

control should be returned normal to keep the motor from overworking.

Test for leaks by closing the door on a piece of ordinary wrapping paper about the size and thickness of a dollar bill. If the paper pulls out easily, the gasket is not tight enough to keep warm air from passing into the refrigerator. This may be because the rubber in the gasket has become brittle and hard. Or it may be the fault of the door. Try tightening hinges or latch to make the door fit more snugly. Test again with paper. If the door still is not

tight, get a new gasket. If the temperature is normal and the door does not leak, but the refrigerator still runs too much, call in a serviceman.

Q. Is there any treatment that is effective against Newcastle disease?

A. At the present time there is no specific medicinal treatment which can be recommended. Affected birds should be isolated or quarantined, and birds that are paralyzed or dead should be disposed of either by burning or burying. As a control measure, dispose of those birds which may survive an outbreak of the disease.

Q. May ducks be raised on dry ground?
