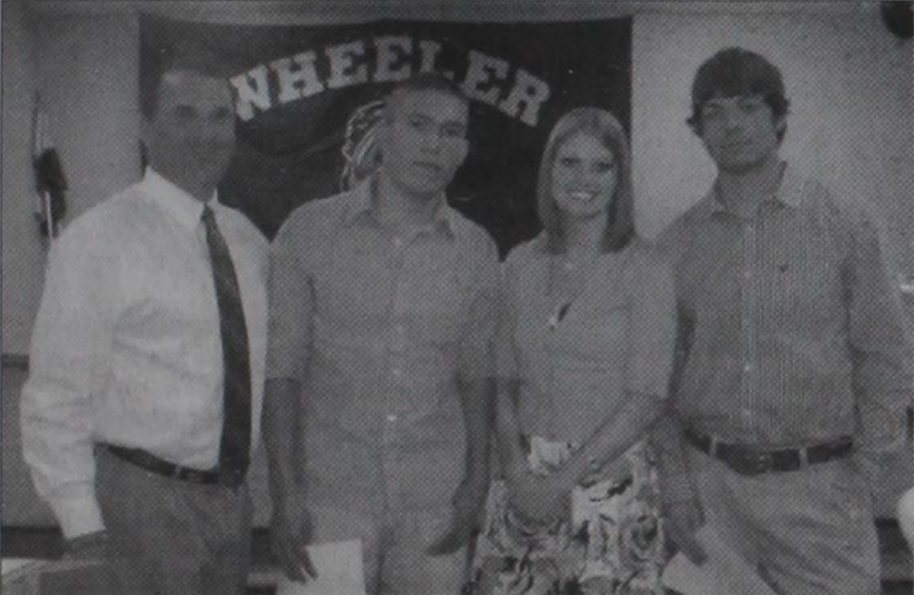

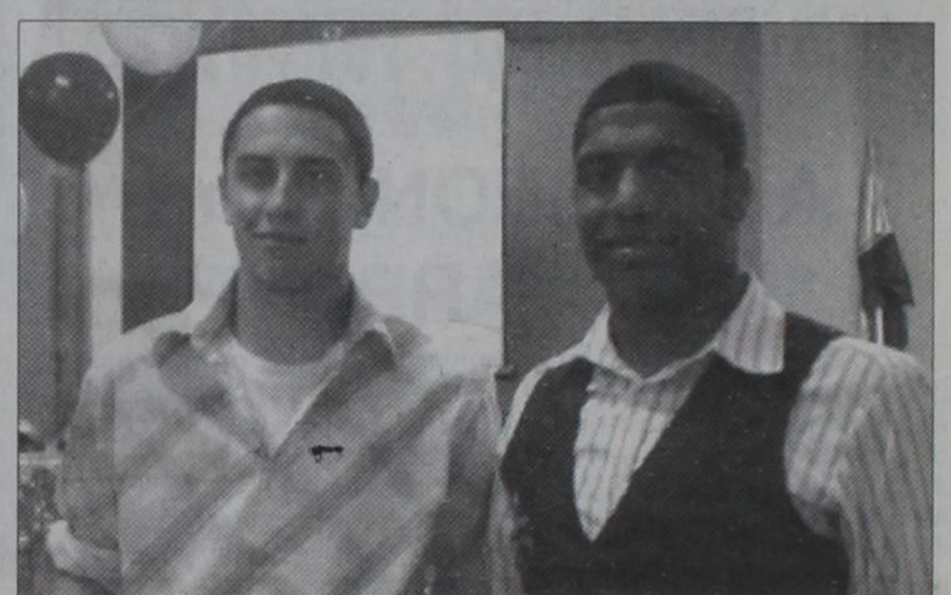

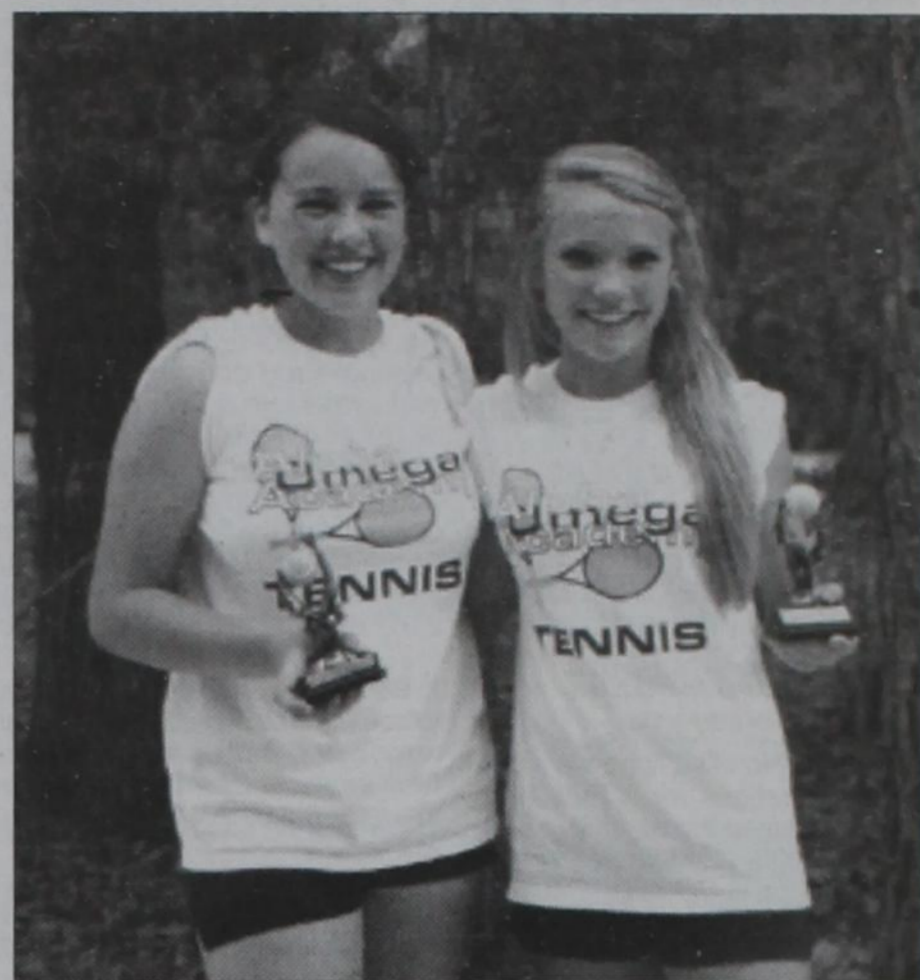
Ms. Fagan Cook reported that the electronic medical record system is now live for the outpatient departments. Estimate for "go live" for inpatient is June 15, 2010.

Chairman Helton asked if there was any new business. Dr. Lavelle led a discussion regarding building a new hospital. Consensus was this was not feasible at this time.

