

dramatic consequences as the splitting of the minimum minimum from statistics compiled by the in a refrigerator while a bandit All scientific study does not bring as atom. Much of it is tedious and painstaking, and seems remote from drama, yet it may have a profound effect on our lives.

In the field of medical research alone; scientists, searching for specific knowledge on the nature and course of disease, are constantly aiding the practicing physician in the treatment and, perhaps more important, in he prevention of disease.

If we may be more specific, let us consider tuberculosis research and how science has aided and is aiding in the conquest of this disease which forty years ago was the first cause of death in this country and Bible Classes still leads all other diseases as a cause of death in the age group from 15 to 44.

The discovery of the tubercle bacillus by Robert Koch in 1882 was the first big blow at this deadly enemy. By proving the this bacillus was the cause of tuberculosis, Koch revealed to medical men and health workers that tuberculosis was a communi- Church School cable disease which could be prevented. A few years later the discovery of the X-ray by the physicist, William Conrad Roentgen, led to the development of the photofluorographic units which have been of intestimable aid to the physician in diagnosing tuberculosis.

In our own day, the discovery of Fourth Sundays. streptomycin by Selman A. Waksman has REV. JACK WILSFORD, Pastor encouraged scientists in the belief that a drug to cure tuberculosis may be found. Streptomycin, the most promising drug yet know, has been found effective as an adjunct to other methods of treatment in some forms of tuberculosis.

Despite progress, however, tuberculosis still presents many baffling problems to the scientist. What are the elements essential to the life of the tubercle bacillus? Why do portions of the lung affected by tuberculosis soften and discharge their content, making cavaties and permitting the dissemination of infection to previously healthy portions of the lung and to the outside world through infected sputum?

These are among the many questions which scientists are now studying and which, when the answers are known, will hasten the day when tuberculosis can be conquered.



You Can Get Extra Light From Your Lamps

"If the light from lamps seem dim these longer evenings, look them over with the idea of getting better reflection", advises Mrs. Bernice Claytor, extension home management specialist of Texas A. and M. College.

For example, dark colors absorb light, and so a dim shade which is dark inside actually wastes light, she points out. A white paper lining, or a coat of white paint, or even white shoe polish on the inside may double of treble the light given off.

"The shape of the shade counts, too," Mrs. Claytor says. "Wide, flaring shades give off more light than narrow shades with straight sides.'

If you're planning on buying lamps, take into consideration the size of the shade and the height of the lamp. Table lamps need shades 14 to 16 inches across the bottom, and large floor lamps need shades 18 to 20 inches across the bottom.

A short floor lamp is usually better than a tall one. A lamp about 45 inches from the floor to the bottom of the shade is usually better than a tall one, because the source is nearer the book or other place where ample light is needed

"A table lamp, used on a desk or reading table, is best when about 15 inches from table to the bottom of the shade," Mrs. Claytor concludes. "If it is taller the white lining of the shade cause a glare in the eyes."
