Chairman Thomas Helton called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Board Room at Parkview Hospital. Present were: Thomas Helton, Chairman, Ray Hudson, Dale Garner. Absent: Sue Chandler, Vice Chairman, James Batton, Secretary. Also present: Ann Fagan Cook, RN, BSN, CEO, Sue Stiles, RN, BSN, CNO, John P. Lavelle, M.D. Chief of Staff and ER Director, Glenda Hudson, G & R Services.

Dale Garner made a motion to accept the consent agenda. Ray Hudson seconded the motion. There was some discussion regarding statistics. Motion carried unanimously.

Ann Fagan Cook presented the Investment Report. We have three CDs at Wheeler Banking Center which mature on March 2, 2010. Ms. Fagan Cook presented current rates for jumbo CDs to the

Board. Dale Garner made a motion to reinvest these at the First State Bank for 60 months. Ray Hudson seconded the motion and there was much discussion. Question was called and the motion passed unanimously as presented.

There was no bad debt or charity write-off this month.

QAPI minutes and scorecards were presented and reviewed. Ray Hudson made a motion to accept these reports. Dale Garner seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Dale Garner made a motion to call for the election of two directors, one from Kelton and one from Wheeler, on Saturday, May 8, 2010 to be held in conjunction with the General Election. Motion carried unanimously.

Glenda Hudson presented a contract and policies and procedures for doing random drug screens on all employees of Parkview Hospital, Parkview Assisted Living, Ambulance Service and Parkview Home Health. The contract had been approved in the past and the consensus was to proceed with implementing the policies and procedures.

Ms. Fagan Cook reported that three of the dining room chairs in Assisted Living have been broken, and also requested that we replace the drapes in assisted living. Ray Hudson made a motion to replace all eight (8) of the chairs but not to purchase any drapes at this time. Dale Garner seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

There was no new business and the meeting adjourned at 7:15 p.m.

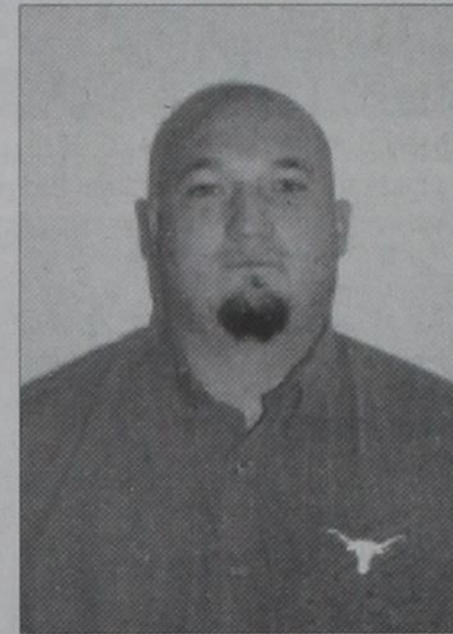

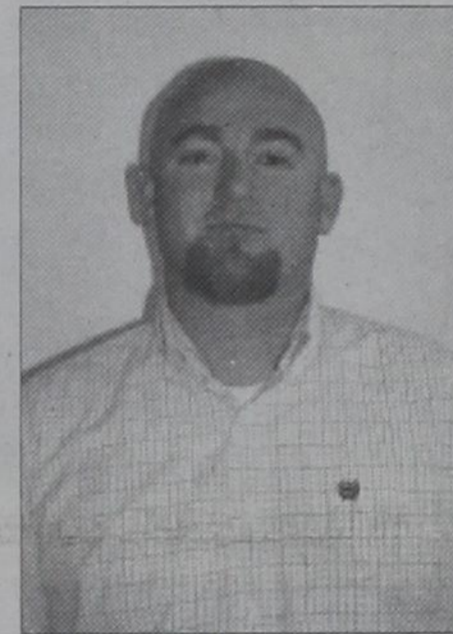

Mr. Herndon's Fourth Grade Class has been learning about motion, acceleration, sudden stops, force, and speed. The experiment that was conducted also demonstrated the importance of wearing a seat belt.

