How the procedure was conducted:

a) Make a ramp by propping one end of the board on a stack of books at least 18" high. Measure and record the height of the ramp. Place the low end of the ramp about 12" away from a wall or the solid object. You may want to perform this experiment outside. b) Place an egg in the toy truck. Try to keep the egg as loose as

c) Place the truck at the top of the ramp and let it go. What happens to the egg when the truck hits the wall? Record your observa-

d) Add a book to make the ramp steeper. Measure and record the new height of the ramp. Place another loose egg in the truck and try again. Now what happens?

e) Next, use tape to make a secure "seat belt" to hold your egg inside the truck. Repeat the experiment at each of your previous ramp heights. Record the results.

f) What does this experiment show you about wearing a seat




The Fourth Grade's Scientific Process Poster.



#### **BAD LUCK CHICKENS**

liked guns all my life; especially was a "Daisy Red Ryder," BB gun, with a saddle ring on the side. Finally, I had a genuine, lever-acabout it, I suppose they all had that ring on the side. Every night, before I went to bed, I'd stand it up in the corner of my bedroom and just look at it for a while. It sure added a fine touch to the décor of my room. I suppose that at one time or another, just about every kid has had a "Daisy Red Ryder" and had the same feelings. Kind of a step up, in growing up.

I believe that it was for my ninth birthday, when my folks bought me a "Stevens" single-shot .22 rifle. Dad had already taught me gun safety with the BB gun, but he went through the whole thing again, plus.... He said, "This rifle is more powerful, shoots farther, and is more dangerous than the BB gun." I paid close attention to what he said, because I knew if I "flubbed-up" I might not get to keep it, and I didn't want to risk

Finding a good variety of targets was a constant challenge. Some of my favorites were, black walnuts, tin cans, gourds, sparrows, and crows. One day I got to noticing mom's clothespins were still hanging on the line. This was a challenge that just had to be met, so after making sure she wasn't looking, I took dead-aim and shot one of them. Hot dog! It spun round and round really fast. I was sure glad she left them out for me to shoot at. I tried another one. This time, I hit the spring and the whole clothes pin exploded!

Just a few days later, mom went to hang out some clothes and she found most of her clothespins either had a hole in them, or were in pieces on the ground. She wasn't all that proud of my shooting skills and seemed to be a little put-out with me. In fact, she wouldn't even let me touch my .22 for about a week.

Having learned that clothes pins were off limits in target practice, I started looking for something else that would work. Later on, for some reason, I shot real close to one of our chickens. It jumped straight up and squawked! Well, that kind of struck my funny bone, so I started doing it a lot. Sure enough, every time I shot close to their feet. they'd jump up and squawk. This had become good sport, but like all games go, you'll eventually have an off-day...

As luck would have it, my day came real soon. Repeating my practice, I took aim right between an old hen's feet and shot . But, instead of jumping up and squawking like all the others did, she fell over dead! It appeared like I had shot too low and the bullet hit the ground, ricocheted up and got her. After giving it a full two or three seconds of thought... I grabbed her up, got a shovel and





A "rendition" is a report to your county appraisal district that lists all the taxable property you owned or controlled on Jan. 1 of this year.

#### Who must file a rendition?

You must file a rendition if you own tangible personal property that is used to produce income-such as the inventory and equipment used by a business. If you render late, don't render or file an incomplete or false rendition, a 10 percent to 50 percent penalty may be imposed.

#### Are there any advantages to you?

The advantages of filing a rendition are:

- You give your opinion of your property's value. The appraisal district must notify you in writing of any value change and explain how you can protest that value to the appraisal review board.
- You record your correct mailing address so your tax bills will go to the right address. If your bill is mailed to the wrong address, the law still holds you responsible for paying your taxes on time or paying extra charges for late payments.
- You can also file a "report of decreased value" to notify the appraisal district of significant depreciation of the value of your property in 2009. The district will look at your property before assigning a value in 2010.

#### What's the deadline?

The last day for filing 2010 renditions is April 15. You can get an automatic extension to May 15 (or the next business day if a weekend) if you ask for it in writing on or before the April 15 deadline. The chief appraiser may grant an additional 15 days after May 15 for an owner who shows good cause in writing.




