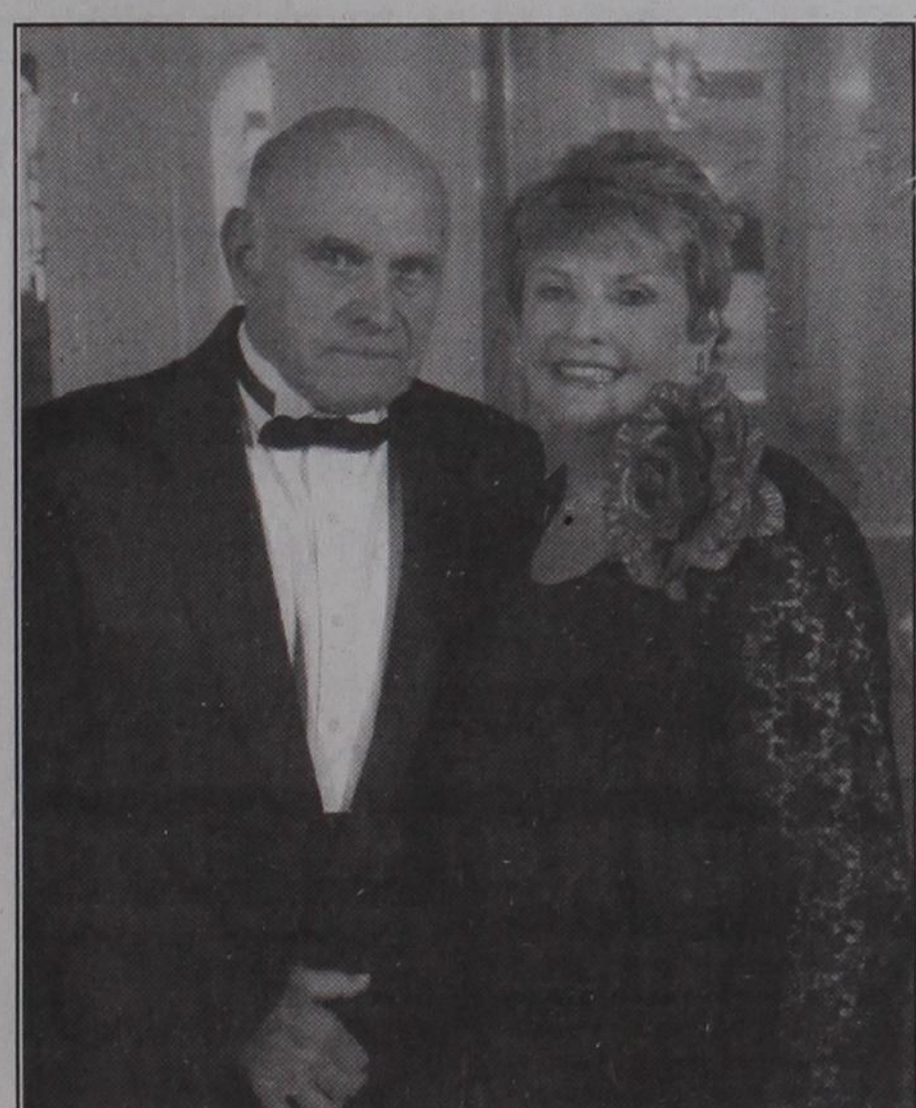

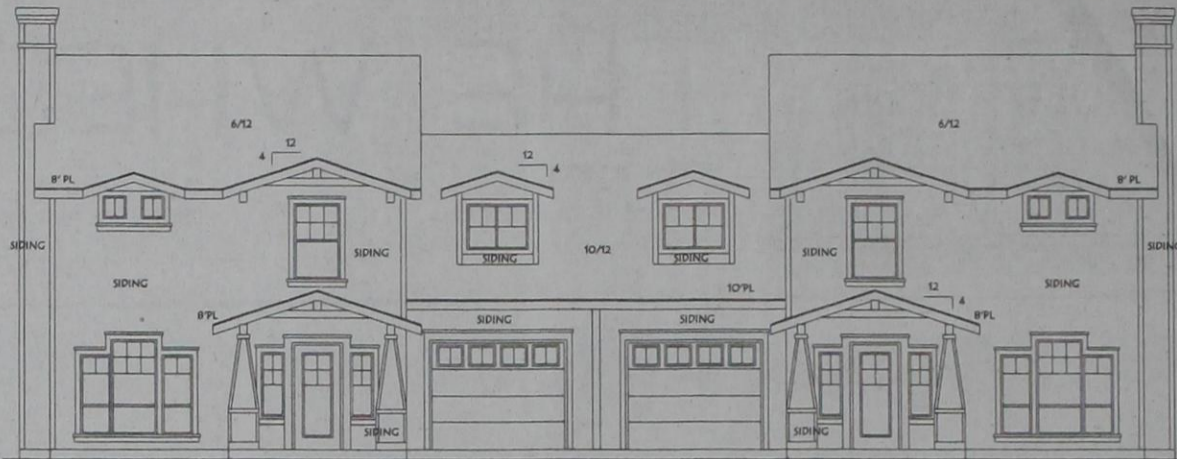

OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

VICTROLAS AND OLD RECORDS

It never ceases to amaze me at the new electronic gadgets that are available today. I'll have to admit; I was a little skeptical about the worth of some of them, and still am, to some extent. I resisted getting a cell phone for quite a long while, but eventually relented. Now, I don't go anywhere without it. It seems like an awful lot of stuff nowadays, has to be "programmed." This usually causes me quite a bit of mental anguish, because I'm not too adept at that job. When I was a kid, things were a lot more "mechanical," and easier for me to figure out how to operate.

We had a neighbor one time, which had just divorced and was moving to Montana. He couldn't take all his belongings with him at that time, so my folks let him store some of it in our upstairs room. He actually gave us quite a few Encyclopedias and some other books. Also, there was a large stack of old phonograph records he said we could have. We had an electric "record player," but I preferred to use an old, antique, "Victrola," that we had. Besides that, I think my folks didn't want to risk me messing up the good one. The "Victrola," was kind of like a box with legs. On top, was the "turntable" that you would place the record on that you wanted to play. On one side, there was a "crank" for you to "wind up" a spring located inside the box, which enabled the turntable to go around and around. Last, but not least, there was an arm with a needle on the end that you could pivot and set it on top of the record. The needle would follow the little grooves in the record and produce the sound to the speaker. I was really impressed with that machine. However, it did have one

major problem. At first, when it was fully wound-up, it would spin the record a little bit, too fast. Towards the middle, the sound was just about right and then when it was nearing the end of the song, it began to run out of power and the record would spin a bit slow. At least, it didn't require any electricity and you didn't have to be overly smart to learn how to operate it.