How the procedure was conducted:

a) Make a ramp by propping one end of the board on a stack of books at least 18" high. Measure and record the height of the ramp. Place the low end of the ramp about 12" away from a wall or the solid object. You may want to perform this experiment outside.

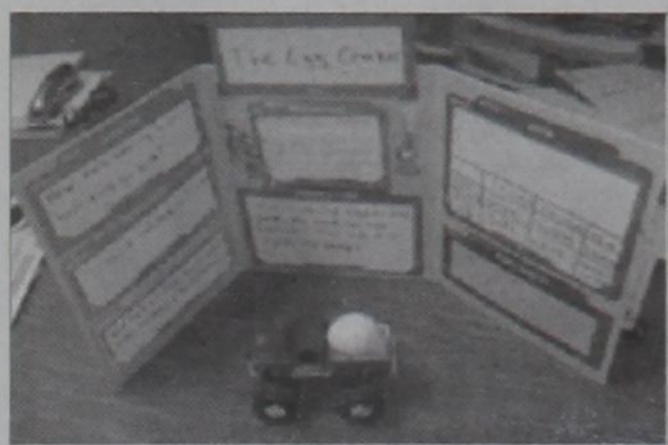
b) Place an egg in the toy truck. Try to keep the egg as loose as possible.

c) Place the truck at the top of the ramp and let it go. What happens to the egg when the truck hits the wall? Record your observations.

d) Add a book to make the ramp steeper. Measure and record the new height of the ramp. Place another loose egg in the truck and try again. Now what happens?

e) Next, use tape to make a secure "seat belt" to hold your egg inside the truck. Repeat the experiment at each of your previous ramp heights. Record the results.

f) What does this experiment show you about wearing a seat belt?

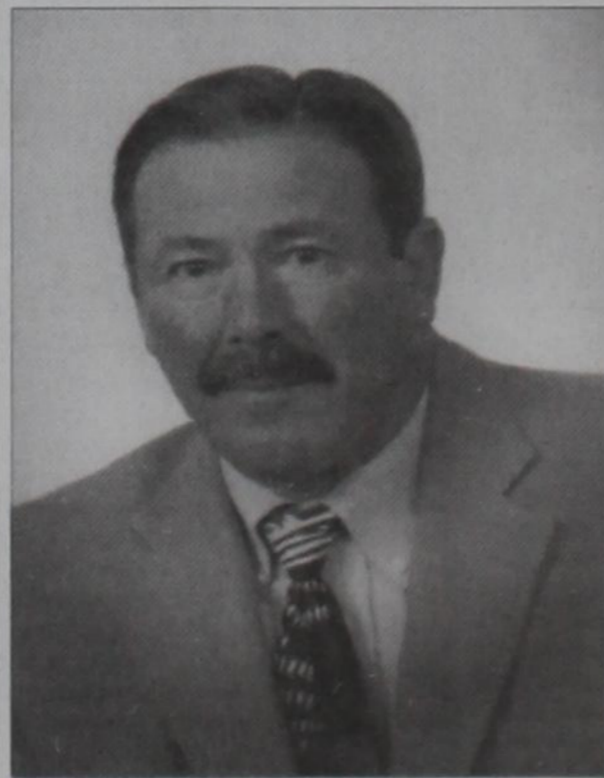

## BAD LUCK CHICKENS

As most of my friends know, I've liked guns all my life; especially rifles. The very first one that I got was a "Daisy Red Ryder," BB gun, with a saddle ring on the side. Finally, I had a genuine, lever-action, cowboy rifle. Come to think about it, I suppose they all had that ring on the side. Every night, before I went to bed, I'd stand it up in the corner of my bedroom and just look at it for a while. It sure added a fine touch to the décor of my room. I suppose that at one time or another, just about every kid has had a "Daisy Red Ryder" and had the same feelings. Kind of a step up, in growing up.

I believe that it was for my ninth birthday, when my folks bought me a "Stevens" single-shot .22 rifle. Dad had already taught me gun safety with the BB gun, but he went through the whole thing again, plus... He said, "This rifle is more powerful, shoots farther, and is more dangerous than the BB gun." I paid close attention to what he said, because I knew if I "flubbed-up" I might not get to keep it, and I didn't want to risk that.

