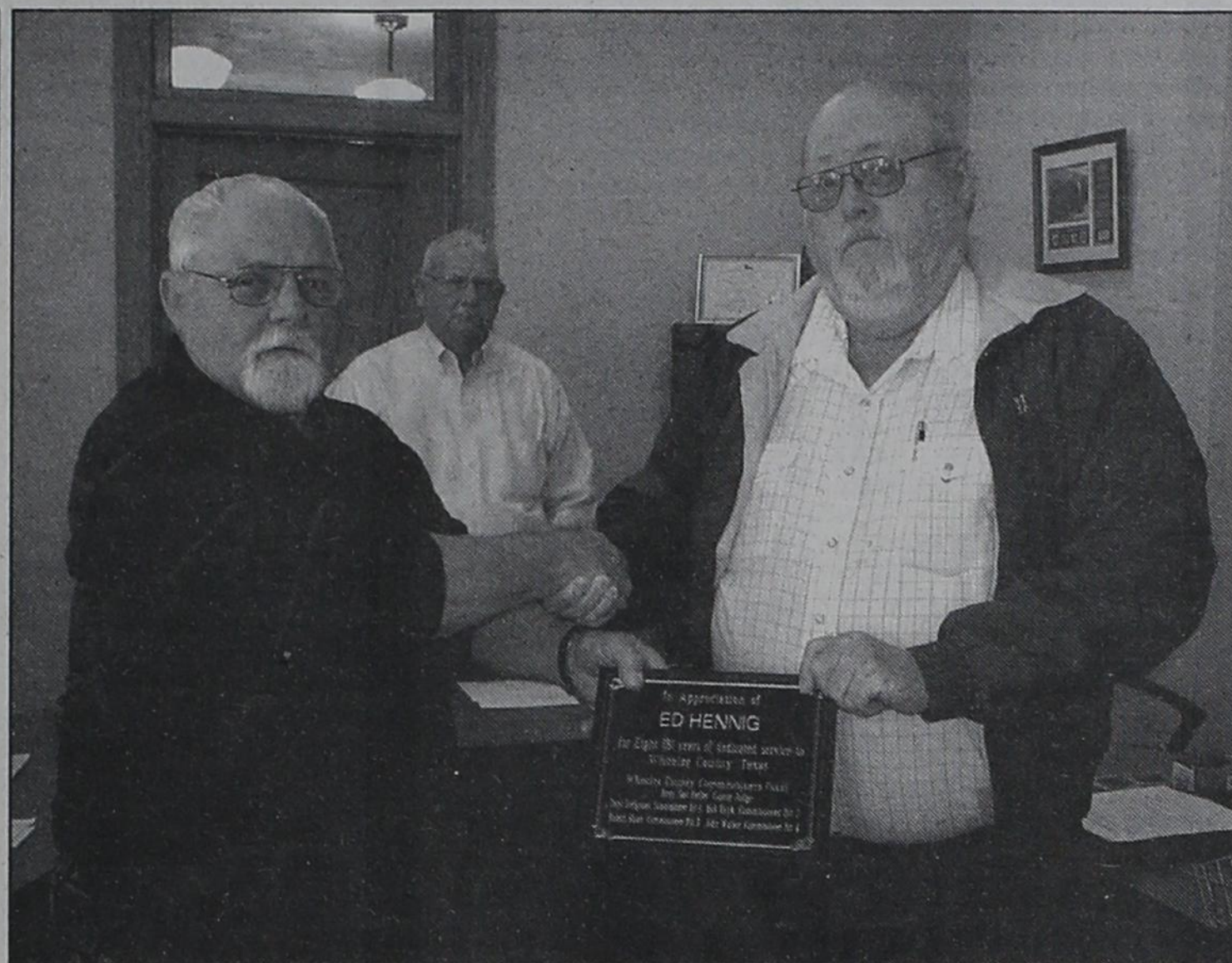
The next morning my mom and I went very early to the beach. Oh my, it was wonderful! The whole beach was just for us! We only got the perfect seashells!

## Comparison Made Of Crop Allotments

In writing 50 Years Ago I noticed the article below. I then contacted the Wheeler County Farm Service Agency for a comparison.

### ASC Allotments And Marketing Quota Laws

The Agriculture Program laws provide for acreage allotments and marketing quotas on cotton, peanuts, rice, tobacco and wheat. Of course, Wheeler County is primarily interested in wheat and cotton.

The 1961 Wheat Acreage Allotment for Wheeler County is 22,455.0 acres.

The 1961 Cotton Allotment for Wheeler County is 30,874.00 acres. Cotton farmers in this county are expected to grow approximately \$1,800,000.00 from their cotton this year.

### 2011 Comparison

Wheeler County Farm Service Agency currently has what we now call "Program Base acres" which use to be "Allotments".

They are as follows:  
Wheat 65,656.2  
Grain Sorghum 17,010.3  
Cotton 16,879.1  
Peanuts 7,189.3  
Oats/Barley 1203.1  
Corn 110.8

The Program Base acres were determined by planting history during the 1990's and early 2000's.

