"A number of statements have been published during the last several days which have misled and alarmed the public concerning the hazard of using DDT as an insecticide . . . The Food and Drug A6ministration HAS NOT prohibited the use of DDT in spraying dairy cattle and barns . . . There is no justification for public alarm as to the safety of the milk supply from the standpoint of DDT contamination.'
