Issuing of Tickets Will Help Reduce Accidents

Have more to drink than alcoholic beverages such as soft drinks, fruit drinks, tea and coffee. Above all, don't let a person drive away from your party when they show any signs of intoxication.

Snider encourages those driving during the holiday to allow extra travel time, to look ahead and about for errant drivers and to buckle your safety belts and have all passengers to do likewise. This security can be the difference in whether you drive or ride through a critical incident and survive or not. "Don't let your passenger(s) jar you from keeping control of your vehicle," says Snider who adds, "Take control and keep in control for a safe and enjoyable New Year."







U.S.D.A. Engineer Retires After 39 Years On Service

Pioneer rural development Engineer Harold L. Carter announced his retirement at the end of November 1996 after 39 years of federal service. Carter spent the last 31 years of his career in the USDA Rural Development (formerly Farmers Home Administration) State Office in Temple, Texas, working with various rural development programs.

rural development programs.

During his tenure, Rural Development financed more than 200,000 miles of rural water lines, 30,000 apartment units, and many community sewer systems, rural hospitals, nursing homes, fire stations, businesses, single family houses, and other rural development facilities. Carter contributes the rural water supply program as the most significant development in rural areas since the rural electric program administered by the former Rural Electrification Administration and Farm-to-Market roads.

"Having been raised on a farm near Roby in West Texas, where we had to haul our water, I was made keenly aware early in my life the need for safe, adequate drinking water in the rural areas," Carter said. "Rural water systems financed through Rural Development have ranged in size from a dozen customers to several thousand, including individual communities to multi-county project. We are proud of this program because of the low delinquency rate and excellent service the water systems are providing. The success has been the result of the leadership of the local communities and dedicated Rural Development

change for rural area development will be rural sewer. He foresees increased activity in the existing water supply systems becoming more active in solving the sewer needs of their communities. Several innovative and alternative sewer systems

designs are being explored.

Carter plans to retire to his farm in the community of Oenaville, which is near Temple. He and his wife, Jennifer, have recently renovated a turn-of-the century farmhouse into an art studio. Carter, who is a renown Texas artist, plans to travel and exhibit his work at art shows. "Traveling the back roads of Texas for 40 years with a camera has given me many subjects

one of the first trips Carter wants to make is to Alaska. His granddad, a West Texas rancher, traveled to Alaska in 1947, shortly after the Alaskan highway was first opened to the public. It has been his goal to repeat this trip 50 years later.

Shamrock Woman Sentenced To Prison

A 22 year old Shamrock woman faces multiple prison sentences as a result of court proceedings in Wheeler on Tuesday according to Wheeler County District Attorney, John Mann. Robbyn Griffin of 302 S. Oklahoma in Shamrock is in Wheeler County jail awaiting transfer to the State Penitentiary following her conviction for Involuntary Manslaughter charges stemming from the February 8, 1996, death of 33 year old Wesley Welch of Shamrock

The incident occurred on Wheeler County Road 9, commonly known as the Magic City Road, at approximately 4:00 p.m. when an afternoon picnic resulted in tragedy as Welch was thrown from a moving vehicle driven by Griffin. Welch was riding on the trunk of the car at the time of the erratic driving to which Griffin pleaded guilty. Welch hit his head on the hard, dirt road and sustained severe trauma to the skull which resulted in his death.

Griffin also had two previously court-ordered probations revoked during Tuesday's proceedings. In 1993 Griffin pleaded guilty to felony theft and was placed on deferred adjudication probation. Then, in 1995, Griffin again pleaded guilty to being involved in a theft ring operating in Wheeler County which resulted in the conviction of numerous persons who were caught stealing personal items from various rural houses in Wheeler County. The probation revocation sentences, two years and seven years respectively, will run concurrently with the seven year jail term for the Welch

The State of Texas Department of Child Protective Services took Griffin's 16 month-old child into protective custody pending permanent custody

pending permanent placement during Grififin's jail sentence.

The case was investigated by Wheeler County Constable, Jerry Bob Jernigan, Wheeler County Chief Deputy Sheriff, Rick Walden, and Deputy Jerry Bailey.

Griffin's court-appointed lawyer was Shamrock's Phil Pendleton.

Applications Are Being Accepted For FSA Loans

Armstrong, Gray, Donley, Wheeler, and Carson counties were declared eligible for Farm Service Agency (formerly Farmers Home Administration) disaster emergency loans on September 3, 1996. Generally, that means that farmers who have lost at least 30 percent of their production due to the drought, freeze, high winds, freezing temperatures, sleet, and snow which occurred from June 1, 1995 through June 11, 1996 are eligible for emergency loans. Proceeds from crop insurance and the PIK program are taken into account when determining

FSA County Supervisor Larry Goetze is urging farmers who are interested in receiving an emergency loan to get their applications in to FSA as soon as possible. Goetze said, "We hope farmers will get their applications in early rather than waiting until near the deadline which is June 16, 1996. The longer they wait, the more chance there is for long delays in getting their checks. If the applications come in early, we can avoid backlogs and speed up the process."

The FSA office is at 321 Sully in Clarendon. The telephone number is 806/874-3552. Office hours are 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM.

Locations for Payment Of Electric Bills Increased

Almost all Southwestern Public Service Company customers will have more places to pay their electric bills beginning early next year.

SPS expects to add more than 80 "payment stations" to the 28 stations already being used by some SPS customers in some communities.

Such payment stations are placed in supermarkets, financial institutions and existing small businesses. They offer customers additional locations, and in some cases more convenient hours, for bill-paying

The payment stations do not replace local SPS offices, which continue to accept bill payments as well as offer other services, such as accepting orders for new service, changes in service location, and ter-

mination of electric service. Recent surveys of SPS customers showed that "additional payment locations" was the most-requested change SPS could offer its customers, said Jake Webb, SPS Southern Division Manager, who is chairman of the company's customer service task

"Many of our customers say they want more locations and more convenient places to pay their bills. We're responding to that," Webb said. "Whether through alternative loca-tions, expanded business hours or other options, our continuing goal is to make conducting business with SPS easier and more convenient for-

the customer.' Webb noted, "With our local community offices, our existing payment stations in some towns, mail-in and bank-draft payments, and these planned new locations, we give our customers a variety of payment op-

tions to choose from. Almost all of the 102 communities SPS serves will have at least one payment station; some larger communities will be served by several-

Customers will have to bring their electric bills with them to make a payment at a payment station, Webb said. The stations do not have access to SPS customer account information, and will not be able to provide any services except receipt of pay-

In addition to accepting on-time payments, the stations will be able to receive payments in cases where electric service has been disconnected for non-payment. The latepaying customer will be given a verification number to use when calling a local SPS office to arrange to have

service restored. SPS is completing a contract with a third-party provider that in turn will contract with other businesses to provide payment station services, Webb said. Announcement of the locations of the new stations, and the number of payment stations in each SPS-

served community, will be made later. SPS is a regional electric utility, providing service to about one million persons in a 52,000 square-mile-area covering eastern and southeastern New Mexico, the South Plains and Panhandle of Texas, the Oklahoma Pannandle and southwestern Kansas. Corporate headquarters is in Amarillo, Texas.
