Wheeler Co. Farmers' Market To Open 7th Season June 16

The Wheeler County Farmers' Market is set to open its 7th season on Wednesday, June 16th at 4:00 pm on the east side of the courthouse in Wheeler. The market will be open from 4 to 6 every Wednesday and from 9 to 11 every Saturday (except for July 3rd). The Saturday market will be set up on the West side of courthouse and will kick off on June 19th. The market is open to all growers in Wheeler County and all produce

must be grown locally. Vendors are welcome to join the market by setting up your own table and taking care of your own sales. If there are any growers that do not want to set up to sell their goods, then contact market coordinator, Chester Jones, at 826-0435, to arrange consignment sales.

Recent rains have given the early gardens a boost and it is hoped that harvest will begin mid-June and last until mid-October. Our market attracts growers from Lela, Twitty, Shamrock, Kelton, Briscoe, and Wheeler. We encourage anyone from the elderly to the youngsters to get active in the local market and earn some extra cash, provide an eco-friendly alternative to buying food, and just enjoy the fellowship of your fellow growers and our loyal customers.

We are expecting a bountiful harvest this year and we are particularly looking forward to a good peach crop and also a good apricot crop. Recent winds thinned the peaches but that was beneficial resulting in larger fruit remaining on the trees.

Local gardeners are excited about this growing season with talks of lots of new potatoes, green beans, onions, squash, cucumbers, melons, okra, peas, cantaloupes, and lots more. We are expecting a better yield on black-eyed peas this year since the deer have been thinned out quite a bit this hunting season. So if mother nature will cooperate with us we are in store for a great growing season, and look forward to a successful farmers' market.

Learn To Can Food You Have Raised

Preserve foods at home? Yes you can but do it safely.

An abundance of home grown fruits and vegetables often triggers the desire to can foods at home. While this can be a fun and rewarding way to keep foods long after the season ends, care must be taken to assure that foods canned at home are safe to eat.

Following research-based methods and using tested recipes are just things to consider when canning foods at home. "Not all recipes for home canning have been tested for safety," said Wendy Hazzard, County Extension Agent for Family and Consumer Sciences. Sources of tested recipes include the National Center for Home Food Preservation (<http://www.uga.edu/nchfp/>), USDA, and manufacturers of home canning equipment and supplies. Recipes from cookbooks, out-dated Extension publications and the Internet should not be used.

Using the right equipment when canning also is important. Some foods can be preserved using a water bath canner but others must be processed in a pressure canner. "If the right canning method is not used, then the finished product could make people very sick," advises Hazzard. Also, make sure that the equipment you have is in good working order. Experts advise that dial gauges on pressure canners be tested annually to make sure they are accurate. In addition, canners should be checked to make sure they are in good working order.

There are many other aspects to canning that one needs to consider, including jar size, headspace, and recommended processing (canning) times. All of these can influence the safety of the final product. "The last thing that we want to do is tell someone that the food they have just spent hours canning has to be thrown away or redone," said Hazzard. However if one did not use a tested recipe, if unsealed jars were not identified within 24 hours after canning, or if jars were not processed properly (i.e. using a water bath canner instead of a pressure canner) we may have no other choice. Nobody likes to throw food away but nobody wants to get sick (or worse) from eating unsafe food."

