1. Spray inside and outside of outside privies with DDT fly spray, and use plenty of lime. especially if the privies are not fly-proofed.

Spray daily manure accumulations in cow lots and haul off all manure to the fields for spreading. Manure is the breedfor spreading polio.

The Commission was also busily engaged, for a while, on a "Covenant of Human Rights," which would have been "legally binding" upon the governments represented. The governments would be called on to enforce the "rights" if they signed and ratified the Commission's report.

We have called attention, upon several occasions, that it is foolish to expect to extend human rights by resolution or by law. Take for example, the people of India, where they are unaccustomed to the democratic processes. One wonders how a commission, sitting in various world capitals, can make Bible Classes an intelligent government extend certain Worship and Sermon 11:00 a.m. civil rights to the ranks of uneducated, untrained Hindus.

The same illustration explains why it is impossible to extend human rights by writing sentences upon pieces of paper. These human rights will come to human beings in time but they cannot be exercised, Church School ____ much less enjoyed, until the people affected are able to intelligently appropriate them.

It is easy enough, as in the case of the Communists of Soviet Russia, to talk about "democracy," but it is certainly apparent that the meaning of the term, as used in the Soviet, is not what we understand by the same word in this country. The background, of course, is the fact that most of the people of Russia are utterly unfitted to exercise the privileges of a democratic gov- Superintendent.



Sandwich Buns

2 packages yeast, compressed or dry 14 cup lukewarm water 1 cup milk 1/4 cup sugar

Soften yeast in lukewarm water. Scald milk. Add sugar, salt and shortening. Cool to lukewarm.

softened yeast. Mix well. Add






