



-and with the present scarcity of batteries in mind, we offer you the following suggestions to help you conserve and get the most possible service out of the battery you do have.

1. Have the battery case examined for cracks and leaks at the top where the cells are sealed. Test the battery for charge - if necessary, have the battery brought up to full charge— (Even a full charged battery has only 40 per cent of its energy available at zero temperature.)

2. Make sure that the battery cables are not corroded or frayed and the insulation is not eaten away. Cables should be tightened solidly on the battery posts and the battery firmly fastened in the hanger.

3. Have the generator inspected to be sure that the brushes are seating properly and not cutting into the armature so that the generator will be able to furnish sufficient current to keep the battery fully charged.

4. To reduce the battery current required to start the car, have the spark plugs cleaned and the gaps set to specifications. The spark plugs' wires should be inspected-if the rubber insulation is oil soaked and spongy, some of the current that should be going to the spark plugs will be lost.

5. Distributor points that are pitted and burned will use more battery energy also. They should be filed or replaced and adjusted to the proper setting.

Remove excessive drag in the engine and transmission by changing the oil and grease to winter grade. (Two and one-half times as much energy is required to turn the engine over at zero temperature than at 80 degrees with S. A. E. 20 oil.)

7. Practice starting the car with the clutch disengaged so that the battery won't have to turn the gears in the transmission as well as the engine.

8. When starting the car make sure the headlights are off as they draw between 35 to 40 watts of energy which the battery must furnish in addition to the energy required to start the car.

9. Finally, it is important at all times to keep the battery filled with water to the proper level. Only the approved battery electrolyte or approved water should be used. (In freezing weather the car should be used immediately after the water is added to the battery to insure its mixture with the electrolyte and thus eliminating the possibility of freezing.)


