Be sure and feed ample supplemental protein to calves wintered on native ranges or hay. Otherwise, your gains are

likely to be disappointing. Research at a Ft. Robinson, Nebrasks Experiment Station shows that at least 1/2 pound of crude protein per day showed no increase in daily gain from supplementing additional ene . .
