Blackeyed Peas Have Developed Into Crop

COLLEGE STATION - Black- his soft paws. eyed peas have developed into a big cash crop in West Texas.

In Dawson and surrounding counties, the 1946 crop of green field peas brought farmers an average of \$110 per ton in the hull, reports Dawson County Agricultural Agent T. A. Barfield. The blackeyed pea acreage in Dawson County alone last year was between 20,000 and 25,000 acres, Barfield says. Yields were reported to range from 400 to 2000 pounds per acre.

Commenting on the value of the peas as a cash crop the county agent states, "Our minimum at Lamesa was \$800 per ton, and competive buying boosted the top price paid to \$130 per ton. I judge that the average price paid at Lamesa in 1946 was \$100 or \$110 per ton".

The green peas have helped Dawson County farmers to restore some "much needed nitrogen" to the soil, Barfield says, as well as bringing in cash during the last two dry years that the county has had.

Large acreages were also planted to the peas in Lubbock, Lynn, Terry, Bailey and Hale counties, says Barfield, and "some fabulous yields" were reported on land under irrigation.

"Buyers seem to like the superior quality of the West Texas blackeyed peas", the county agent continues, "and they tell me that the peas have fuller pods which make them yield more cans of peas per ton.

He adds that many Dawson County farmers will be planting blackeyed peas as long as there is a market for them.

ren. I am a World War I veteran and would like to know if I can get a nonservice-connected pension?

A-If you believe you are permanently disabled, you should communicate with the Veterans Administration regional office having jurisdiction over your address and forward to that office VA Form 8-526b, together with evidence of your condition.

Q-My son was killed in World War II. He had designated his two sisters as beneficiaries of his GI insurance. One of the sisters passed away recently and and I would like to know if I have any rights to her insurance

A-If his sisters were jointly designated beneficiaries or if each sister was specificially designated contingent beneficiary of the other, then upon the death of one sister the other sister would get the share of the one who died. However, if the designation is not joint or each sister was not designated contingent beneficiary of the other, then upon the death of one of the sisters the remaining installments would be paid according to law, National Service Life Insurance Act of 1940. and you may have some rights.


