ORCHARDISTS SHOULD TREAT

Are your peach trees infested with borers? County Agent Frey says these worms are causing considerable damage to peach, plum, cherry and apricot trees all over Wheeler County.

It's not too late now to prevent further damage, but you'd better go to work on them right away.

If your trees have cloudy gum exuding from flattened areas of bark, you can suspect borers. The borers can be dug out with a sharp knife or flexible wire during the growing season, but the damage into the bark, and into the living tissue, and may kill the tree.

Of course, the cheapest thing to use is from ½ ounce to 1 ounce SEE (depending on size of tree) of paradichlorobenzene crystals per tree. placed in a circle around the tree about two or three inches from the base. This material gets best
