## Bonds To Be Sold At 4% Interest Rate

George Green, member of the Hassie and Green engineering firm of Lubbock and Joe Smith of the First Southwest Bonding Company of Dallas were in Wheeler Tuesday night and met with the city council to put the final approval on the water and sewer engineering survey and to discuss the sale of the bonds.

The council voted to approve the survey, with a few minor changes, and gave Smith the go signal on selling the bonds.

The engineering report and other pertinent information will be sent to the Housing and Home Financing Agency at Fort Worth. If the city can meet the government qualifications, the agency will buy the bonds.

All of the city council members are particularly happy with the interest rate. Mayor Daughtry pointed out that in all probability the bonds will be sold at the 4 percent interest rate which is the same rate the city paid for the Revenue Bonds which were sold in 1938 to build the present water and sewer system.

## WHEELER TO INSTALL 18 NEW LIGHTS

Both city and county officials have agreed to install a new street lighting system in Wheeler, according to Thomas Daughtry, Mayor.

The new system will include 18 35,000 lumen color corrected mercury vapor lights to be erected around the square. The lights will be mounted on wood poles.

The light bill for seven of the new lights will be paid by the county. The city will foot the bill for the other eleven Daughtry said.

The Public Service Company will furnish the lights and poles and will make the installation. The only additional cost to the city or county will be for the electricity used.

The eighteen new lights will give an estimated 10 times as much light as the ten old style lamps which now light the city.

The old lamps will be removed as soon as the new system is ready for operation.

"I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, it is the power of God unto salvation." Romans 1:16

We sometimes become confused about what the gospel really is. We hear it said that "gospel" means good news. Then we assume that, being good news the gospel is pleasant news. But what is good and what is pleasant may be miles apart. Good news is not necessarily pleasant news. To illustrate: If a clinical examination reveals that one is developing cancer, and the doctor says "You are lucky that we discovered this incipient cancer. An operation now will restore you to complete health. But a month from now it would be too late." In this case the unpleasant news that you had incipient cancer would be exceedingly good news.

"The gospel says "If any one would be my disciple let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me." Self denial is a thing most people do not want to do. But its fruits are wholesome and delightful and life giving. It is requisite to salvation. So it is good news when one discovers that by denying himself for Christ's sake he can have life more abundantly and the peace which passes all understanding.

Paul was not proud of the gospel so much because of what it demanded of him as for what it produced within himself and conferred upon him and was in the process of making of him. The gospel is the good news that by the surrender of self and the acceptance of Christ one can find peace and security and a sense of belonging. Though its requirements may sometimes be bitter its fruits are sweet and wholesome and nourishing.

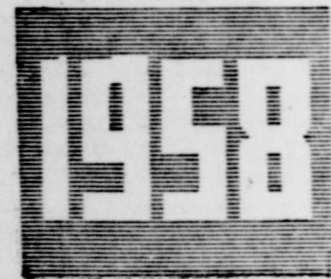

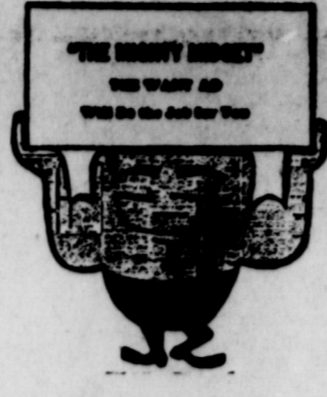

## LET'S TALK LIVESTOCK

### CATTLE AND CALVES ARE UNEVEN, GRASSERS WEAK

Cattle trade was again a hit or miss affair at Fort Worth Monday with fully steady prices in effect on grainfed heaves, canners and cutters, bulls and high grade stockers. Weakness prevailed on fat cows, slaughter calves and grassy yearlings and heifers and prices ranged from weak to 50 cents lower on these kinds.

Good and choice slaughter steers and yearlings cashed at \$25 to \$28.75, a load of 931 pound steers at the higher figure from Franklin County. Common and medium kinds sold from \$16 to

\$24. Fat cows cleared at \$16 to \$21, a few heiferish kinds to \$22. Canners and cutters cashed at \$12 to \$18. Bulls drew \$17 to \$22.

