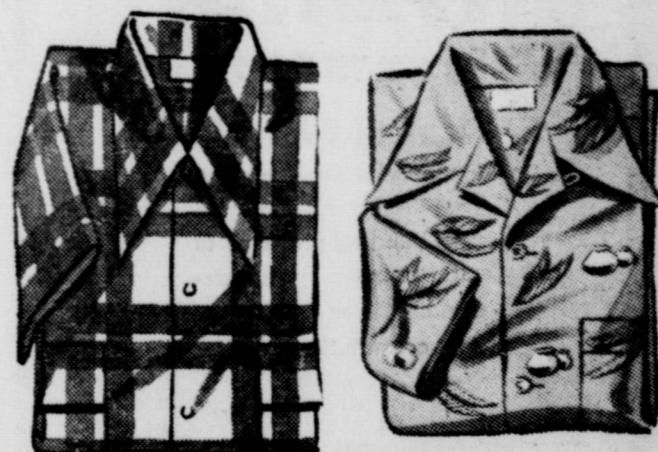

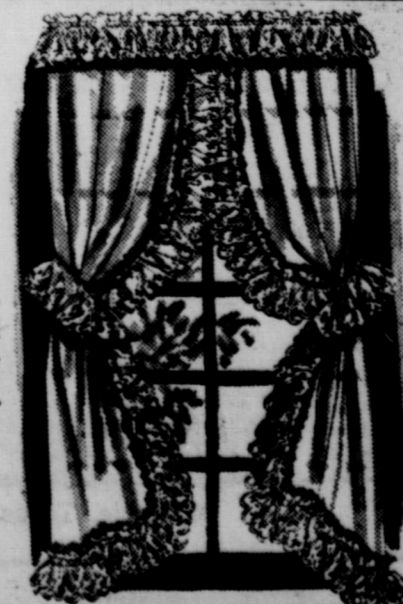

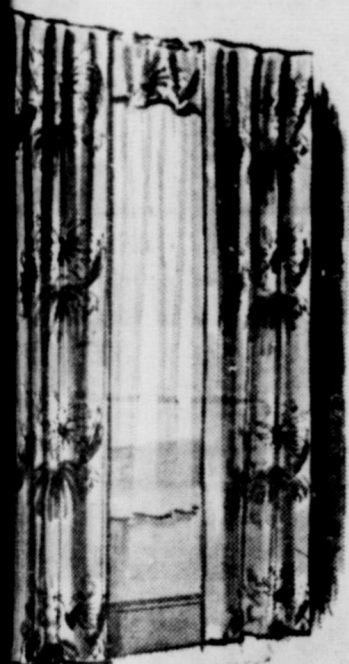

# H. Demo Women Initiate Defense Program In State

In 1951, a Civil Defense Program was initiated by Texas home demonstration club women. By July, defense chairmen had been appointed in 110 counties and 965 clubs had defense leaders. Maurine Hearn, state home demonstration leader, gives further facts on the development of the program.

She says participation by the women is voluntary and they received training in first aid and home nursing from Red Cross instructors. Other emergency activities are blood typing, designating first aid stations and locating hospital and sick room equipment. Each family is urged to set aside clean linens for one sick bed and make lists of friends and relatives in cities whom they might care for in an emergency. This training and information comes in handy in any kind of emergency such as fires, tornadoes or floods.

As examples of what has been done, Miss Hearn gives results from a few counties which have been sent in by county home demonstration agents. Leon County now has 27 trained Civil Defense leaders who have completed courses in home care of the sick and civil defense. Mrs. Wilma Adams, county home demonstration agent, says the goal of these leaders is to give every woman in Leon County an opportunity to receive the training. There are no hospitals and very few doctors in the county. Because of this situation the leaders appreciate the training and are giving their time to train others.

Aubrey Russell, district agent, reports 17 Civil Defense classes have been taught in nine counties of Extension District II, with 180 persons trained. These leaders are passing this information to friends and neighbors.

A course in first aid helped Mrs. J. T. Reynolds, Nolan County home demonstration club member, when her small son broke his arm. She put the arm in splints before going to the doctor and was complimented on her skill.

A total of 4,313 free chest x-rays were given in Ward County. More than 100 women working closely with the county chairman were responsible for this large number. An intensive survey in the county made the people tuberculosis conscious and desirous of

being x-rayed.

Community cooperation with state health organizations resulted in 122,103 persons having chest x-rays or examinations at well-baby, pre-school, and blood-handlers clinics.

Typing blood has been successful in Johnson County. Mrs. John Coke, civil defense chairman, reveals that 478 people have had their blood typed and the list is growing.

In San Patricio County, Mrs. L. S. Sandiee, county defense chairman, is working with the chairman of the American Cancer Society in securing sick room supplies for lending. These supplies are stored in a room set up for that purpose in the home of the chairman. Mrs. Sandiee has been instrumental in getting defense chairmen in every club in the county.

Home demonstration clubs in Henderson County sponsored a Red Cross course in first aid which was taught by a local physician and highway patrolman. Six women who attended received certificates which entitled them to enroll in an instructors course taught by Jim Hamilton from Red Cross headquarters, St. Louis, Missouri.

Miss Hearn says these stories can be duplicated in many Texas counties. She feels home demonstration women realize the need for training in Civil Defense and are assuming their responsibility for mobilizing to make America strong.

The chicken and turkey flocks, if they are to be profitable in the summer time, must be provided with plenty of good, cool, fresh drinking water. The water must be placed where the birds can reach it easily for they don't like to move about in the hot anymore than people do.

**LAWN WILL ADD VALUE TO ANY HOME**

A neat, well kept lawn will add to the value of a home, and lawns properly managed will provide a cool, restful cover for the home-site even during summer months. J. R. Watson, Jr., of the agronomy department at Texas A. & M. College, says that by recognizing the basic conditions necessary for lawn care the home lawn enthusiast may have a lawn that will provide pleasant relaxation and prevent soil from blowing and washing.

A grass should be selected that is suitable for the particular locality. Some of the grasses best suited to Texas are Bermuda, St. Augustine, and Buffalo grass. Others not so popular are Centipede and various strains of Zoysia grass. Bermuda grass is probably the most popular and best suited for all around purposes. However, St. Augustine grass is the best for shaded areas. Watson points out that the grass selected should be adapted to your locality and one that suits you.

Lawns should be fertilized in the spring and fall with a complete fertilizer, such as 10-5-5, 5-10-5, or 8-8-8. During summer it is not necessary to add a complete fertilizer, but nitrogen should be added every 30-40 days, for grasses are heavy nitrogen feeders. Ammonium nitrate or ammonium sulfate may be added at the rate of three pounds of ammonium nitrate and five pounds of ammonium sulfate per 1000 square feet of lawn. (reminder: length times width of your lawn area equals the square footage)

Controlled waterings is one of the most important considerations in the care and management of lawns. Watson says: The prevailing tendency is to overwater rather than underwater. Excessive water, as well as too frequent applications, cause plants to develop shallow root systems.

Water should be applied to mature turf only when the plants begin to wilt. At this time, the lawn should be soaked to a depth of four to six inches. When the water starts running off the surface, it should be cut off. If the soil is not soaked to the required depth, wait until the moisture has percolated downward and apply additional water.

Lawn turf should be mowed at about 1 to 1 1/2 inches. Watson points out that only about 1/4 to 1/2 inch of leaf surface should be removed at any clipping. Serious injury to the plant may result if a greater amount of leaf surface is removed at one time. A sharp, properly adjusted lawn mower is essential if the lawn is to be kept neat and trim.


