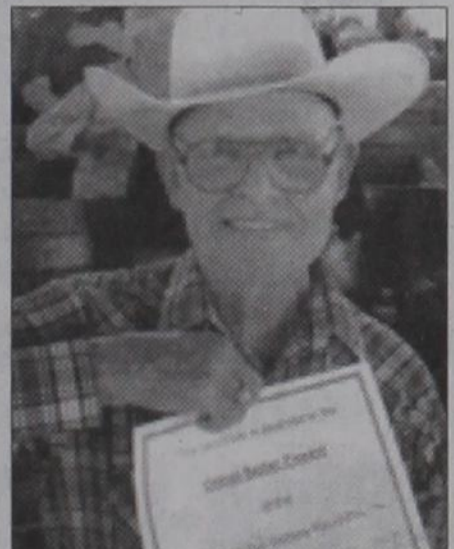

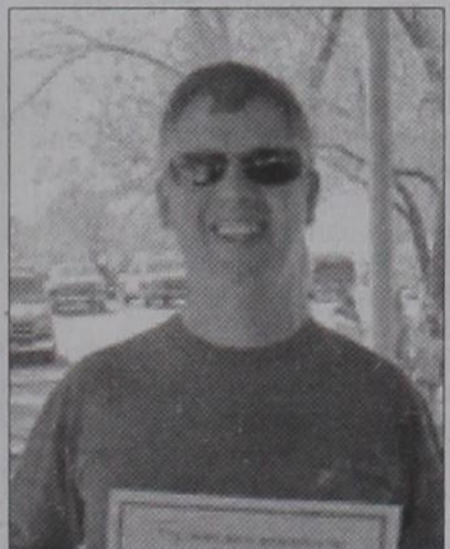

One of my favorite memories about baling hay, was when we stopped to eat dinner. My mom, aunts, and grandma would spend the whole morning getting all the food ready. A big job for sure! Fried chicken, was almost always on the menu. This was

chicken straight from the yard of the farm. They always looked for a young rooster (fryers, we would call them.) This would be repeated three or four times in order to feed all of us. The rooster would be caught by the leg with a long, stiff wire that had a hook bend on the

end of it. Once caught, its neck would be wrung, or head cut off. Then, it would be dipped in boiling water, so the feathers could be plucked off. The insides were discarded and the fryer would be washed really well, cut up and washed again. Now, it was ready to be seasoned and fried.

I go into all of this to make the point... much was required of the country women folk then. (Today, you can go to the store and buy a fryer, just about ready for the skillet. Easier, but not near as good tasting.) Anyway, all kinds of other great stuff was prepared by them for this meal. It was almost equal to any big holiday meal, and every bit as good!

We would see the women driving up to the hay field with dinner. They would set it all out on the flatbed of uncle Fat's, hay-hauling truck. They sure didn't have to tell us twice to stop and eat. We'd just get a plate and walk around the truck bed, loading it up with all this good food. There were plenty of places to sit, on the truck bumper, car fenders, and a field full of hay bales that served as tables or chairs. This is "Dining Out" country style