Wheeler County FSA currently makes payments in various programs totaling close to \$2.1 million annually.

November 2, 1961  
**Standard Of Texas To Drill In Wheeler County**

A 14,500-foot rank wildcat has been filed by the Standard Oil Co. of Texas in Wheeler County. Located one mile west of Mobeetie, the explorer is set as an Ellenburger test. It is in section 66, block A-5, H&GN survey.

The project, company's No. 1 Grady W. Harris, et al, is approximately 12 miles southwest of the Shell Oil Co. No. 1-68 Hobart, Hemphill County Morrow gas discovery. The Standard test is also some seven miles of the Gulf Oil Corp. No. 1 J. L. Bailey "A", Wheeler County test which was plugged and abandoned at a total depth of 11,010 feet on October 14, 1953.

The wildcat will be drilled as a "Tight" hole. It will be spudded this week.

NOVEMBER PERMITS TO DRILL

The Commission issued a total of 1,878 original drilling permits in November 2011 compared to 1,454 in November 2010. The November total included 1,711 permits to drill new oil and gas wells, 34 to re-enter existing well bores, and 133 for re-completions. Permits issued in November 2011 included 590 oil, 231 gas, 1,003 oil and gas, 44 injection, one service and nine other permits.

OCTOBER CRUDE OIL PRODUCTION  
Texas preliminary October 2011 crude oil production averaged 996,583 barrels daily, up from the 908,436 barrels daily average of October 2010.

The preliminary Texas crude oil production figure for October 2011 is 30,894,077 barrels, up from 28,161,530 barrels reported during October 2010.

NOVEMBER OIL AND GAS COMPLETIONS

In November 2011, operators reported 674 oil, 305 gas, 45 injection and one other completion compared to 333 oil, 242 gas, 25 injection and one other completion November 2010.

Total well completions for 2011 year to date are 7,924 down from 9,324 recorded during the same



period in 2010.  
Operators reported 189 holes plugged and zero dry holes in November 2011 compared to 557 holes plugged and one dry hole in November 2010.

OCTOBER NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION

Texas oil and gas wells produced 530,931,972 Mcf (thousand cubic feet) of gas based upon preliminary production figures for October 2011 down from the October 2010 preliminary gas production total of 559,945,639 Mcf.

Texas production in October 2011 came from 134,379 oil wells and 88,110 gas wells.