DEAR PARENTS,

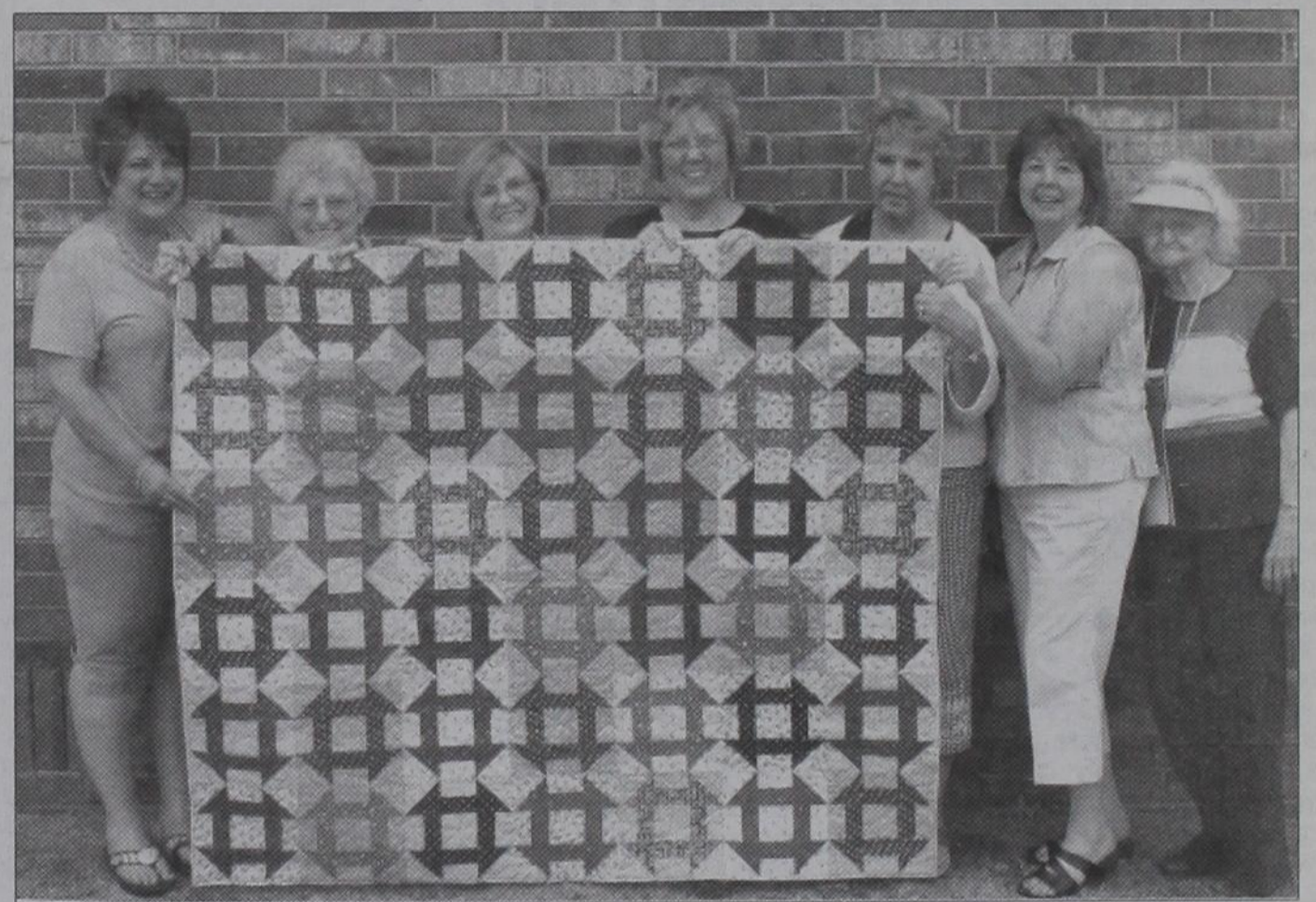

OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

THOSE POOR SHARE-CROPPERS

About the time I was in the third or fourth grade, we started having history as one of our subjects. I already liked that, because my dad was a real history buff. He had already exposed me to some history about the United States, Texas and especially, the "Old West." He could make it sound so interesting and exciting, that I wanted to learn more. Sometimes, he would ask me questions that would be sort of "pop quizzes." For example, "Hey, Roland, when they were building the railroads from the east to west, and west to east...at what town did the two tracks meet?" Some other questions were, "What was Jesse James' nickname and alias, when he was killed?" "Who killed him?" "Were they kin?" Stuff like that.

It isn't any surprise that I enjoyed history. I could just imagine myself being there when all that was happening. Texas history was one of my favorites. With brave guys like Travis, Crockett and Bowie, all well known from the battle of the Alamo. Many men that fought there were from Tennessee, Kentucky, the Carolinas, and other states in that part of the country. It was also, interesting to me, that some of the men in the "Alamo" battle were from England, Ireland and Scotland.

Several times in our "United States" and "Texas" history books, we would read about those poor "share-croppers." They didn't own any land at all; a landlord owned the land. The share-cropper had to give a share of their crops to the landlord, for letting them live there and work the land. They were poor, worked real hard, didn't have very nice clothes and pretty much, just had the "bare necessities." About a year or so later, I got to mulling all of that over and it occurred to me "that's what we are! We're share-croppers! And I didn't even realize we were poor! Maybe, being poor, wasn't so bad after all.

Why Is It Important to Be Safe in the Water?

Fish are able to live and breathe under water, but people need air to breathe. People drown when too much water gets into their lungs. When that happens, the lungs can't carry enough oxygen to the brain and the rest of the body.

Drowning is the second most common cause of death from injuries among kids under the age of 14. Drowning can happen so fast — sometimes in less than 2 minutes after a person's head goes under the water. That leaves very little time for someone to help.

Many drownings and near-drownings occur when a kid accidentally falls into a swimming pool. But accidents can happen anywhere — at someone's home or even at your own house, and that's why you need to know how to be safe around water.

Pools are awesome! What could be better than a dip in the pool and fun in the sun? But remember a pool's sides and bottom are usually made of concrete, a rock-hard material. A slip or fall could be painful and dangerous.

Have you seen those big numbers painted on the side of the pool? Those are called depth markers — they tell you how deep the water is at that point. You should always look before you jump into a pool. You should also only dive off the diving board. Never dive off the side of the pool unless an adult says that the water is deep enough. The water may be shallower than you think. If you hit the bottom... ouch! You might get knocked out or you could hurt your neck very badly.

Test the pool's water temperature before you plunge in. Cold water can shock your body and make your blood pressure and heart rate go up. You might accidentally open your mouth to yell and accidentally breathe in some water. Cold water can also slow your muscles, making it hard to swim.

Here's some other good advice for the pool:

Always have an adult watch you when you are in the pool — even in your own backyard. Never go in the pool if there is no adult around.

Gates are around pools for a reason — to keep kids away from the water when there isn't a lifeguard or adult around to watch them. Never go through any pool gates when they are closed. Stay safe and stay out!

Always obey pool rules.

Swim with a buddy.

If you're learning to swim, ask your mom or dad to make sure your flotation devices are Coast Guard approved.

Walk slowly in the pool area. Don't run.

Swim at a depth that is safe for you. If you're just learning to swim, stay in the shallow end.

Don't push or jump on others. You could accidentally hurt someone or yourself.

Toys to help you float come in many shapes and sizes (an inner tube, air mattress, or beach ball, for example). Although they are fun and can help you while you learn to swim, what they can't do is save a life. They're toys that can lose air or float away. Don't chew gum or eat while you swim — you could choke.