She wasn't all that proud of my shooting skills and seemed to be a little put-out with me. In fact, she wouldn't even let me touch my .22 for about a week.

Having learned that clothes pins were off limits in target practice, I started looking for something else that would work. Later on, for some reason, I shot real close to one of our chickens. Oh well, the chickens were probably needing some relief from all that stress anyway. I wouldn't even be surprised if our egg production went up some.... Now, that would make mom, happy!

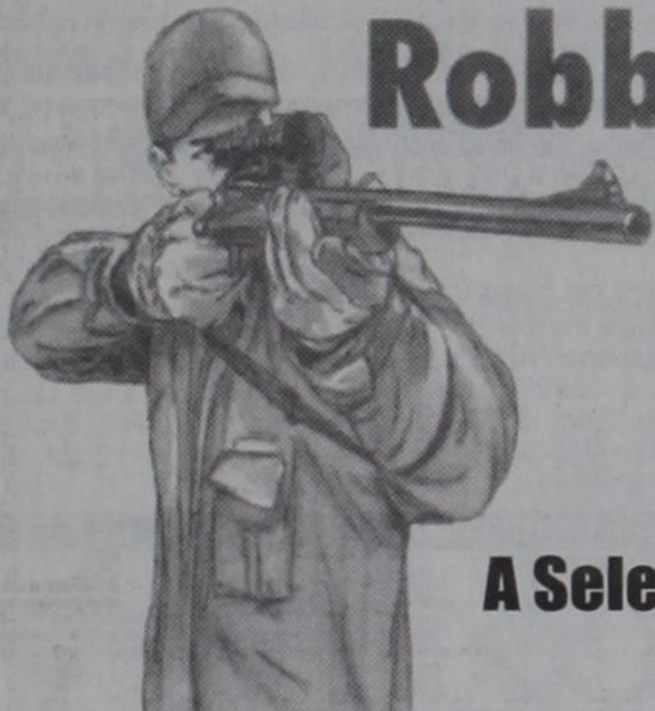

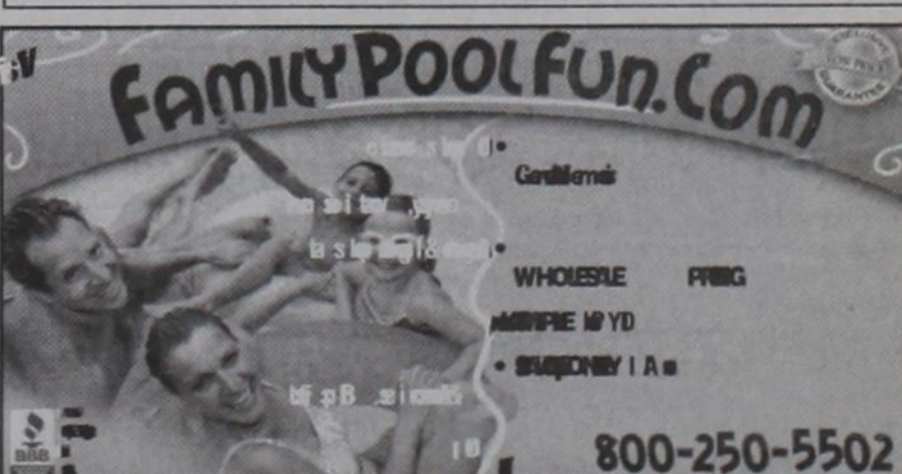

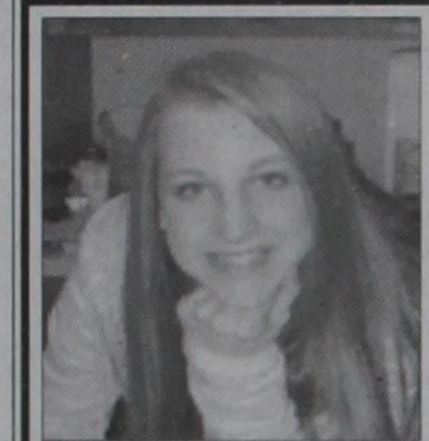

## Don't get hit with a penalty! "Render" your taxable property by April 15.

A "rendition" is a report to your county appraisal district that lists all the taxable property you owned or controlled on Jan. 1 of this year.

