## POW-MIA Flag Will Be Raised at Wheeler P.O.

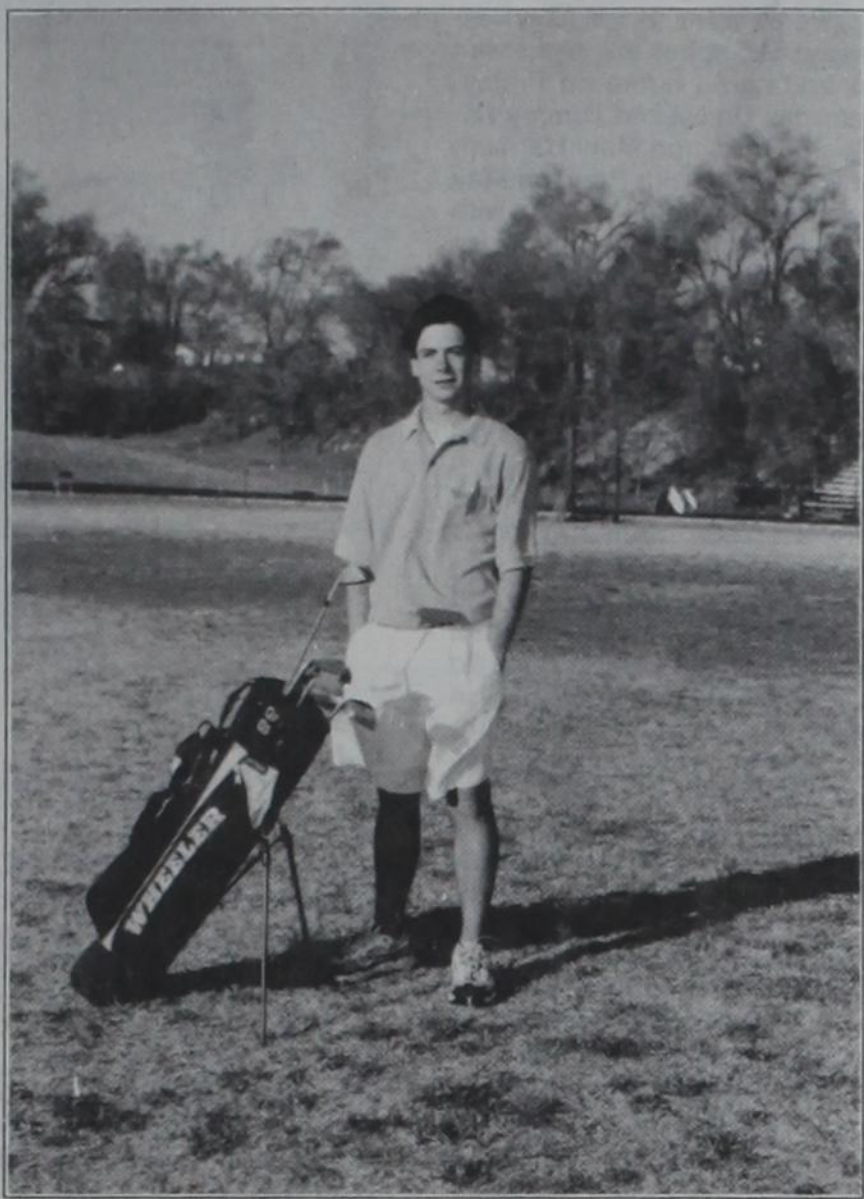

Burnice Earl Clift was born April 16, 1900 in Duncan, MO to Nancy Ellen (Coots) and Gabriel Clift and passed away May 9, 1998 in the Sayre Memorial Hospital at the age of 98 years and 23 days.

Burnice married Lottie (Kelley) Clift on February 22, 1925. The couple purchased a farm near Reydon where they established their home. Three children were born to this union, Gwen, Noel "Sonny", and Joyce. Two children preceded him in death, Gwen (Lane) in 1973 and "Sonny" in 1985. Joyce married Loyd Beals and still lives in the Sweetwater Community. His wife, Lottie, also preceded him in death in 1977. Burnice came to Oklahoma in 1911 with his parents when they left Missouri in 2 covered wagons. They settled in the Grimes area where he attended Highland School. As a young man Burnice spent a year in the U. S. Army. Burnice probably knew more early settlers in the Reydon area than anyone else. He had an incredible love for the land which was obvious when talking with him because he could tell you about every section, who owned it, and what they farmed on it. He was among the first in Rogers Mills County to try his hand in raising Love Grass. He had been a Pioneer Seed Distributor and had served on the Soil Conservation Board. In 1978 Burnice married Macyl Mattie Yell and they made their home in Erick.

