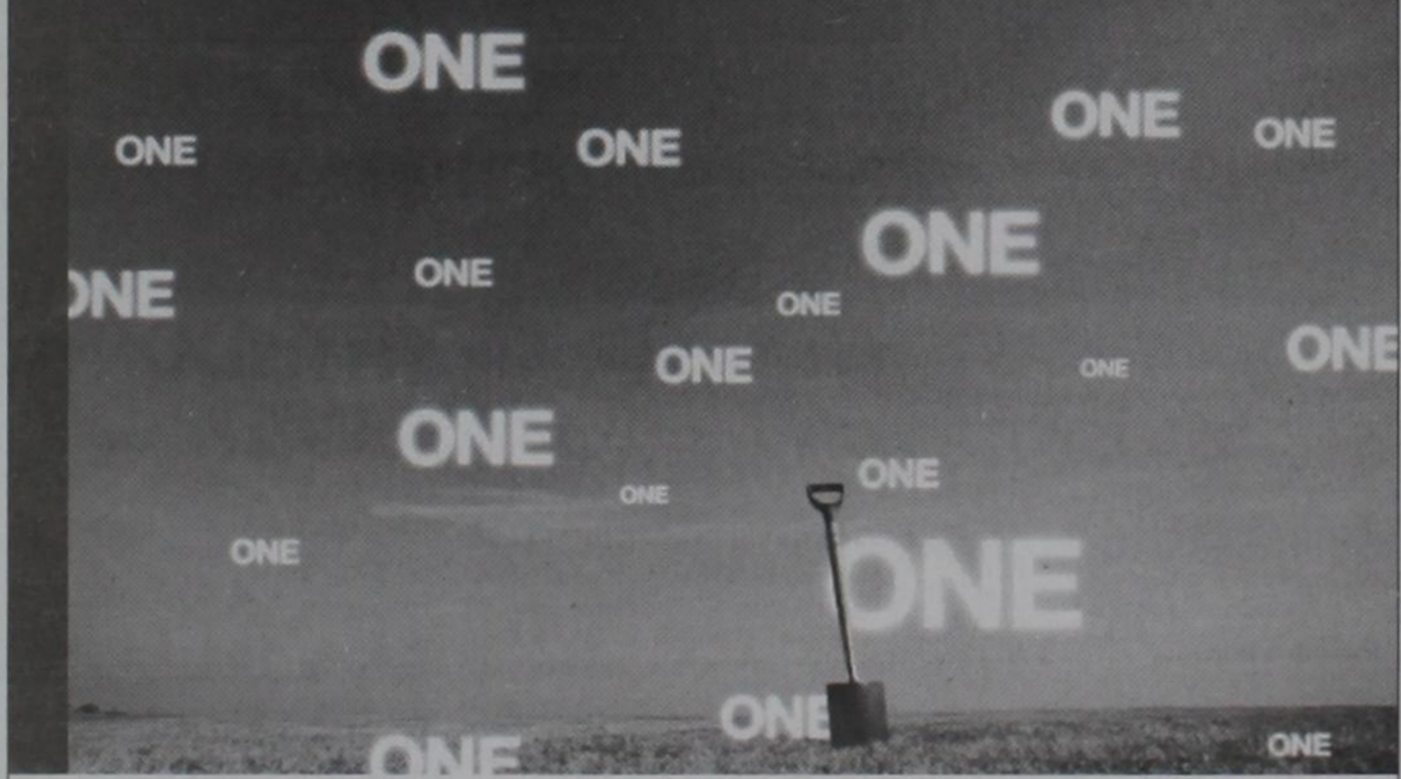

OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

LUMBERJACK BOOTS And PORCH JUMPING

At about nine or ten years old, I got to thinking that I might like to become a lumberjack. I'd seen some picture shows with those men all dressed-up in their plaid shirts, Mackinaw jackets, and lumberjack boots. Seems like, a lot of the time they had their pant legs rolled up a little; probably to show-off those boots. I could imagine myself putting those spike things on my boots, climbing the trees, swinging my axe and using that crosscut saw with my working partner. Yep, that's just what I wanted to be.

I wanted to get started on this future career so, I let my folks know how much I wanted some boots like those guys had. Mom and Dad agreed to get me a pair for Christmas, or my birthday. I don't remember which. Meanwhile, Mom got out our Sears and Roebuck catalog and one called, Spiegel. She told me to look through them to see if I could find what I was wanting. What I found even exceeded my expectations! Not only did they have them, they even had a knife scabbard on the outside of each boot. I only had one knife, but figured I could use the other one to carry chewing gum or maybe a stick of licorice.