### Who must file a rendition?

You must file a rendition if you own tangible personal property that is used to produce income—such as the inventory and equipment used by a business. If you render late, don't render or file an incomplete or false rendition, a 10 percent to 50 percent penalty may be imposed.

### Are there any advantages to you?

The advantages of filing a rendition are:

- You give your opinion of your property's value. The appraisal district must notify you in writing of any value change and explain how you can protest that value to the appraisal review board.
- You record your correct mailing address so your tax bills will go to the right address. If your bill is mailed to the wrong address, the law still holds you responsible for paying your taxes on time or paying extra charges for late payments.
- You can also file a "report of decreased value" to notify the appraisal district of significant depreciation of the value of your property in 2009. The district will look at your property before assigning a value in 2010.

### What's the deadline?

The last day for filing 2010 renditions is April 15. You can get an automatic extension to May 15 (or the next business day if a weekend) if you ask for it in writing on or before the April 15 deadline. The chief appraiser may grant an additional 15 days after May 15 for an owner who shows good cause in writing.

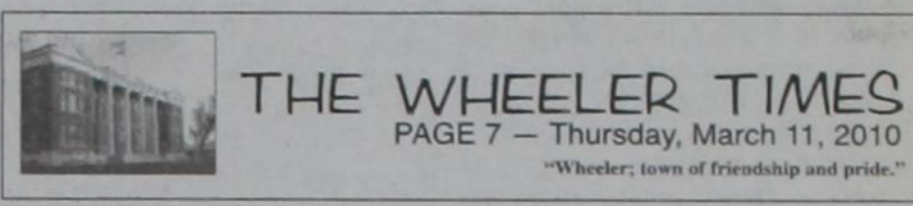

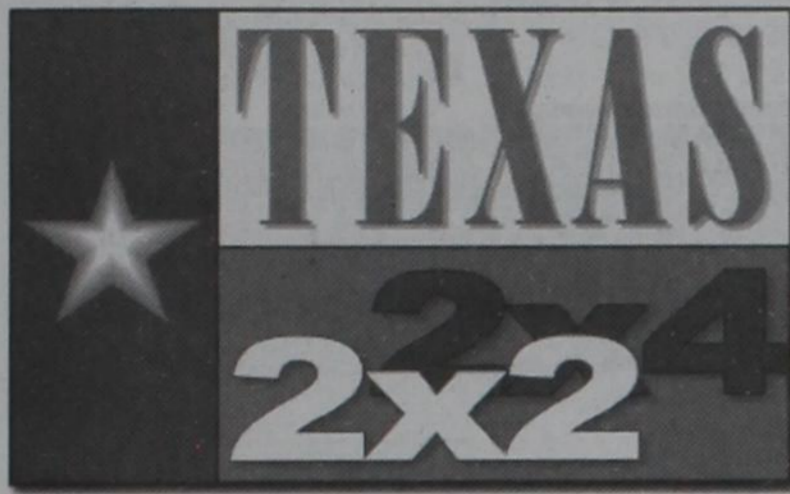

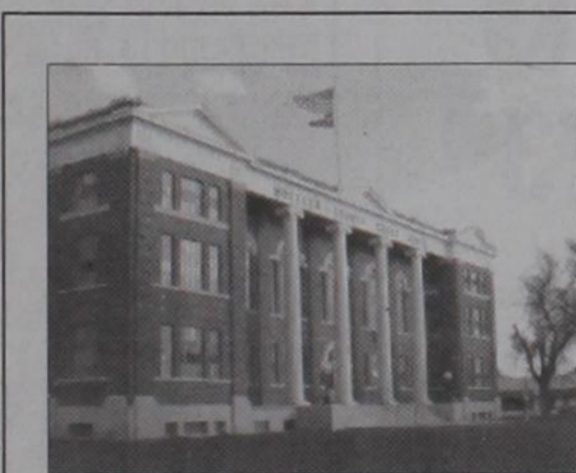