Good and choice slaughter calves sold from \$24 to \$28, and common and medium offerings sold from \$17 to \$24. Culls drew \$14 to \$17. Good and choice stocker calves sold from \$26 to \$32.75, and heifer calves ranged from \$31 downward. Stocker steer yearlings of lighter weights sold at \$28 downward, and some heavier weights sold from \$27 downward. Stocker cows cashed at \$17 to \$21.

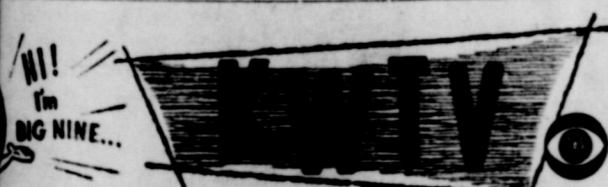

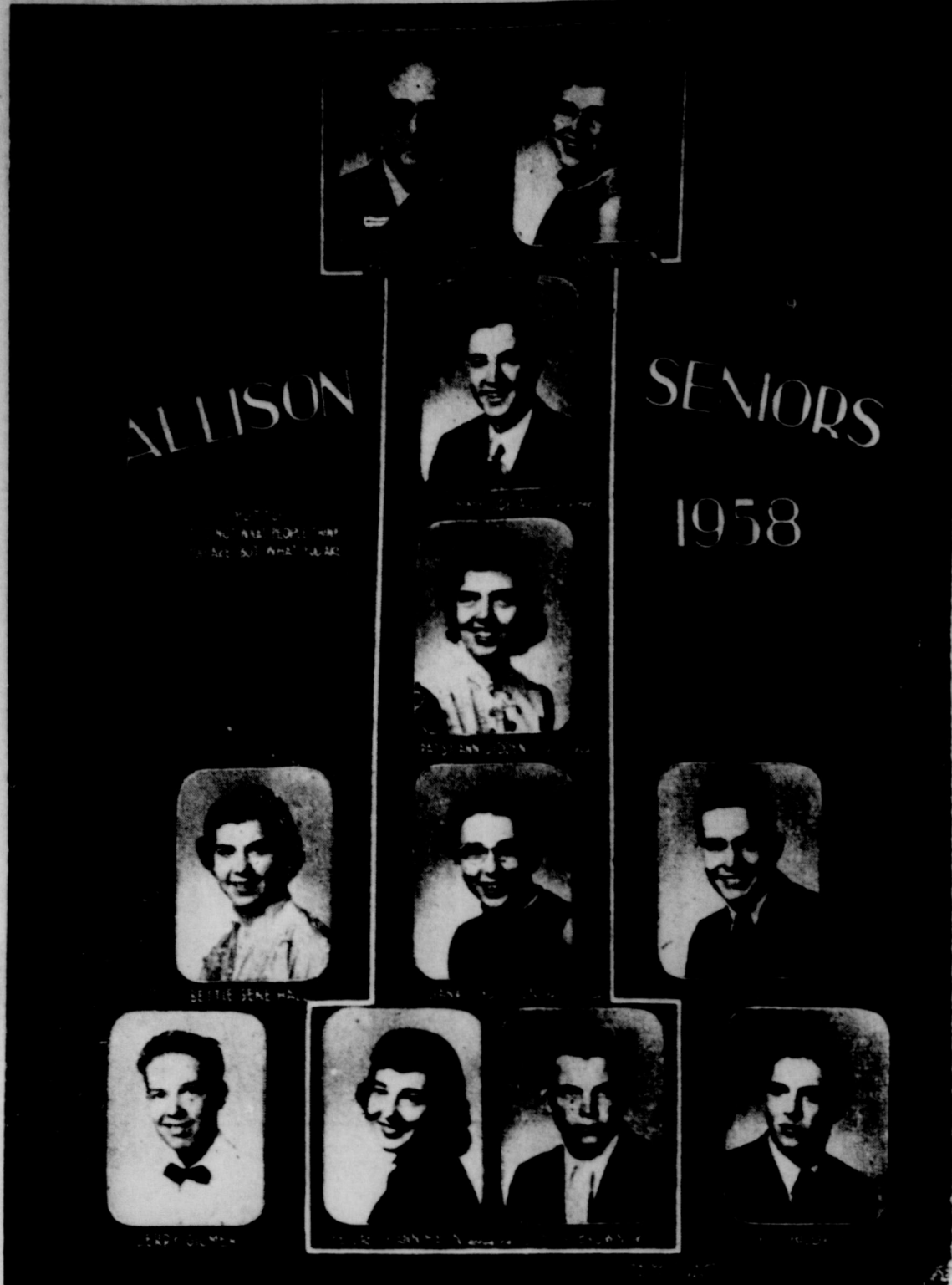

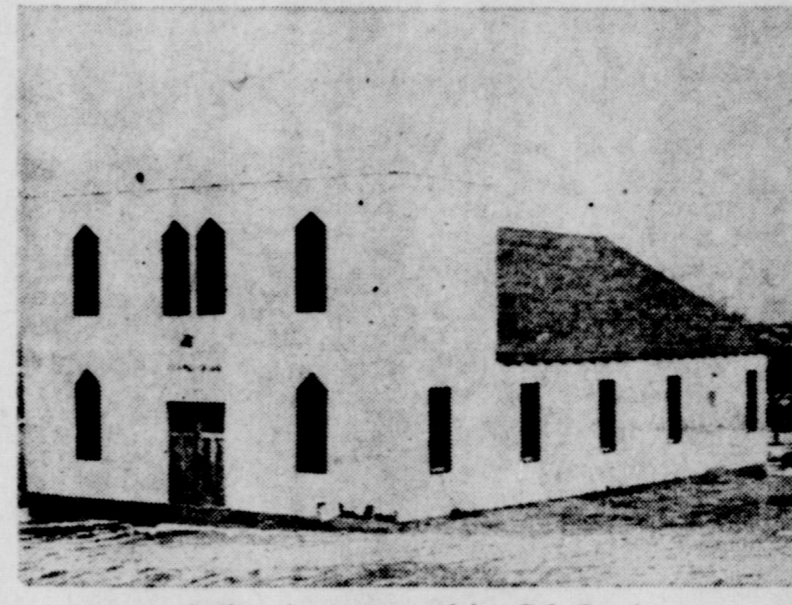

Rev. B. Gene Grace, pastor of the First Baptist Church of Mobeetie bring the message of the week in the seventh of a series of commentaries by ministers of the area, and presented on this page through the cooperation of the firms and individuals listed below.

EVERYTHING ELSE FIRST

"Jesus saith unto him, Thomas, because thou hast seen me, thou hast believed; blessed are they that have not seen and yet have believed."

In 1837 that strange genius, Kierkegaard, was very close to a positive decision for Christ. He wrote: "I think that if ever I become seriously a Christian I shall be most ashamed of not having done so before, of having wished to try everything else first". A few months later he added this: "If Christ is to come and take up his abode in me, it must happen according to the title of today's Gospel in the Almanac: Christ came in through locked doors". I wonder if Thomas was not in that same mood when, after being skeptical, he finally yielded completely to the crucified and resurrected Lord. To many of us there comes that experience of having found him at last and then being ashamed because we have tried everything else first.

We try comfort first. His words are hard and we would prefer someone who speaks more softly. He has a cross, and we try to find a religion without a cross that will give us peace and ease. We cannot believe that without the cross there can be no crown. And we would have the crown without sacrifice.

We try power. We think we can force our way into any place we want to go. We think we can take from others the things we want. Nations have tried power only to finally be crushed by the power of the Almighty God. Generations have tried to attain their goals by the use of power only to be frustrated by the very power they have tried to use. And leave unheeded God's warning of the corruption that comes from the worship of power.

We try some new Philosophy. Surely, we think, there must be some secret that will give us the success we crave. Our generation is very willing to seek all these new words and new promises. We think we have outgrown Him and we endeavor to find a more streamlined way of life.