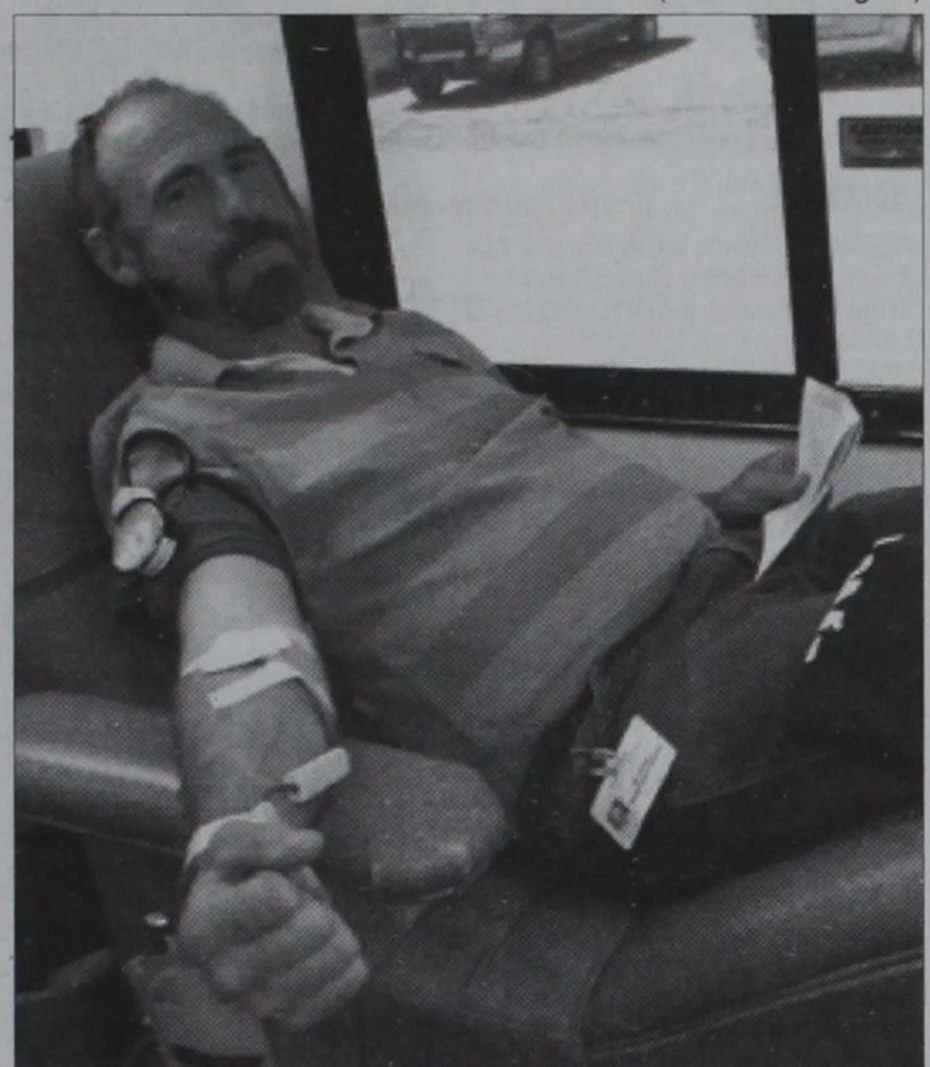

The burn ban was considered; if no rain is received by the end of the week, the court may consider re-instating the burn ban.

Leroy Huebner with Micle Investments met with the court to request the court's help in cleaning up the trash, and other environmental problems in Lela. The court told Huebner they would help in any way they could; but there is no action they can take at the present time.

Harrison Hall asked the court to look into doing some dirt work on "Thrill Hill" to eliminate the problem. He is aware there is no quick solution to the problem, but ask the court to look into taking the top off the hill and/or bring in some fill. He also wished those out for a "thrill" would travel to the end of the hill and make sure they are not meeting anyone. Harrison travels the road frequently and does not want to be on the back side of the hill when someone comes "flying" over the hump.

William Jordan, Panhandle CyberMedics met with the court to introduce himself. His company is qualified and licensed to handle any problems the county might have with their computers.

Daryl Snelgrooves, Commissioner, Pct. 1 asked the court's permission to purchase half a backhoe to share with Pct. 2. The cost is \$16,000; the money would be taken from Pct. 1's Lateral Road fund and transferred to Pct. 2's Lateral Road.

The court approved Tom Puryear's purchase of a truck for Pct. 2 at a cost of over \$5,000.

The purchase of a 35-ton lowboy trailer for Pct. 3 was approved by the court in the amount of \$14,505.00.

Hubert Moore was also given permission to purchase a 1993 International Truck for Pct. 3 in the amount of \$15,036.49.

Pct. 3 requested permission to spend over \$5,000 to trade a Cub Cadet front end loader for a newer, larger front end loader. The court agreed to the trade.

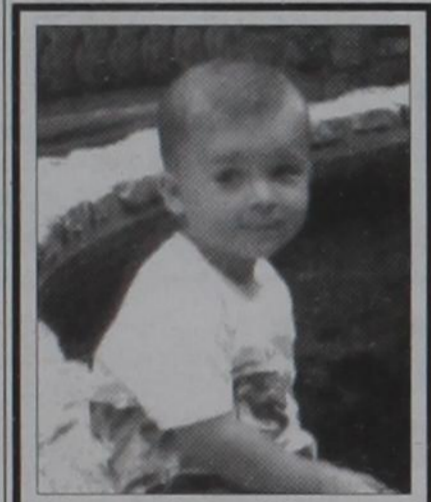