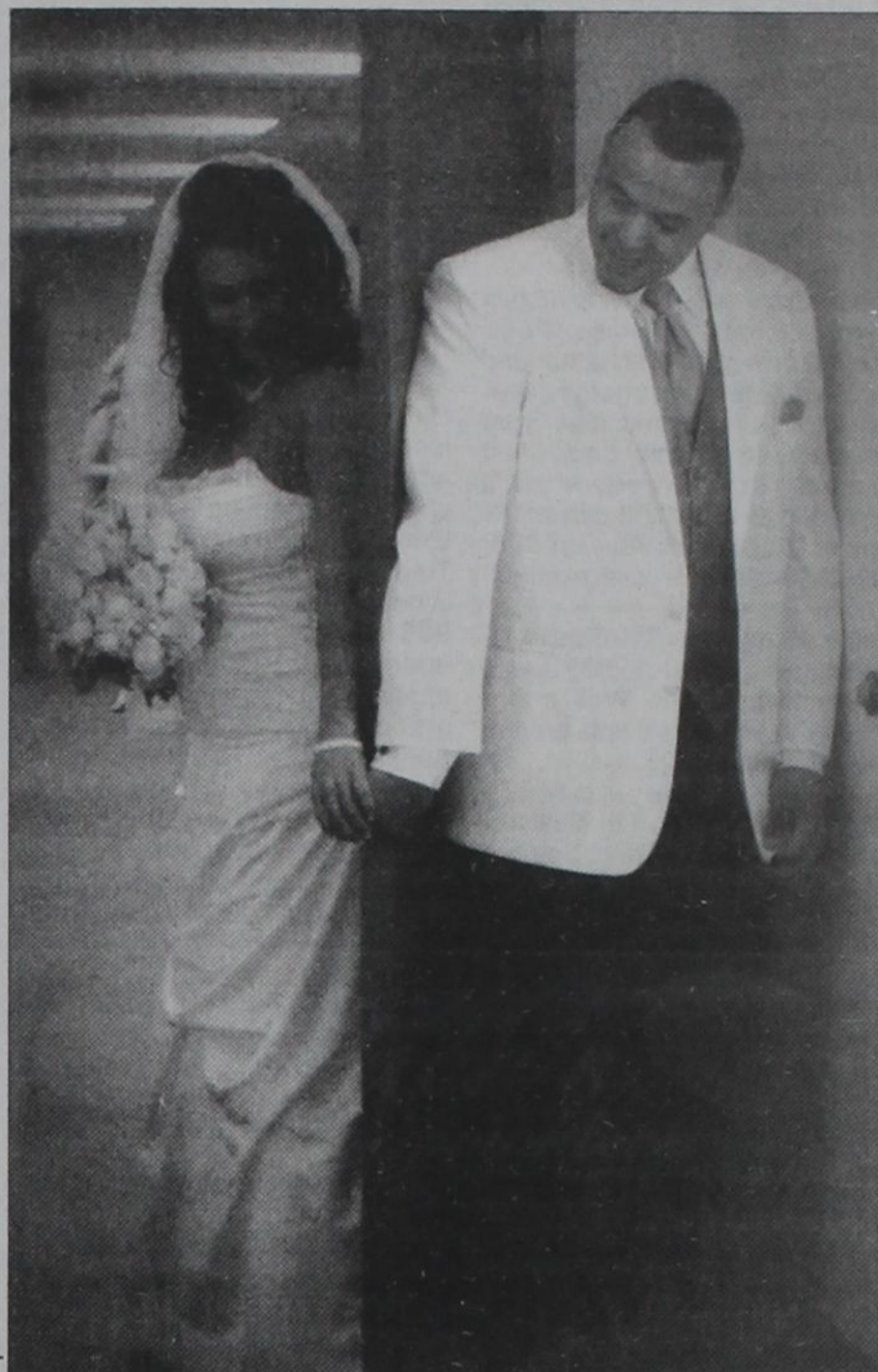

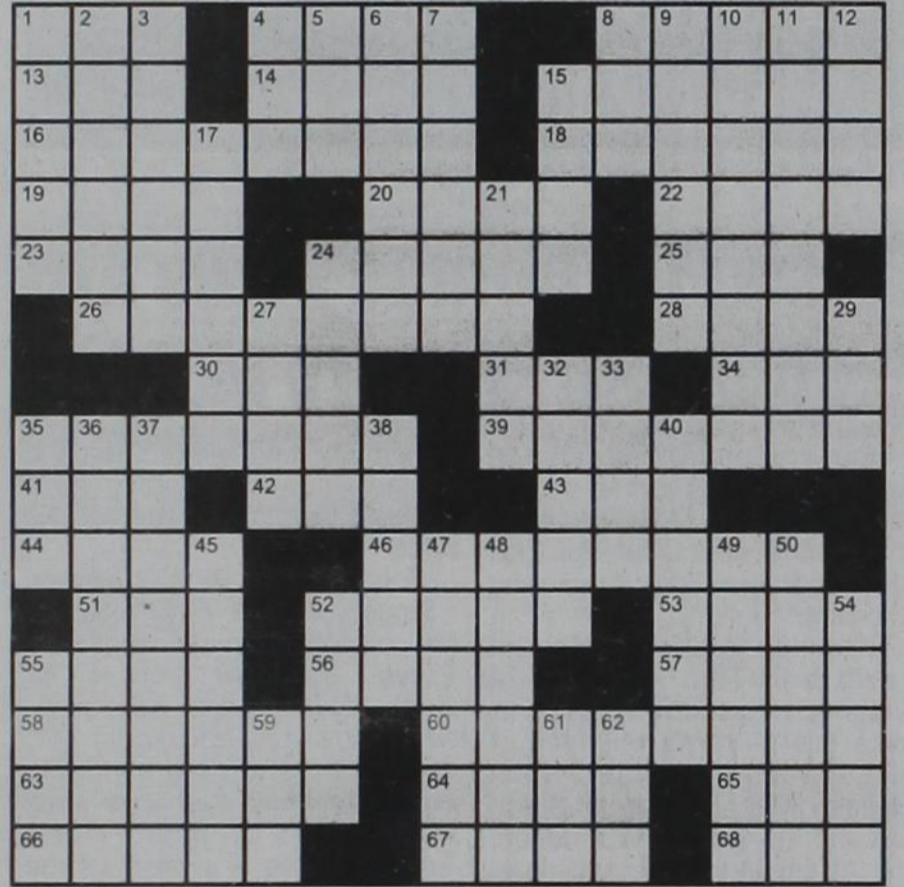

February 22, 1962 Robbers Take \$900.00 From Mobeetie Bank

Bank robbers pried their way into the First State Bank at Mobeetie Tuesday night and made off with \$900.00 in silver. After an investigation Wednesday by law enforcement officers from Gray and Wheeler Counties, three FBI agents and a Texas Ranger, it seemed to be their opinion that the job was done by professionals, inasmuch as certain types of tools were used to punch in the vault locks after combinations were knocked off.

The robbers pried a lock off a side door to gain admittance to the bank.

Cotton Ridgeway, assistant cashier, discovered the robbery at 7:20 a.m., Wednesday, when he opened the bank. Ridgeway notified the other bank officials and summoned Sheriff Bus Dorman.

Deputy Sheriff John Topper of Shamrock, D. L. Day, Deputy Sheriff of Pampa, and Texas

Ranger, Gill Hensley, worked with FBI Agents and Sheriff Bus Dorman at the scene of the crime Wednesday obtaining fingerprints. Late Wednesday, Sheriff Dorman said there were definite leads as to the robbers' trail after leaving Mobeetie.

Henry Flanagan, bank president, reported that the robbers did not break into the main vault, which contained the bank's heaviest deposits of currency.

The two vaults were battered open with what appeared to be a small sledgehammer, according to Sheriff Bus Dorman. The combinations were knocked off and the pins were punched in, allowing the robbers to open the doors of the records vault and the lock-box vault.

A spokesman for the bank said it had been determined that \$900.70 had been taken from the records vault in rolls made up of nickels, dimes, quarters and half-dollars. Papers which had been taken from the lock-boxes had been scattered over the floor.

Sheriff Dorman stated that Mrs. Earl Williams reported Wednesday afternoon that some rings were missing from their lock-box. Mrs. Williams had been keeping some diamond rings and old wedding bands, family keepsakes, in their lock-box.

According to Sheriff Bus Dorman, the robbers also stole a 45-calibre pistol and a 28-calibre snub-nose from the records vault.

