## VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE IS SAT

County Tax Assessor-Collector Thurman Rives reminded voters this week they have only until January 31 to vote in the 1970 elections.

All persons over 60 years of age must register, along with those in other age brackets, if they wish to qualify to vote in the upcoming elections.

Persons may register at the county tax office in the

courthouse in Wheeler or at the City Hall in Shamrock. An application form appears below and on an inside page.

If you have not obtained an application to register and wish to mail in your application, you may fill out one of these applications and mail it to: Thurman Rives, Tax Assessor-Collector, Wheeler, Texas 79096.

If mailed, the application must be postmarked no later than Saturday, January 31.

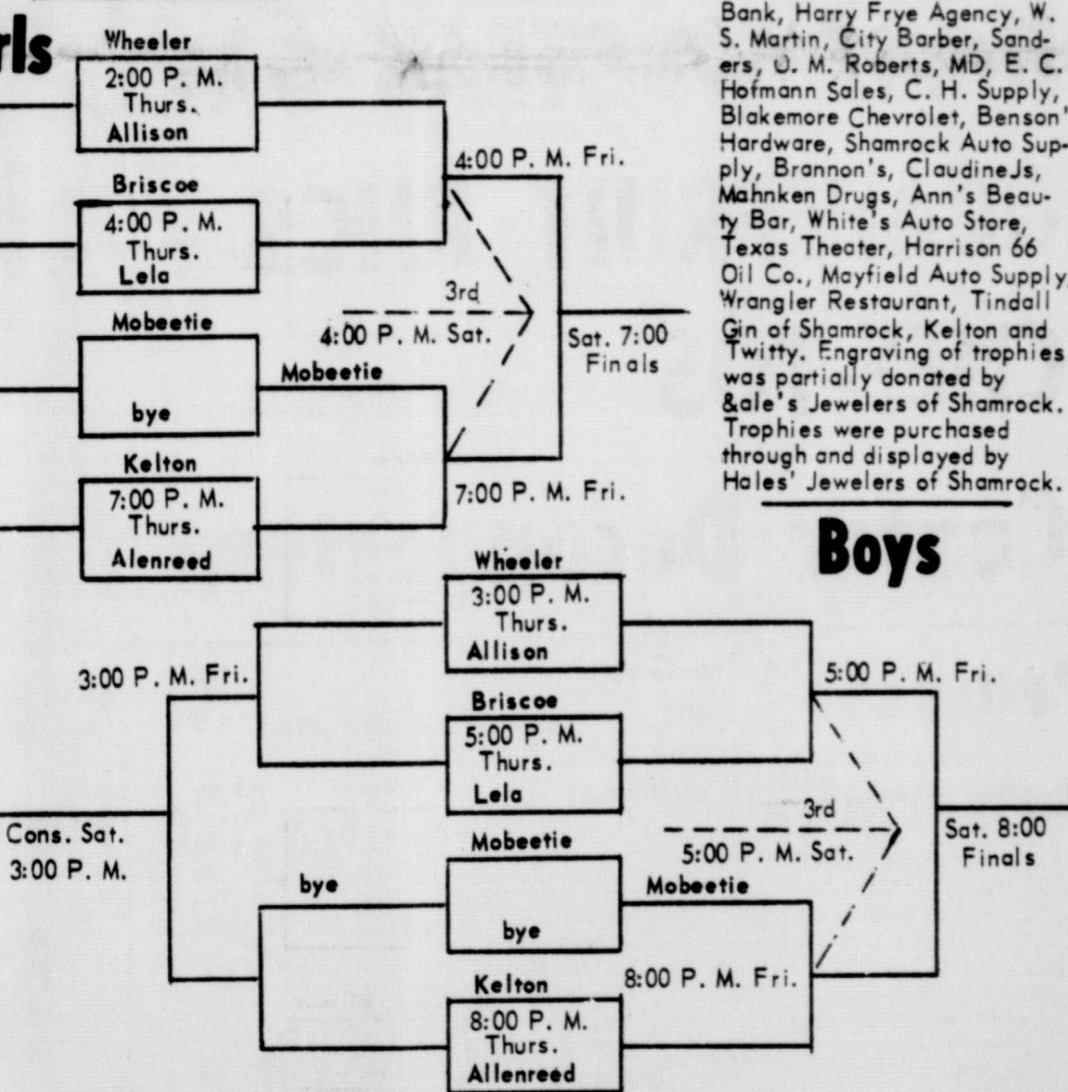

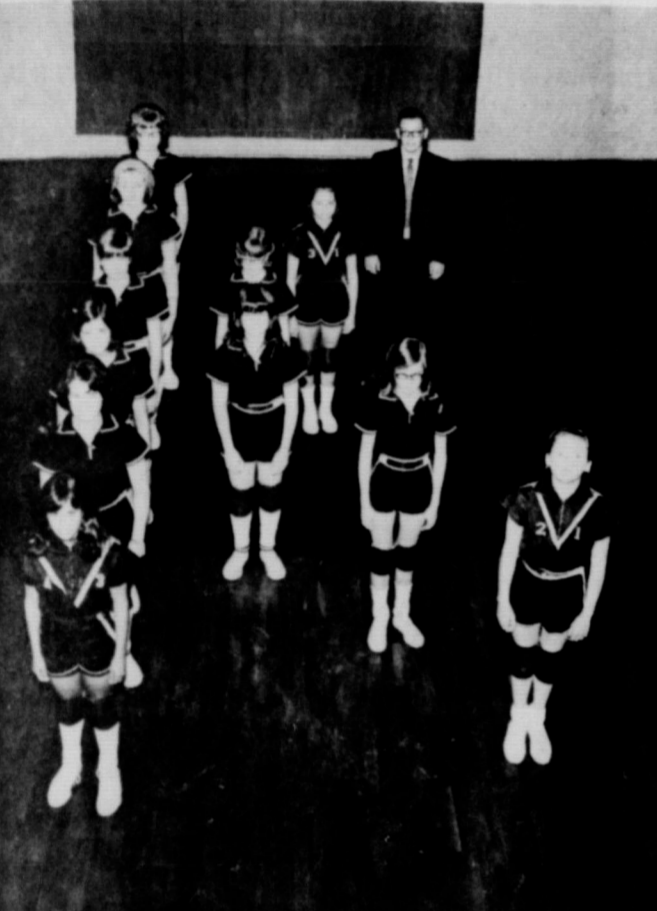

### "YOU AND THE LAW"

A new thirty-minute television series entitled "You and the Law" is being carried on Station KGNC-TV, Amarillo, commencing Jan. 17, 1970, according to a joint announcement by KGNC-TV and the Kiwanis Club of Division 6 of the Texas Oklahoma District, Kiwanis International. KGNC-TV is airing the ten-week series as a public service to the community. The Kiwanis Club of Division 6 under the direction of Lt. Governor Paul Standley is sponsoring the program. Kiwanis International produced "You and the Law" to support its efforts in the fields of law and justice, especially with young people. The program will be presented in communities in both the United States and Canada, with Kiwanis clubs or groups of clubs acting as sponsors in each city.

Famed television and motion picture personality Raymond Burr is host for the series.

Each "You and the Law" program consists of a panel of college age students, who engage in a dialogue with an expert on law, justice or a closely related field. Dialogues cover subjects of current popular interest: drug use and abuse, urban lawlessness, college unrest, government law structure, personal rights, etc.

Guest experts (there will be different experts and a different panel for each program in the series) include Governor Winthrop Rockefeller of Arkansas; Governor Preston Smith of Texas; Senator Robert P. Griffin of Michigan; Sheriff Joseph Woods of Cook County (Chicago), Illinois; Assistant Metropolitan Police Chief Jerry Wilson of Washington, D. C.; Dr. S. I. Hayakawa, famed semanticist, and president of San Francisco State University; John E. Ingersoll, director of the Federal Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs; Jackson Krill, assistant to the director of the United States Secret Service; and Judge Gordon Tinker, Magistrate, Toronto, Ontario, Canada.

