Wheeler will be canvassed today, March 11, by workers for the Heart Association.

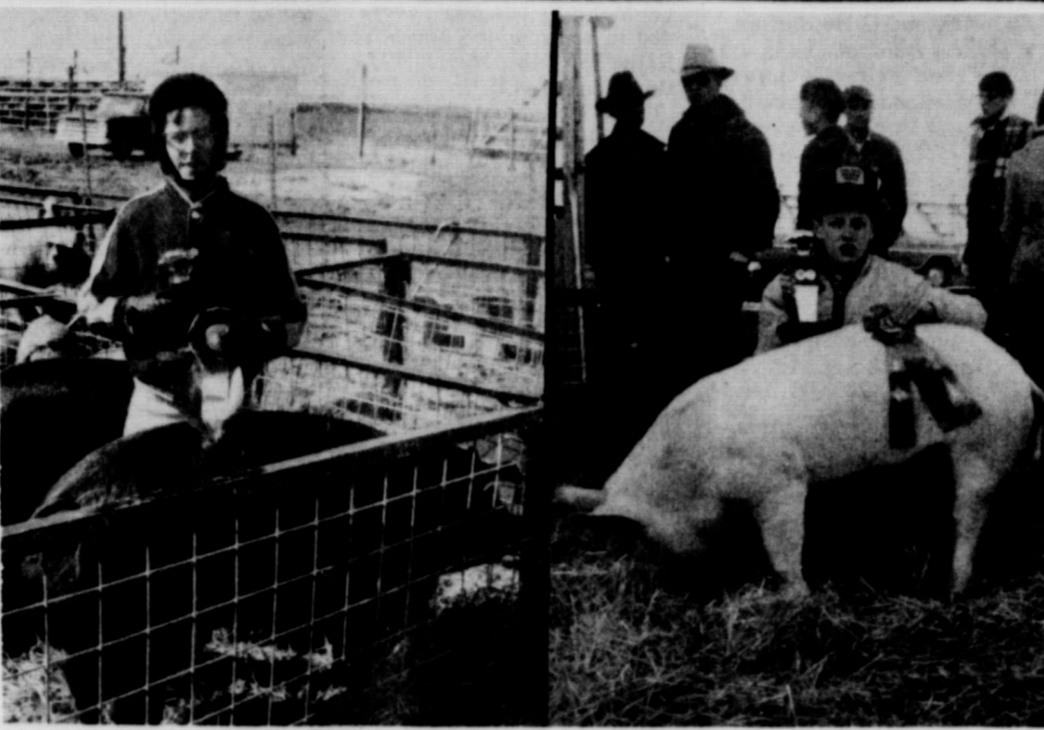
Conducting the drive will be local ladies clubs, and the 4-H Grays. The Wheeler Boy Scouts worked part of the town Saturday.
