Windbreak Trees Species Being Offered

The Wheeler County SWCD is once again offering windbreak trees to Wheeler County residents. Evergreen seedlings available this year include Afghan pine, Arborvitae, Arizona Cypress, Austrian pine, Eastern redcedar, Ponderosa pine, Scotch pine, and Spruce. The minimum order for evergreens is 30 trees for \$37.50

In addition to evergreens, there is a wide variety of bare-rooted deciduous trees. Deciduous species include Arizona ash, Bur oak, Cottonwood cuttings, Desert willow, Flameleaf sumac, Green ash, Little walnut, Osage orange, Pecan, Redbud, Red oak, and Russian olive. The minimum order for bare-rooted deciduous trees is 50 trees for \$18.75 plus tax.

Some of these trees will be in limited supply; so for the best selection, order early. Orders can be placed by contacting the Wheeler should consist of evergreens. Ever-County Soil and Water Conservation greens are the backbone of the District at 826-5640. Payment is required at the time order is placed.


