one in trouble. Yes, we were able to drive home but did have damage to the undercarriage of the pickup, the bumper, flash guard, exhaust and tie rods, as well as the major clean up. (What if this had been after dark or a young person who did not mind playing in the mud and was going faster).

P.S. While waiting for Matt to arrive we noticed there are not bar ditches for the water to run off this road, therefore, it can do nothing but build up and why the bolder rocks were there, we do not understand. This is very dangerous and someone is going to get hurt if this is not addressed.
