Subjects of many sermons unday will be alcohol abuse and drug abuse. A speaker om Texal Alcohol Narcotics Education (TANE) will occupy the pulpit in the Church of The Mazarene, Wheeler, on unday, February 7, 1971, at 1:00 a.m.

Problems of alcohol and g abuse are growing daily s going to be up to the people who care, to do someng about these problems, said Rev. Albert F. Tucker, TANE Executive Director. We find people who care in lexas' churches,' he said. TANE's purpose is to prevent, through education, problems that arise from use of alcohol, narcotics, and other dangerous drugs.






