School Trustee Election Results Given

Miles Receives Heroism Medal

Spec.-4th Michael Miles, son of Mr. and Mrs. R.L. Miles, who live at Route One Wheeler, Texas 79096, has been awarded the Army Commendation Medal with "V" Device on May 3, 1970 in Vietnam. This was issued under the direction of the Secretary of the Army. The reason for the meritorious award was as follows: "For heroism in connection with military operations against an armed hostile force in the Republic of Vietnam. Private Miles distinguished himself exceptionally valorous actions on May 3, 1970 while serving with Troop D, 2nd Squadron, 1st Cavalry at Phan Thiet in the Republic of Vietnam.

Write-In Campaigns were staged in two of the area school elections held Saturday, April 3. In the Wheeler and Briscoe elections voters wrote in names for the two positions on both boards of election. Two names were on the ballot for the Wheeler board of trustees. Joe Weatherly and Jim Wright were the incumbents in the race. Weatherly led in the election with 101 votes; Wright came in second with 67. Receiving write-in votes were Cumi Warren, 37 votes, and Bill Hampton, 40 votes.

At a recent board meeting, the Briscoe school board appointed C.E. Wilhelm and L.D. Childress to serve on the board until the next regular election. The two patrons elected were not qualified to serve; in this instance, the law requires the remaining board members to appoint someone to serve

the unexpired terms. Counting of the ballots showed Thurmon Horn received 22 votes; R.L. Zybach, 25; Milton Finsterwald, 2; Bob Swift, 27, and Grant Meek, 28.

Garland Moore, Bobby Calcutte and A.W. Burrell were elected to serve on the Board of Trustees at Kellon. Moore and Calcutte each received 19 votes and Burrell received 15. Kenneth Killingsworth, Bob Hink Dudley Miller, George Harris and Cornel Palmor each received votes.

Two new members were named to the Mobeetie Board of Education. Jack Heffley led in votes with 44; Joe Carnell received 35 votes. Glen D. Hodges ran a close third with 33 votes. Voters in the Allison school trustee election gave Clifton Boydston 13 votes and Clifton Taylor 12 votes.

As we approach Easter we are experiencing a very unusual spring. In the majority of our county, the soil is as dry as in the mid 1950 drought years.

The late freeze that hit our peaches last week hurt certain varieties, nipping some fruit buds; but no variety is hurt badly. Some Sentinels and Redglows were damaged.

A good four inch rain like we had last year about this time would cure most of the problems in Wheeler County.

About fifty people came to hear the results of our weeping lovegrass studies last week at Shamrock. The title of our talk was "If They'd Eat It".

They will, by the way for the benefit of those who didn't make the meeting.

Weather conditions are not the best for using herbicides; therefore, it is doubly important that label instructions be carefully followed.

The few minutes required to read and understand the label before using the herbicide could be some of the most important time you'll spend all year.

Crop injury or poor weed control or even unmarketable products can be avoided by following the safe usage directions on the label.

Labels list the crop on which the herbicide may be used, give the application rate and time and other information on safe handling and storage of the product. Only the recommended amount should be used at the time of planting.

Most weed control chemicals are not highly toxic to handle but are potentially dangerous when the rules of safety are not observed.

moisture and reduce weed growth. Each time a new shoot produces about three sets of leaves, pinch out the top to encourage side breaks from the leaf axil. This pinching of the tip growth should continue until mid or late July.

Across the Fence

green plants will soon appear where plants were carried over from last fall. These clumps should be divided saving only the best ones for replanting. The entire clump should be removed from the perennial border with a spading fork or shovel and placed in the shade out of the wind. This should be done as you prepare beds for the coming season.

Fertilizer should be incorporated into the soil at a rate of two to three pounds per hundred square feet of bed area. Several inches of coarse sphagnum peat moss or well-decomposed compost should also be added over the entire bed.

Raking and leveling the bed after spading is important to assure removal of all trash and debris. The selected plants from the clumps can be spaced about 15 inches apart. Pinch out the top of each plant selected to encourage branching.

After planting, water the bed thoroughly. A mulch of coarse peat moss, redwood bark or pine bark will provide an attractive, yet effective way to conserve

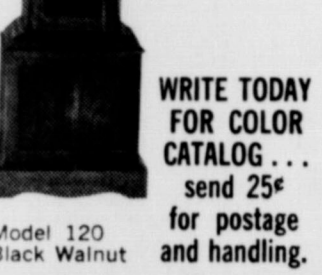

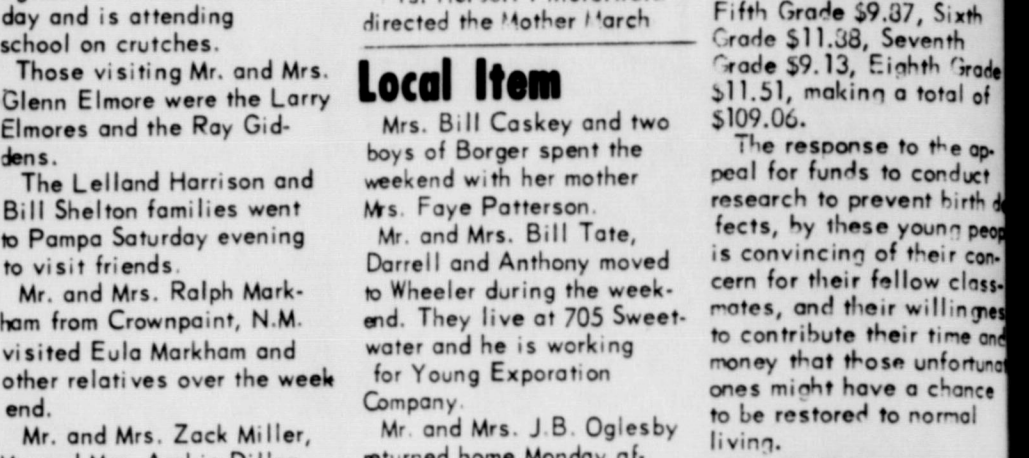
