Store Leather And Suede For The Summer

Air circulation and controlled temperature are important in keeping your leathers and suedes looking their best.

**Anitperspirant Damage to Clothing** 

Holes, tears and discoloration in the underarm area of clothes that otherwise have strong fabric has consumers puzzled.

According to the International Fabricare Institute, the problem occurs when antiperspirants come into contact with items made or blended with cellulose fibers, such as cotton, linen, ramie and rayon.

Antiperspirants usually contain high concentrations of aluminum chlorides which can damage cellulose fibers. The agitation of laundering will cause the chemically degraded fibers to tear or be removed from the fabric.

Antiperspirants should be removed from clothing as soon as possible to prevent this type of damage from occuring. The consumer may also choose to use a deodorant, which should not cause this problem, rather than an antiperspirant.

Removing The Oder From New Fabric

Have you ever bought some fabric to make a new dress and then discovered it smells bad? Many permanent press fabrics are treated with formaldehyde resins to create a wrinkle-resistant finish. Sometimes consumers complain about watery eyes, a fish-like odor or rashes from wearing a garment made from this type of fabric. The cause is probably a residue of the original fromaldehyde finish that wasn't properly neutralized and rinsed out of the fabric. The problem can usually be corrected by washing the article in an alkaline detergent. Most heavy-duty laundry detergents are alkaline. Dry cleaning won't remove the residual chemicals.



3-2 Rabies Tag-Concurrent with the issuance and delivery of the certificate of vaccination referred to in Section 3-1, the owner of the animal shall cause to be attached to the collar or harness of the vaccinated animal a metal tag, serially numbered to correspond with the vaccination certificate number. Such tag shall be worn by the animal at all times.

3-3. Duplicate Tags-In the event of loss or destruction of the original tag provided in Section 3-2, the owner of the animal shall obtain a duplicate tag. 3-4. Proof-It shall be unlawful for any person who owns or harbors a vaccinated animal to fail or refuse to exhibit his

copy of the certificate of vaccination upon demand to any person charged with the enforcement of these regulations. 3-5. Harboring Unvaccinated Animals-It shall be unlawful for any person to harbor any dog four (4) months of age or older which has not been vaccinated against rabies, as provided berein, or which cannot be indentified as having a current vaccinated against rabies, as provided herein, or which cannot be indentified as having a current vaccination certificate. SECTION IV.

REPORTING BITES AND RELATED PROCEDURES: 4-1. Any person receiving an animal bite shall report such incidence to the animal cont5ol officer. In addition, that animal shall be impounded and observed in a state approved quarantine facility.

ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE: 5-1. It shall be unlawful for any animal to be off the owners premises and not under the physical, visible or audible control f his authorized representatibe. Such animal shall be im-

5-2. It shall be unlawful for any person to harbor an animal that is a public nuisance as defined in Section II. SECTION VI.

6-1. The City Council shall appoint for a period to be terminated at thier pleasure, a qualified person to act in the capacity of Animal Control Officer, whose duty it shall be to see that the provisions of this Article are enforced. For his services, the Animal Control Officer shall receive such compensation as may be fixed by the City. 6-2. It shall be the duty of the Animal Control Officer or any

other designated individual, to watch for violations of this Article and to take action necessary to abate the violations. 6-3. It shall be the duty of the Animal Control Officer or any other designated individual to take up andy animal found running at large, and confine such animal in the animal shelter for a period of one hundred twenty hours (120) hours, during which time the owner, upon satisfactory proof to the Animal Control Officer of ownership, may redeem his animal upon payment of a pound fee of \$25.00 for each animal, and an additional \$3.00 for each day such animal is kept in the animal shelter. The owner of the animal shall also pay an additional \$10.00 for each subsequent impoundment of the same animal. 6-4. Any animal\_over the age of four (4) months without a current rabies vaccination may not be redeemed untio it has been vaccination. After the animal is vaccinated, and upon the presentment of a vaccination certificate from a licensed

veterinarian, the City of Wheeler will release the animal. 6-5. Upon the expiration of the 120 hour period, it shall be the duty of the Animal Control Officer to destroy the animal in a humane manner and properly dispose of the remains. 6-6. It shall be the duty of the Animal Control Officer or any other person having charge of the animal shelter to make a reasonabble effort to contact the owner of any tagged animal being held and notify such person that said animal is being held; however, the failure to give notice shall not abate the other duties of the Animal Control Officer to destroy the animal.

SECTION VII. Any person found to be in violation of this ordinance shall be guilty of a class "C" misdemeanor, as provided by Sec. 4477(6)(a), V.A.T.S.

SECTION VIII. Ordinance No. 81 is hereby repealed as are all portions of any existing ordinances which conflict with this ordinance. SECTION IX.

Should any Section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby. SECTION X.

DECLARING AN EMERGENCY: The fact that there are now

no adequate regulations governing vicious and rabid doge in the City of Wheeler and the regulations herein are needed for the protection of the health of the citizens of Wheeler creates an emergency and an imperative public necessity and that the rule providing that ordinances be read on three seprate days before the final passage thereof be the same is hereby suspended and this ordinance shall take effect and be in force after it passage, and it is so enacted.