Well, they got me the boots. These boots went almost up to my knees and must have had forty eyelets that I had to lace up every time I put them on. It was a little less work when pulling them off, but still a good bit of trouble. Also, after wearing them laced up tight all day, every day, for a few weeks, they started to smell, bad!

You know, being a lumberjack isn't all it's cracked up to be. As time went on, I got to wearing them less and less. Eventually, Dad bought me a pair of cowboy boots for fifty cents at a farm sale, and I pretty much retired the lumberjack boots. My only regret was that I never got any of those spikes that I strap on 'em, so I could climb trees faster.

One of my favorite pastimes at that age, was "porch jumping." Actually, this just involved running upstairs, going through a door that opened out to the roof top of the front porch. I'd sit down on the top edge of the porch and kind-of shove off and land on my feet in the front yard. When I had company, we'd always treat ourselves to some "porch-jumping."

Use Your Crib Safely For infants under 12 months of age, follow these practices to reduce the risk of SIDS (sudden infant death syndrome) and prevent suffocation: Place baby on his/her back in a crib with a firm, tight-fitting mattress. (Do not put pillows, quilts, comforters, sheepskins, pillow-like bumper pads or pillow-like stuffed toys in the crib. (Consider using a sleeper instead of a blanket. (If you do use a blanket, place baby with feet to foot of the crib. Tuck a thin blanket around the crib mattress, covering baby only as high as his/her chest. (Use only a fitted bottom sheet specifically made for crib use. Check Your Crib for Safety: There should be: (A firm, tight-fitting mattress so a baby cannot get trapped between the mattress and the crib. (Cris that are assembled wrong, have missing, loose or broken hardware or broken slats can result in entrapment or suffocation deaths. Infants can strangle when their head and neck become entrapped in gaps created by missing, loose or broken hardware or broken slats. (No missing, loose, broken or improperly installed screws, brackets or other hardware on the crib or mattress support. (No more than 2 3/8 inches (about the width of a soda can) between crib slats so a baby's body cannot fit through the slats; no missing or cracked slats. (No corner posts over 1/16th inch high so a baby's clothing cannot catch. ((No cutouts in the headboard or foot board so a baby's head cannot get trapped. For mesh-sided cribs or playpens, look for: (Mesh less than 1/4 inch in size, smaller than the tiny buttons on a baby's clothing. (Mesh with no tears, holes or loose threads that could entangle a baby. (Mesh securely attached to top rail and floor plate. (Top rail cover with no tears or holes. (If staples are used, they are not missing, loose or expos-ed.