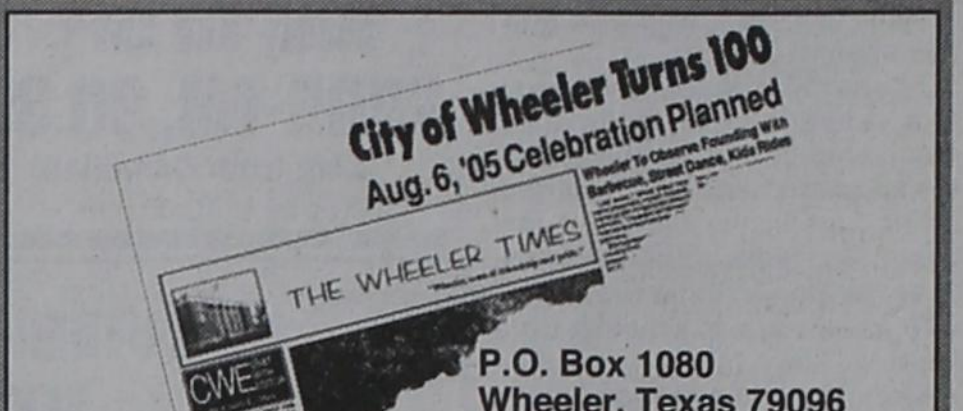

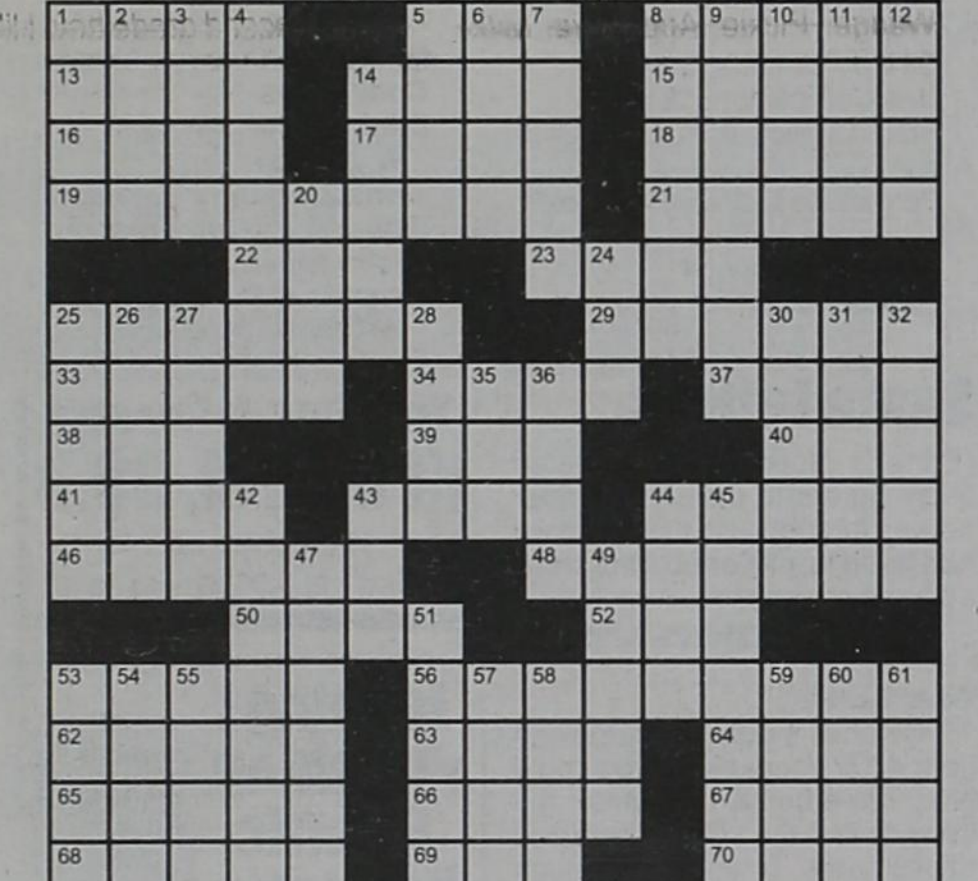

## RRC PRODUCTION STATISTICS AND ALLOWABLES

FOR January 2012  
AUSTIN — The Texas average rig count as of Dec. 16 was 916, representing about 47 percent of all active land rigs in the United States. In the last 12 months, total Texas reported production was 381 million barrels of oil and 7.1 trillion cubic feet of natural gas. The Commission's estimated final production for October 2011 is 33,773,405 barrels of crude oil and 509,884,053 Mcf (thousand cubic feet) of gas well gas. The Commission derives final production numbers by multiplying the preliminary October 2011 production totals of 30,894,077 barrels of crude oil and 457,911,139 Mcf of gas well gas by a production adjustment factor of 1.0932 for crude oil and 1.1135 for gas well gas. (These production totals do not include casinghead gas or condensate.) Texas natural gas storage reported to the Commission for November 2011 was 443,491,626 Mcf compared to 474,188,896 Mcf in November 2010. The December 2011 gas storage estimate is 422,268,502 Mcf. The Texas Railroad Commission's Oil and Gas Division set initial January 2012 natural gas production allowances for prorated fields in the state to meet market demand of 10,543,082 Mcf (thousand cubic feet). In setting the initial January 2012 allowances, the Commission used historical production figures from previous months, producers' demand forecasts for the coming month, and adjusted the figures based on well capability. These initial allowances will be adjusted after actual production for January 2012 is reported.

### ASC Soil Bank Program Explained

The Soil Bank originally provided two programs to assist farmers to divert a program of their cropland from the production of crops and to carry out a program of soil, water, forest and wildlife conservation. These two programs authorized under the Soil Bank were:

The Acreage Reserve—A short-time program to reduce current production of allotment crops. This program was discontinued on December 31, 1958.

The Conservation Reserve—a long-time program to shift general cropland from production to a conservation use.

The farmer receives two types of payment for putting cropland in the Conservation Reserve: An annual payment and a cost-share payment to assist in establishing an approved conservation use on the land.

To date, the local A.S.C.S. office has paid \$380,993.44 in 1961 annual payments.

### Old Issue Of Times Tells Of Big Fire; Wheeler Football

Mrs. Annie Savage brought the Times a copy of Wheeler News-Review, published December 30, 1920. We appreciated it and would like to share with you some interesting bits of information we read:

### Big fire, South Side of the Square

About fifteen minutes after twelve o'clock on the night of December 22, the people of Wheeler were aroused by the cry of "Fire!" The buildings on the south side of the square were in flames and by the time the bucket brigade was formed, the fire had gained such headway that it could not be checked until it reached the brick building occupied by W. E. Pennington and Son with their dry goods and grocery business.

Three buildings, which housed the Hall Drug Company, Happy Hour Theatre, The Wheeler News-Review and Lotts Barber and Shoe Shop were completely destroyed.

Christmas Day, the football teams of Wheeler and Wellington met on the local gridiron in a football contest that was the best exhibition of real football that this place has ever witnessed. The game resulted in a tie of 6-6.

The Wheeler lineup was: Roy Smith, fullback; Dick Craig, left half; Buck Britt, right half; Tom Hall, quarterback; Frank Breeding, left end; J. D. Kutch, left tackle; Dan Sanders, left



guard; Perry Morris, center; Stanley Green, right guard; Paul Green, right tackle; and Bob Holt, right end.

Buck Britt went through the line for a touchdown; his interference was run by Dick Craig.