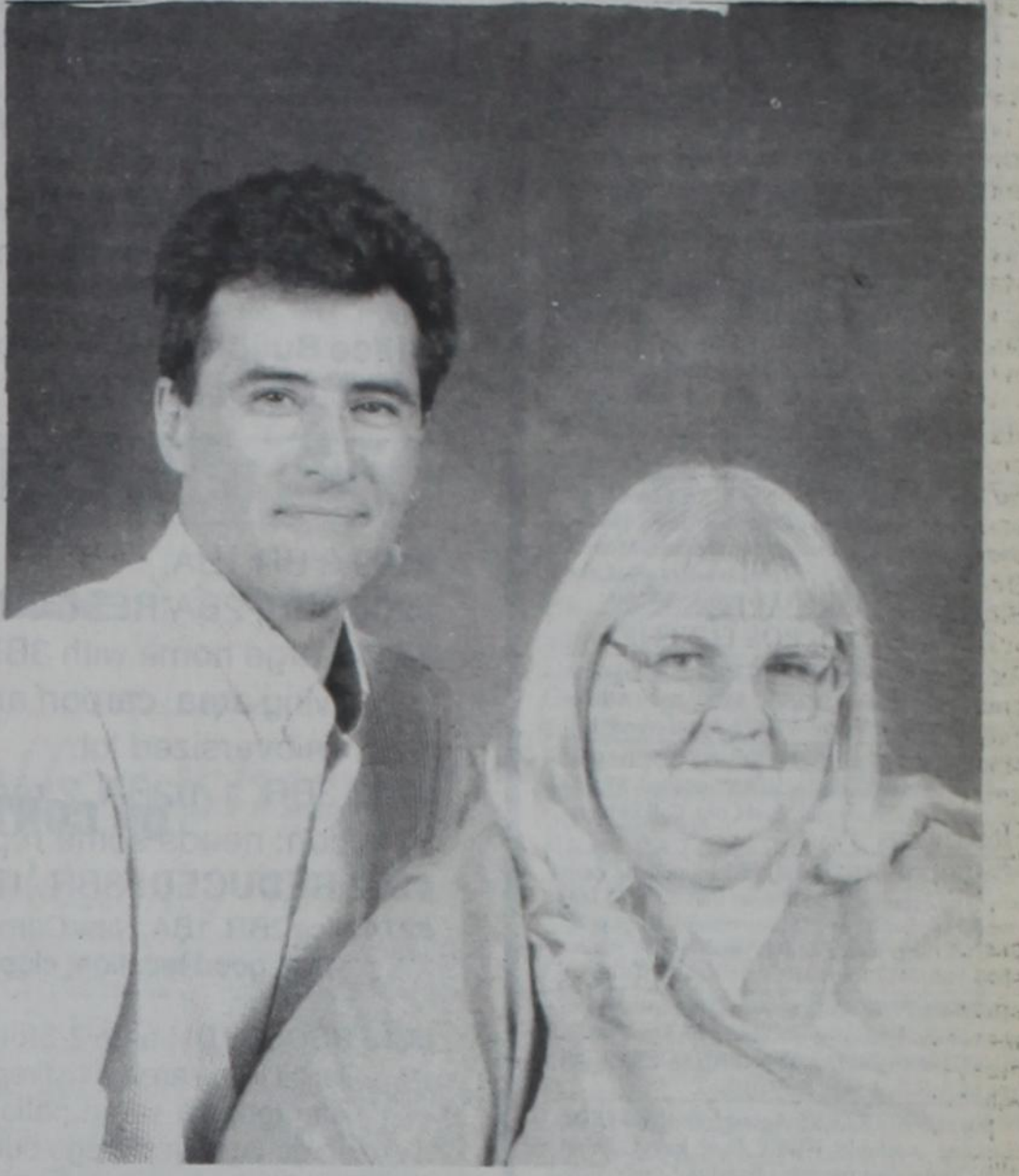



## Highway Traffic Sign Are Vandalized or Stolen

With the arrival of spring, Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) has noted an increase in traffic sign theft and vandalism.

Although the signs are quickly replaced, and no one has been injured due to missing or damaged signs, the costs associated with this — are high. Damaged signs pose a danger to the traveling public, and the funds spent to replace them could be spent elsewhere.

Statewide, taxpayers spend more than \$8 million annually replacing signs damaged by natural disasters, accidents, and vandals.

Wood and metal signs cost approximately \$10 per square foot to produce. The costs to install replacement signs vary depending on the amount of time and equipment needed.

People are reminded that in Texas it is against the law to possess a sign without a permit, and the state—signs or issue permits to possess them. In addition, if the loss to TxDOT is more than \$1,500 it is a felony.

Counties included in TxDOT's Childress district include: Briscoe, Childress, Cottle, Collingsworth, Dickens, Donley, Foard, Hall, Hardeman, King, Knox, Motley, and Wheeler.

Local Maintenance Supervisor, David Deger, reports that, "missing signs can endanger travelers. The vandalizing of certain signs can risk persons safety".

Motorists are encouraged to write down the license plate number and contact their local law enforcement official if they see anyone tampering with a traffic sign.