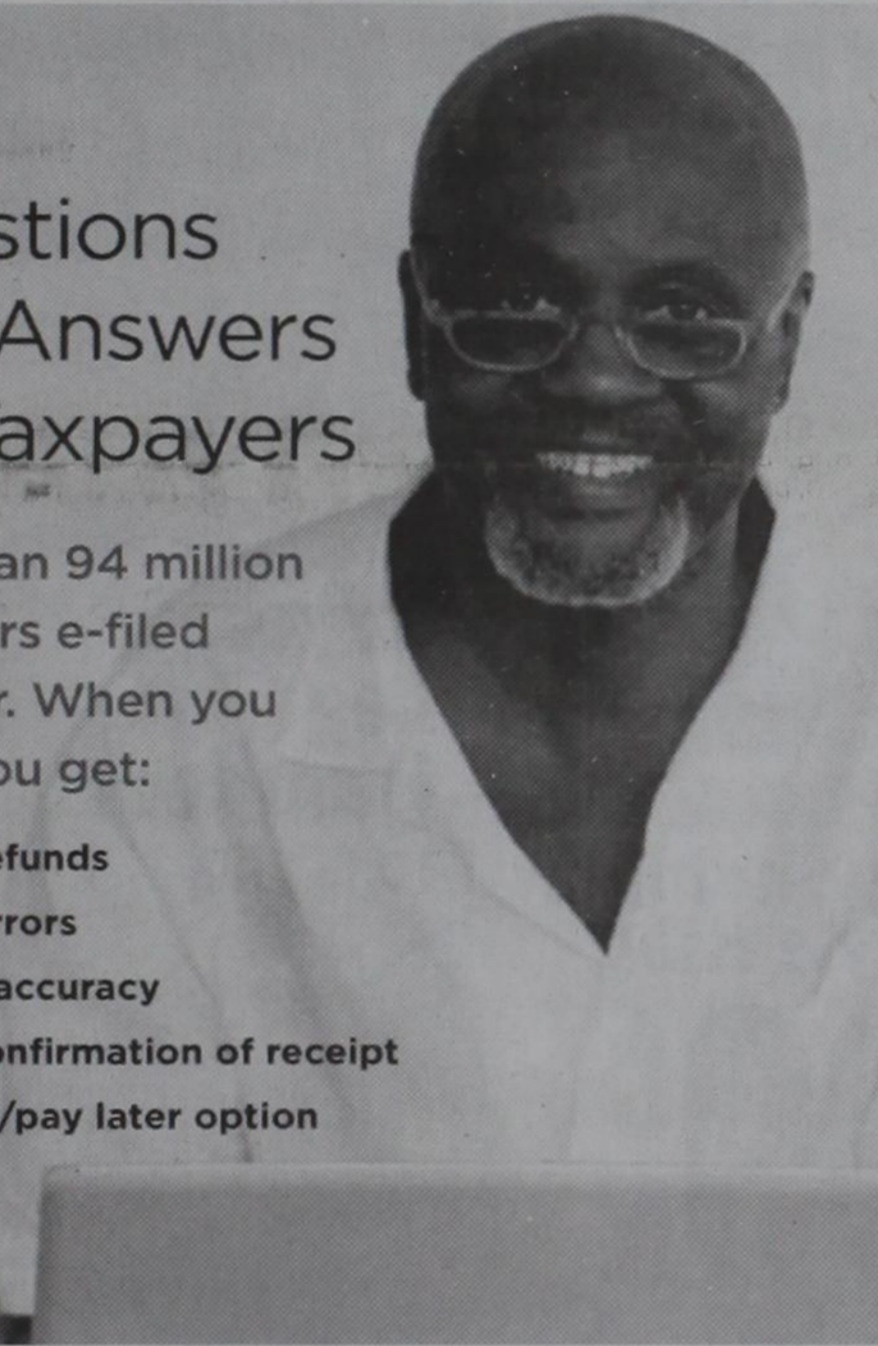

A variety of homestead exemptions could lower your property taxes!

A homestead exemption the property owner on your 1 by lowering its taxable value. If your home is valued at \$5 and you receive a \$15,000 homestead exemption, your homestead tax would be \$35,000.


Who qualifies for an exemption?
Anyone who owns a home on Jan. 1 and uses it as a primary residence on that date is entitled to a \$15,000 homestead exemption to lower school taxes this year...and it doesn't matter if you live in a house, condominium or mobile home. Counties, cities, special taxing districts may also offer homestead exemption.

Are other exemptions available?
If you're disabled—or if you're 65 years old or older—you're entitled to an additional \$10,000 school tax exemption on your home. And if you qualify for the 65 or older or disabled exemption, you're also entitled to a permanent, locked-in "ceiling" on the school property taxes on your home. (The county, city or college may adopt a tax ceiling to lock in 2010 taxes as the best amount for 65 and older or disabled homeowners.) The 65 or older homeowners school tax ceiling transfers to the surviving spouse, if the spouse is 55 years of age or older at the time of death and lives in and owns the home. The age 65 or older homeowners (or their surviving spouses 55 years of age or older) may transfer the percentage of school tax paid, based on former home's school tax ceiling, to a new home.

If you're a disabled veteran who receives from the Veterans Affairs (VA)—(1) 100 percent disability compensation due to a service-connected disability and (2) a rating of 100 percent disability determination of individual unemployability, you are entitled to an exemption from taxation of the total appraised value of your homestead. A surviving spouse does not qualify.

Do I have to apply each year?
No. If you had a homestead exemption on your home in 2009, you won't need to reapply for 2010 unless your chief appraiser requires it. However, if you haven't received an exemption on your present home—or if you've moved to a new home—you'll need to file for an exemption for 2010. If you are 65 this year, you may file for the age 65 or older exemption up to one year after the year you turned 65. And if you became disabled, you need to file for the disabled person's exemption.

When and where should I file?

"Productivity appraisal" may lower the property taxes on your farm, ranch or timberland!

Texas law allows farmers, ranchers and timber growers to pay property taxes based upon the "productivity value" of their land rather than on market value. This means qualified land is taxed based on its ability to produce crops, livestock or timber—not on its value on the real estate market. And it can mean substantial property tax savings.

When is the application deadline?
If your land has never had a productivity appraisal or you are a new owner, you must apply to your local appraisal district by April 30 to take advantage of this benefit on your 2010 property taxes. You may get up to 60 extra days if you have a good reason and ask for it by April 30. If you miss this deadline, you may still be able to apply, but you will pay a penalty. Check with your appraisal district office.

