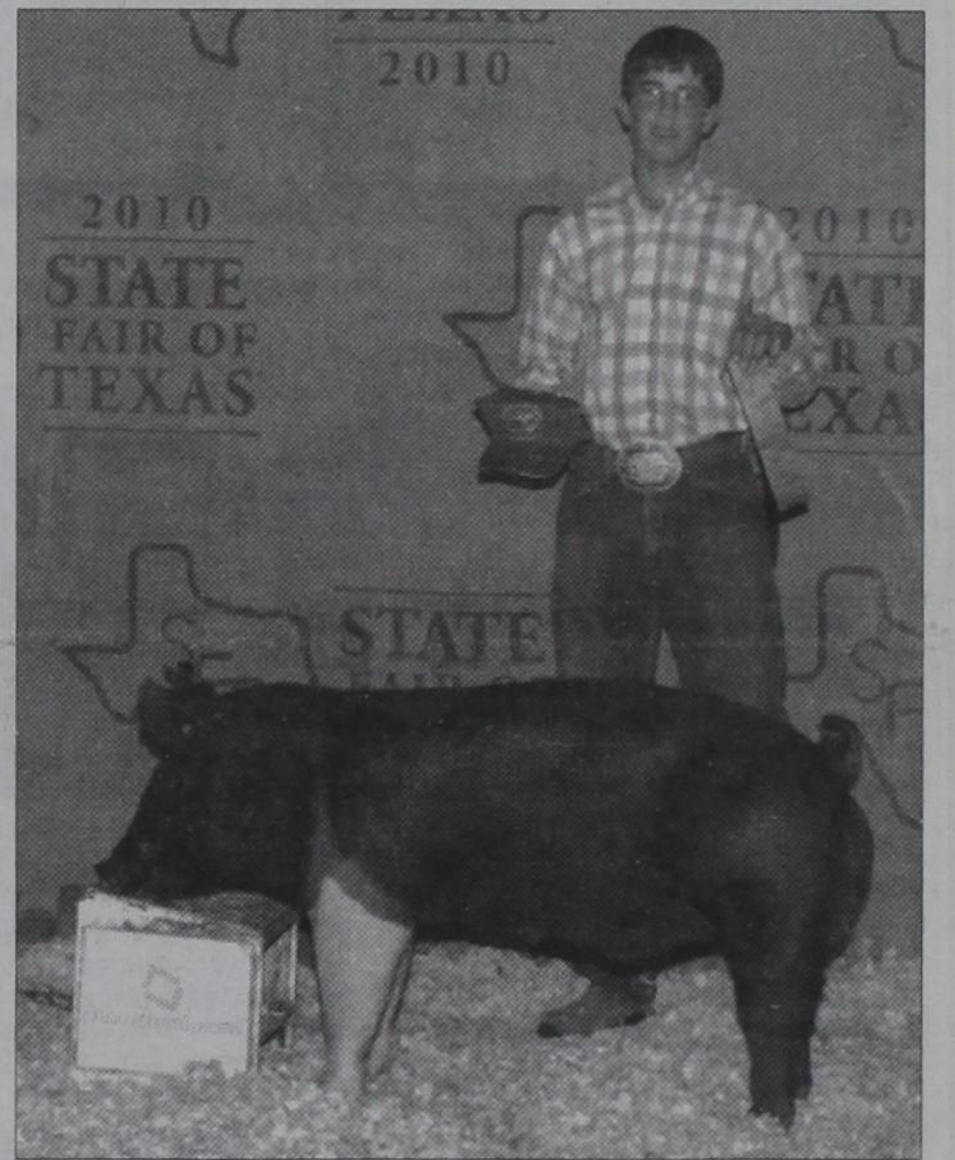

NRCS Offers Student Trainee Opportunities To Area Youth

Opening Date: October 1, 2010
Closing Date: November 15, 2010
Salary: \$11.95 to \$13.41 per hour depending on qualifications

The Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) is recruiting students to participate in our Student Career Experience Program (SCEP) starting in the summer of 2011. We plan to fill approximately 15 to 20 positions.

This program will allow students that are selected to receive on-the-job training while attending an accredited college or university. Participants are expected to work full-time during summer vacation periods each summer until graduation to prepare for a permanent position with our agency. At least two summer work periods are needed.

Students must work a minimum of 640 hours prior to graduation and must also meet the educa-

tional qualification requirements for the specialization for which they were hired as a student trainee, e.g., Agricultural Engineer, Rangeland Management Specialist, Soil Conservationist or Soil Scientist.

Upon successful completion for the program, trainees can be non-competitively converted to a professional position with the NRCS. Preferred fields of study are Agronomy, Engineering, Forestry, Plant Science, Range Management, Soil Science, and Wildlife Management.

