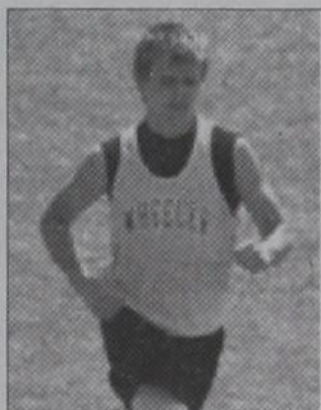

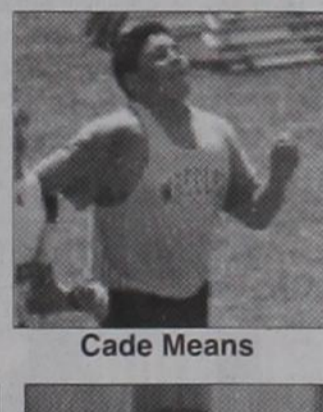

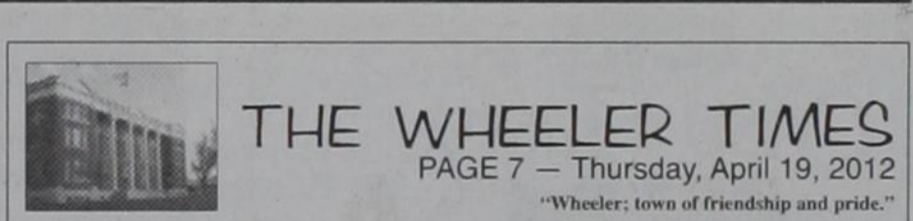

Prairie Chicken Conservation

NRCS Announces Wildlife Conservation Efforts to Benefit the Lesser Prairie Chicken
 Innovative partnership preserves working lands and supports efforts of private landowners to conserve habitat for the lesser prairie chicken, an at-risk species Temple, Texas, April 13, 2012-Private landowners and operators in the Southern Plains and Panhandle regions of Texas have an opportunity to apply for a new conservation funding source an-

nounced recently by Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack and Secretary of the Interior Ken Salazar. The announcement of the Working Lands for Wildlife partnership creates a \$33 million partnership with farmers, ranchers and forest landowners to use innovative approaches to restore and protect the habitats for wildlife, including seven at-risk species and other vulnerable game species.
 The targeted at-risk species in Texas, the lesser prairie chicken, is a ground-nesting bird native to the rangelands of Kansas, Colorado, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas. In the spring during the lesser prairie chickens' breeding season, the birds gather on leks or "booming" grounds to display unique courtships. Lesser prairie