 (www.looklearnlive.org) motorcycle safety and public awareness campaign runs through mid-May and is designed to remind drivers to look twice for motorcycles, especially at intersections and when changing lanes where most of the collisions take place. In 2011, Texas had 470 motorcycle fatalities, 16 percent of the state's traffic deaths.

Seeing them is saving them is the theme of this year's Share the Road campaign, which uses radio and television public service announcements (PSAs) and outdoor billboards, both in English and Spanish to drive its safety message home.

Half of all fatal motorcycle crashes in Texas occur because the motorist never saw the motorcyclist. According to national statistics, a motorcyclist is five times more likely to be injured and 25 times more likely to die in a crash. In fact, 87 percent of motorcycle crashes result in the death or serious injury of the motorcyclist. This is because motorcycles have a much smaller profile than other vehicles, and it can be difficult for car and truck drivers to judge the speed and distance of an approaching bike. As a result, drivers involved in crashes with motorcycles often say they never saw the motorcyclist and could not react in time to prevent the crash.

"The number of motorcycles on Texas roadways has doubled to more than 419,000 in the last decade," said Carol Rawson, TxDOT's Traffic Operations director. "As more people turn to motorcycles for affordable transportation and recreation, it's more important than ever to remind drivers to be on the lookout." TxDOT offers these safety tips for sharing the road with motorcycles:

Look Twice: Especially watch for cyclists at intersections where they may be making a left turn, as well as on the highway where a motorcyclist may be changing lanes.

Regularly check your rear-view

and side-view mirrors and clearly signal your intentions.

Give Them Space: Don't follow a motorcycle too closely. A motorcyclist's riding patterns are different from vehicle patterns, and reactions may vary for the same road or weather conditions. Allow a full lane of travel space between your car or truck and a motorcycle.

Anticipate Next Steps: Obstructions that drivers do not notice could prove to be deadly for a motorcyclist. Give motorcyclists plenty of space to react. This will help to make the road a safe place for you and others.