Applications must include: (1) resume (include farm or ranch work experience even if wages were not received); (2) current college transcript; (3) a list of courses in which currently enrolled and those planned for the Spring Semester of 2011; (4) a list of 2 to 4

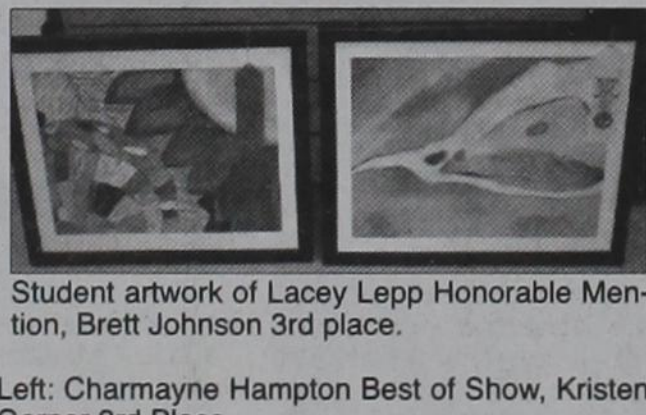

Parkview Artery New Influenza Guidelines for 2010-2011

The 2010-2011 flu season is upon us, and there are some significant changes in the flu season's recommendations that healthcare providers and clinicians should be aware of before beginning flu vaccination efforts.

The 2010-2011 flu vaccine is made in the same way as past flu vaccines. Over the years, hundreds of millions of people in the US have safely received seasonal flu vaccines. This year's vaccine will protect against the 3 main viruses that research indicates will cause the most illness. The season's flu vaccine will protect against 2009 H1N1, an A-H3N2, and a B virus.

On July 29, 2010, the CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) issued recommendations for everyone 6 months of age and older who do not have any contraindications to vaccination to receive a flu vaccine each year, beginning this flu season.

While everyone should get a flu vaccine each flu season, it's especially important that certain groups get vaccinated either because they are at high risk of developing serious

flu-related complications or because they live with or care for people at high risk of developing flu-related complications are:

- Pregnant women
- Children younger than 5, and especially children younger than 2 years
- People 50 years of age and older
- People of any age with certain chronic medical conditions such as asthma and Diabetes
- People with immunosuppression, whether due to illness or medications
- People who live in a nursing home and other long-term care facilities; and
- People who live with or care for those at high risk for complications from flu, including:
 - Healthcare workers
 - Household contacts of people at high risk for complications from the flu
 - Household contacts and out of home caregivers of children less than 6 months of age (no vaccine is approved for children younger than 6 months, as these children are too young to be vaccinated)

Flu vaccine shipments have already begun, and enough vaccine is expected to ensure that everyone recommended is able to get vaccinated. Healthcare providers and clinicians are recommended to begin flu vaccination as soon as shipments arrive at their location and should continue vaccination throughout the remainder of the flu season.

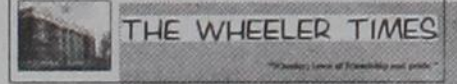

Pedometers To Motivate Fitness

Research shows that a pedometer – a small and typically inexpensive device that counts steps – is an excellent motivational tool for walking, as well as other physical activities for which there is a step motion (e.g., running, dancing, stair-climbing, cross-country skiing, ball sports, household chores, etc.). You may also try it with cycling or other non-step motion activities, but it may take some trial and error efforts like experimenting with wearing it on your shoe to try to get an accurate count.

Research results of a systematic review of 26 studies on pedometer use from the Journal of the American Medical Association (2007) showed that people who wore a pedometer increased their physical activity by 26.9 percent over baseline. Those wearing pedometers took over 2,000 steps (the equivalent of about 1 mile) per day over those who did not wear a pedometer. Use of a pedometer was positively associated with physical activity as well as significant decreases in Body Mass Index (a measure of body fat) and decreases in systolic blood pressure an average of 4mm/HG. This number is important because reducing systolic blood pressure by just 2mm/Hg has been shown to cut stroke mortality risk by 10 percent and risk of death by vascular causes by 7 percent. Results of this study also found that setting a "step goal" and keeping a "step diary" are important motivational factors for increasing physical activity.

Many of us are motivated to exercise if we have a target or goal to work toward. A pedometer (usually worn at the waist) can be worn all day or just during planned activity to see how many steps you are taking – then you can try to increase the number of steps, creating goals for the next day or week. To set a step goal for yourself:

- Establish a baseline wearing your pedometer throughout the day for 3 days. Add the total number of steps and divide by 3. This is your baseline.

- Set short and long-term goals. A short-term goal might be to add 250 steps per day aiming toward the long-term goal of 10,000 steps per day. Another goal might be to make 3,000 or more of your steps fast steps. If you're just starting out, try to accumulate 1,000 steps in 10 minutes on level terrain before building up to 3,000 steps in 30 minutes. Try adding steps with simple solutions like parking farther from your destination and walking, taking the stairs instead of the elevator, and taking short walking breaks during the day.

- Log your progress in a step diary, which can simply be a notebook or recorded on a computer. You can log your miles with a program like Walk Across Texas (walkacrosstexas.tamu.edu). Seeing your progress can help keep you motivated.