Student panelists represent universities and colleges from around the nation. They were chosen, in each case, by their fellow students and appropriate faculty members. In the unheated discussions, both panelists and experts ask each other pertinent questions on vital issues of the day.

The "You and the Law" television program represents a new departure in public service programming. It has already won acclaim and support.

In announcing the series, the Kiwanis official in charge of the project described it as being in keeping with the Kiwanis policy of gearing its community activities and efforts to the most pressing and timely problems of the day.

### Consumer Education

**by Sally Richerson**

Consumer Education is being offered in Homemaking for the first time this year. There are three boys and eight girls enrolled for this half semester class. Contents of the course will include: (1) Finance Facts, (2) Concepts in Budgeting, (3) Personal Finance Planning, (4) Wise use of Credit, (5) Truth in Lending, (6) Installment Loans, (7) Comparative buying, (8) Awareness in making purchases, (9) Shopping Principles.

The group visited the Canadian Production Association facilities on January 21. Mr. James Verden, Manager, spoke to the group. He gave a short history of the association and briefly outlined the PCA loan program.

Mr. John Manning Manager of the Farmer Home Administration, visited the class on January 27. He detailed the fifteen loans available from the FHA.

Current magazines and newspaper articles, film strips, materials from the Educational Service Division of the National Consumer Finance Association, publications from the Household Finance Corporation, booklets from the Sears Consumer Information Services and the Federal Trade Commission publications are some of the source materials being used by the Class.

Guide lines for the wise use of credit, as given by the National Consumer Finance Association, include:

1. DO shop as carefully when you use credit as when you use cash.
2. DO obtain a written statement. Know exact by what you are paying for.
3. DO evaluate each use of credit to make certain that the extra cost is offset by the advantages in that specific situation.
4. DO report at once to your Consumer finance if you find, that because of unexpected circumstances, you are unable to make a payment.
5. DO use credit only as a preplanned part of total money management.
6. DO protect your credit rating.