Finally, after everything else has failed, we turn to Jesus. And he does come to use through closed doors and sometimes finds us only when everything else has let us down. In that hour we wonder why we waited so long and why we wandered so far away. It is for us to learn that he is the first and the last, and that no man comes to God but by Christ.

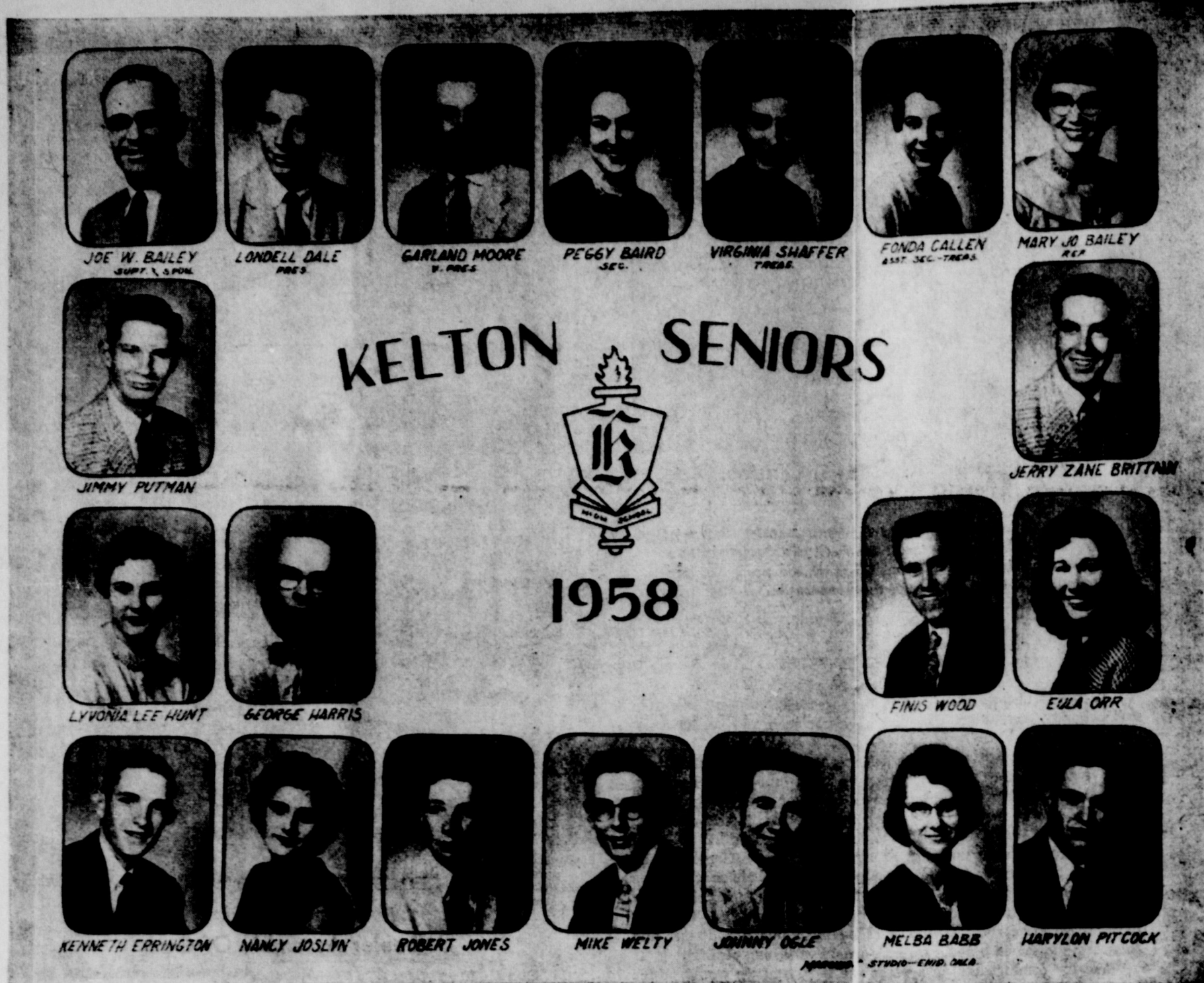