- When choosing a pedometer, accuracy is one of the most important considerations, while cost is usually among the concerns:

- When looking in the lower-cost range (around \$15), you will likely find spring-levered pedometers that use a pendulum-like

 mechanism that moves up and down with your steps. Look for a coiled-spring, which retains its accuracy longer than a hairspring.
 • A more expensive version (\$25+) is usually called an accelerometer or piezo-electric pedometer. These use a strain gauge, which measures how fast you're moving and tend to be more accurate than spring-levered pedometers. The downside is they use more battery power, but they also tolerate body tilt and can sometimes be carried in your pocket.
 • Usually the most expensive, there are also GPS (Global Positioning Satellite) pedometers that use GPS technology to measure distance and speed. These pedometers often have computer or cell-phone downloadable features and can measure speed as well as distance. Keep in mind that these may not work as well indoors, for treadmill walking, or walking in place.
 You will also want to consider ease of use and comfort (especially if you plan to wear it all day). Choose a model that can be easily read from the waistband. Make sure it has a strong security clip and/or safety strap so that it does not fall off. Consider one that has a cover, so that you can't accident-



One Click, One Call To Report Problem

 TxDOT's newly launched "Report a Pothole" initiative is available online at www.txdot.gov or the toll-free number at 888.885.8248.
 With just a click of a mouse or a quick phone call, citizens can report a pothole, including the location of the damage.
 The new system is part of the

agency's ongoing move toward transparency and better customer service, said Amadeo Saenz, TxDOT executive director.
 "But it's also about enlisting Texans to help us maintain the state's transportation system," Saenz added. "Citizens reporting problems on the highways—it just makes sense. It's like an extension of our maintenance forces. In today's environment of diminishing resources, it helps to have every citizen engaged."
 Operators will answer phone lines from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. EDT Monday through Friday. Evening and weekend calls will go to voicemail and be returned the next morning or on the first working day of the following week.



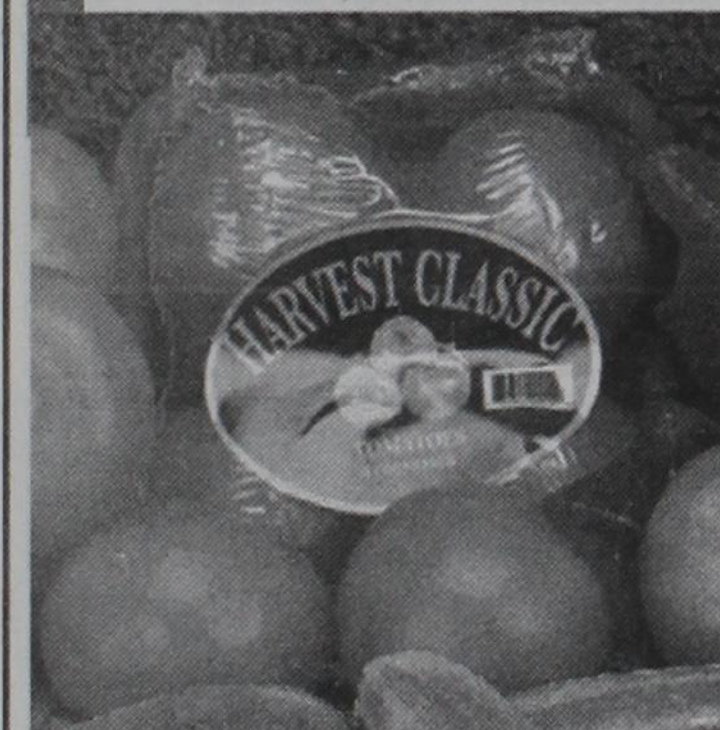

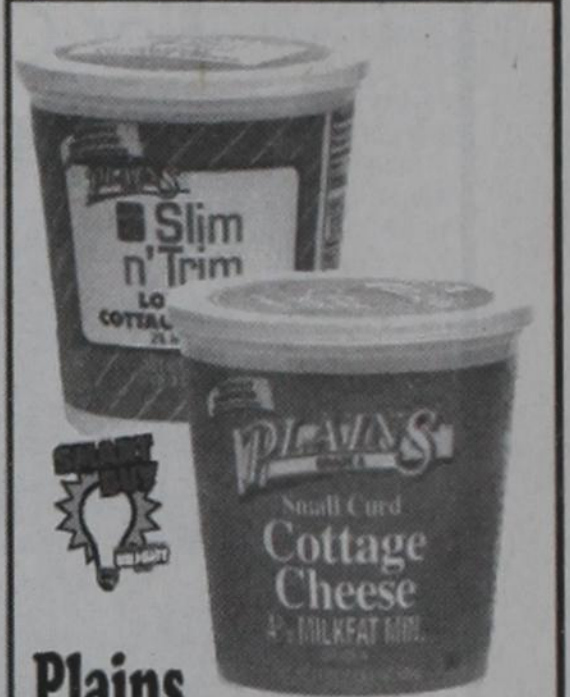
