student maintains a 3.0 grade point average. Eighty percent of the funds will be awarded for students to attend any accredited institution in Texas. Ten percent of the funds will be awarded for students planning to attend Amarillo College and 10 percent will be awarded to graduating Amarillo College students to attend any accredited institution in Texas. Application forms are available through high school counselors and principals or through the Amarillo College foundation office.

PROPER CARE OF KNITS.

SWEATERS AND BLOUSES MEAN LONGER WEAR

Turn knits, sweaters and printed tshirts inside out to help prevent pilling and to protect the print. to prevent damage to spandex or polypropylene fabrics, avoid chlorine bleach, dryerdrying and ironing. Garments made from these fabrics should be handwashed or machine washed using a delicate cycle and detergent, as recommended on the care label.

After handwashing sweaters and blouses, place them in the washing machine on the spin cycle for about one minute. The spin helps remove the water and reduces the drying time. Spread the garment on a clean, flat surface to dry. Use plactic hangers for air drying damp blouses. Always line dry or dry flat away from the heat and sun.

From The Minister's Desk:

A former college classmate of mine, Gary Beauchamp, recently wrote a thought-provoking article about Christmas. The title of this article was: "What About Christmas" and it said: - - -

"For years I have heard controversial discussions over Christmas-to celebrate or not to celebrate seems to be the question. Perhaps a historical picture would clear the matter."

"The early Christians did not know when Jesus was born. For the first century church, no special date was observed. In the second century a controversy arose over the reality of the human, Christ. With all good intentions, some Christians began celebrating a feast day on January 6 as the baptismal date of Jesus to prove that Jesus was only a divine spirit. To counteract this false practice, other Christians began to celebrate on January 6 and later on December 25 the coming into the world of the divine spirit as a physical entry-thus Jesus' birthday. This historical connection was apparently very important to Christians to confirm the teaching of Paul in Phil. 2:7 that 'Christ Jesus-emptied Himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in the likeness of men."

"All in all, the Christmas season is a special time of reflection; however, in view of Jesus' position of power, we must also remember in Gal. 4:10-11 Paul chided the Galatians not to establish 'Special Days' for religious observance. Paul was warning the Galatians, we must never lose sight of the appropriate celebration for the church-every Sunday is the Lord's Day when we remember His sacrifice, His cross,

His death, His triumphal resurrection to assure our salvation. This is the Gospel and the Good news is joy.

"I must say quickly, however, that the historical necessity for a day to remind the world of the coming of Christ fills a contemporary need today. The world must be told Jesus is not a figment of imagination, a ghost, a historical misnomer-He lived! He lives today."

"His coming brings to this time of the year stouter smiles, kinder hearts, nearness and dearness to loved ones, happy children, thoughtful consideration, pure unselfish giving and a special nature of love abounding from heart to heart. 



NOTICE OF RATE CHANGE REQUEST AND STATEMENT OF INTENT

Notice is hereby given that North Plains Electric Cooperative, Inc. (the "Utility") intends to change rates for electric utility service effective March 9, 1993, or as soon thereafter as may be permitted by law. The Utility has not had a rate increase since 1983. Based upon a test year ending December 31, 1991, the increase requested over actual test year revenues is \$369,472 or 4.67%. The changes are applicable to all areas, all customer classes, and all customers served by the Utility.

The Utility proposes to change all rates for residential, irrigation, small commercial, large commercial, including demand, energy, minimum and other charges. The proposed changes are expected to affect the classes as follows: for the 2,997 customers in the general service 1-phase class, the proposed increase will be \$75,178 or a 3.50% change in revenues; for the 357 customers in the general service 3-phase class, the proposed increase will be \$15,183 or a 3.50% change in revenues; for the 70 customers in the irrigation class the proposed increase will be \$15,252 or a 4.97% change in revenues; for the 419 customers in the sprinklers and tailwater pump class, the proposed increase will be \$20,200 or a 10.00% change in revenues; for the 120 customers in the large power class, the proposed increase will be \$103,661 or a 3.50% change in revenues; for the 9 customers in the Perryton water works class, the proposed increase will be \$4,889 or a 6.18% change in revenues; for the 961 customers in the oil well pumping class, the proposed increase will be \$129,944 or a 7.71% change in revenues; and for the 190 customers in the lighting class the proposed increase will be \$5,165 or a 7.28% change in revenues.

These are some things that a farmer could do: First of all, notify SCS & ASCA on all of the farmland that is own or lease. Notify SCS if you don't understand the contents in your plan. Begin to complete all practices which is scheduled in the plan.



Grass seeding was planned for extremely sandy soil or on lovegrass pastures that had frozen out. Annual high residue crops are allowed for two years prior to planting grass. Surface roughening/Emergency tillage is included in all plans in the event that insufficient residues are present to control wind erosion.

Each producer is responsible for following his or her plan. Random spot checks are conducted each year to verify compliance. If you have questions concerning your plan or any aspect of the plan, contact your SCS office.