Do you need to reapply annually?
If your land already receives agricultural or timber productivity appraisal, you normally don't need to reapply unless the chief appraiser requires you to do so. If a new application is required, the appraisal district will notify you by mail.

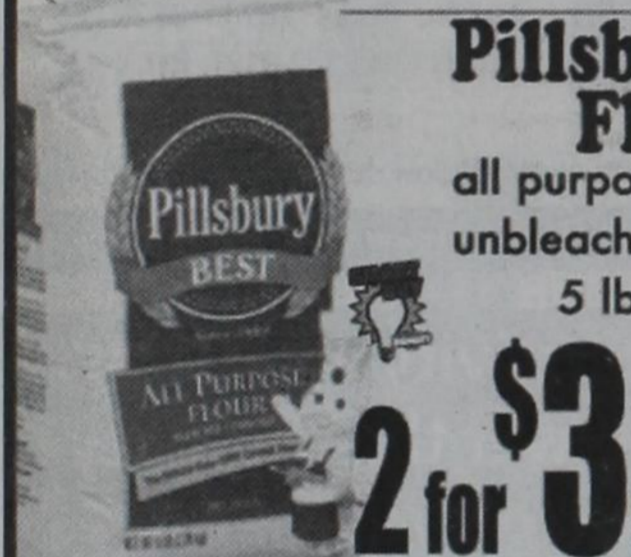

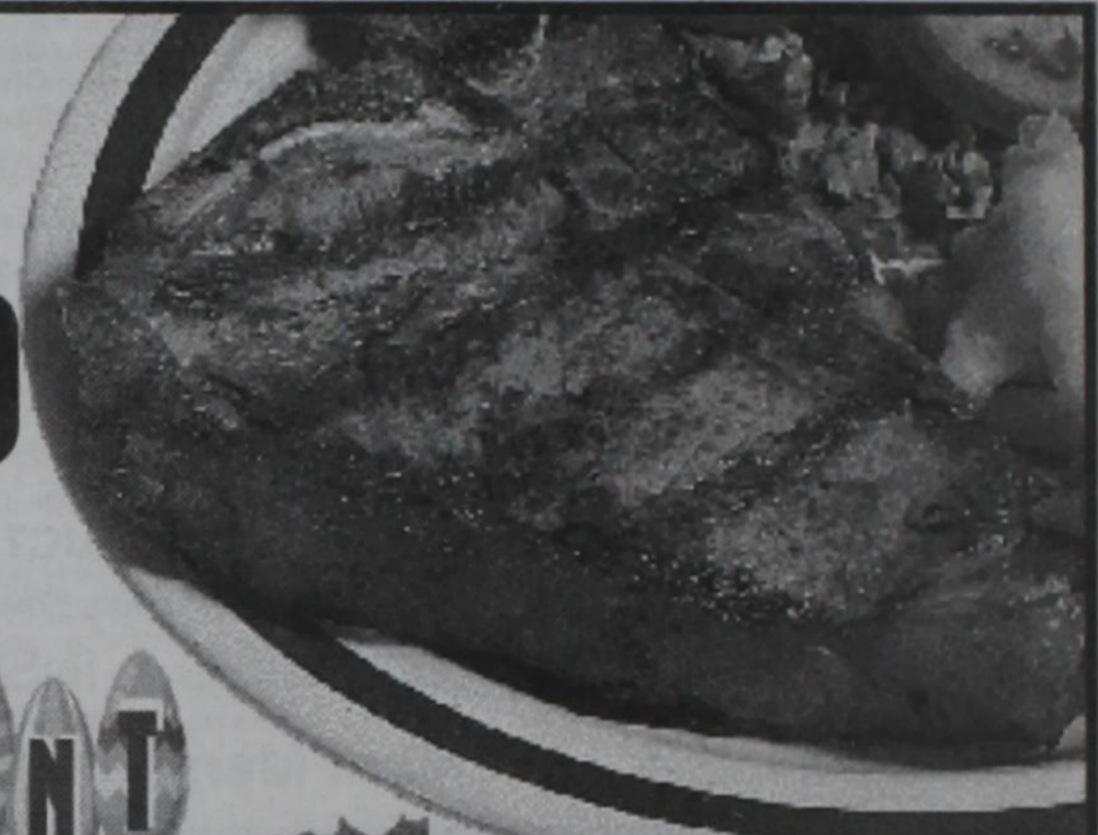
